TRAILBLAZERS

This age group will focus on dividing their time into several subjects. They will delve into math, literature, history/geography, spelling, science, foreign language, and writing and grammar programs.



Math

Students will use Saxon 7/6 math curriculum in class and at home.



Grammar

This class will teach the fundamentals of the English language, including the parts of speech, analyzing sentences, learning composition rules, practicing sentence diagramming, and parsing sentences. Families can expect at-home practice.



Science

Students will further their understanding of the science with *Novare Life Science*. Student will study the organ systems, genetics, cellular respiration, photosynthesis, and sensory systems, energy, populations, nutrient cycles, and biomes of ecosystems.



Cursive / Spelling

Spell to Write and Read, a comprehensive spelling program that focuses on phonetics, cursive, and rules to the English language. This curriculum can be tailored to the child's need. Weak and strong spellers, alike, can gain. Students will build their own "textbook" in class. Spelling Bee at the end of the year.



Writing/Literature

Students practice writing skills using *IEW Bible* during the 1^{st} semester. In the 2^{nd} semester students will learn to annotate and write persuasive essays using Newberry Award winning literature.



History/Geography

Students will learn about the Medieval period by working through the *Story of the World* curriculum. We will look at the Fall of Rome to the Rise of the Renaissance. Students will engage in hands on activities, and weekly vocabulary.



Spanish

This class will present a unique opportunity to learn the Spanish language from a native speaker, our Guide, Ms. Kat. Students will be practicing conversational Spanish, grammar, learning and culture. This class will require daily work at home with help through videos made by the Guide.



MOUNTAINEER

This group will cover materials like math, literature, philosophy, science, etc with a conversational approach. Students will be required to come to class with the material finished and prepared to discuss ideas, revelations or ask questions of the instructor and other students.

Math

Students will learn Saxon Algebra 1/2, through the year. They will work from the *Mathematics: An Illustrated History of Numbers* text the 1st semester and Your Business Math the 2nd semester.



Logic

Students will study *Traditional Logic I & II*. This is an in-depth study of the classical syllogism. Along with a basic understanding of the Christian theory of knowledge, the text presents the four kinds of logical statements, the four ways propositions can be opposed, the three ways which they can be equivalent, and the seven rules for the validity of syllogisms.



Science

Students further their understanding of the science in the 1st semester with *Novare Earth Science*. Student will study landforms minerals, and planetary phenomena, conservation, climate change, pollution, and environmental justice. In the 2nd semester student will study Gods universe using *Signs & Seasons: Understanding the Elements of Classical Astronomy*. The focus is on learning classical astronomy through movement of celestial bodies and how they change through a day, a month, and year. The course is written from a Biblical standpoint.



Spanish

This class will present a unique opportunity to learn the Spanish language from a native speaker, our Guide, Ms. Angie. Students will be practicing conversational Spanish, grammar, learning and culture. This class will require daily work at home with help through videos made by the Guide.



History

Students study history through the discussion of current events. They will also study the legal case of *People v Klein* and participate in a Mock Trial.



Literature

Students receive instruction on poetry using *The Grammar of Poetry During* the 1^{st} semester. In class and at home they will study Short Story readings and learn *How to Write a Story* in the 2^{nd} semester.
