While I was on vacation this year, I had the opportunity to visit

the Daytona Beach Radio Control Association's flying site and talk with Terry, the club president.

The Club—The Daytona Beach R/C club has been around for over 50 years and currently has over 80 members.

The Field—Where our field is located next to a swamp, their field is in the swamp. They have a 1 mile by ½ mile flying area surrounded by 30-to-40-foot high trees. The runway is a version of petromat, 300 feet X 20 feet. (For reference, out runway is 400 feet X 60 feet.) A slightly larger mowed grass strip is next to the main petromat runway.

The un-mowed overfly area looks like our field but has an interesting difference, their overfly area is swamp and is home to poisonous snakes and the occasional gator. This portion of the field also has 1 to 2 feet of water most of the time. The pits and runway area typically have 1 to 2 inches of water on it every time it rains.

### **Club Meetings**

The summer club meetings are at 7PM at **The Club Flying Field** in New Hartford Come for the cookout at 6PM.
Guests are always welcome.

Just to keep flying interesting they also have high voltage power lines running along the far side of the flying area.

The club does not own the flying field; they have a 5-year lease from the county. The lease does not allow for any permanent structures. The club currently pays \$300 dollars a month for swamp land located next to the landfill.

Other points of interest—The field is located one mile from the closest main road. After 9/11 the county installed a gate on the road going to the field, and it requires the club to keep the gate locked at all times. This was done to protect the high-power line and a county well located two miles from the flying site. Interestingly, the fence ends about 100 feet into the woods on both sides of the road, the high-power line is not protected once it leaves the field area, and the county well has direct access from other roads.

The club cannot install a safety fence because that would be a permanent structure. They installed a solar charging station for electric flyers. They have a video camera at the field that allows members to check water levels from the club's website. The field is 4.8 miles from the end of a major airport runway, so they have a 400-foot ceiling restriction.

Conclusion—We have it pretty good!
