


Dear Children's Caucusers!



Network insights

We will seek to decipher the kaleidoscopic landscape around children's issues by hearing from people throughout the state: featuring representatives from our emergent network of kid-focused Dem Clubs, and from our geographically scattered CademCC officers as well. Listen for their perspective and learn the experience on "their" ground, but also become aware of patterns and conditions that may herald concern for our children, schools, electoral threat or partisan practice.

Legislation Study Groups

After the Spring Convention in Anaheim, the CADEM Children's Caucus met online twice, preliminary to submitting 12 position-recommendations to the CADEM Legislation Committee (LegCom). We were joined by legislation staffers or sponsors, pro and con where available, who

presented their bill/s and answered questions.

The purpose of these Legislation Study Groups (LSG) is educational, and the initiative also builds community among us, as members share personal knowledge and expertise.

CademCC recommended a position of SUPPORT to the LegCom on all bills, including two 2-year bills. The LegCom will recommend a consent calendar of positions to the August virtual Eboard meeting, and <u>discuss</u> positions on the remainder of bills under consideration in advance of the Saturday Eboard floor session during the (public) LegCom meeting on Friday, 9/22/25 at 4:30. Zoom link will be posted <u>here</u>.

Civil rights-Pupil and Student Safety-Law Enforcement

- SB 627 (Wiener, Arreguín, Pérez) ~ Law enforcement: masks. (No secret police)
- SB 805 (Pérez, Wienero) ~ Crimes (No Vigilantes)
- AB 49 (Muratsuchi, Ortega) ~ Schoolsites: Immigration enforcement
- AB 727 (González) ~ Pupil and student safety: identification cards

Foster youth-housing-placement

- AB 1314 (Ahrens) ~ Transitional housing placement providers.
- AB 896 (Elhawary) ~ Foster care: placement transition housing
- AB 1099 (Bryan) ~ Developmental services: initial intake: assessment.

Education accountability

 AB 84 (Muratsuchi) ~ School accountability: Office of the Education Inspector General: school financial and performance audits: charter school authorization, oversight, funding, operations, networks, and contracting: data systems: local educational agency contractor background checks.

Good Governance-Finance

- SB 249 (Umberg) ~ County boards of education: elections: consolidation.
- AB 397 (González, Rodriguez, Sharp-Collins) ~ Personal Income Tax Law: young child tax credit.
- AB 713 (Solache) ~ Public postsecondary education: student employment.

Environmental

 AB 1243 / SB 684 (Addis / Menjivar) ~ Polluters Pay Climate Superfund Act of 2025.

How To Make Your Voice Heard

As a chartered caucus – that is, constituent subset – of the CA Democratic Party, we will and can take no position on legislation independent from the vote of the majority. CademCC, however, is comprised of individuals who may.

Each and every time a bill comes before a new committee or house-floor or the governor's desk, there is opportunity to comment on the legislation. Make your voice heard!

Login to the legislature's website <u>here</u>. Use the tabs to locate the bill, its legislative analyses, original and amended text, a tracker to opt in for email alerts when a bill moves between committees/houses, etc. Comments may be left on this site only to the author of a bill; to officially submit your individual position to the record, use <u>this portal</u> (separate login). If the bill has passed both its houses and is waiting for the executive, record your position with the Governor <u>here</u>.


