We started our Convention week on Zoom, with CademCC's regular caucus meeting in association with the 2025 Anaheim Convention; find it available now on





The meeting was devoted to learning and taking inspiration from accidental heros, fighting for those who fight for us, such as exemplars: Renay Grace Rodriguez, president of Stonewall Democratic Club-LA, and Twiana Armstrong, founder of seeMYchild.org. We heard presentations from schools expert Sarah Bradshaw on key legislation and funding issues facing public education, how federal shortfalls can be addressed locally and how to buttress statewide and local supports. We heard an overview from retired internist Nancy Greep on the impact of federal cuts on California's healthcare and food supports for children. ### **Meeting Inspirations**

The meeting was inspired by the courage of the collective efforts of staff and principals in two southeastern LAUSD schools, protecting elementary aged students from ICE agents seeking an unauthorized "wellness check". The California Democratic Party adopted Resolution 25-05.034 on Sunday, 6/1/25, "Recognizing the Courageous Protection Of School Children" (many thanks to friends of the Children's Caucus and Resolutions Committee members Tony Hale and Andrew Lachman for shepherding this resolution



through the process). We appreciate the hard work of teachers, counselors, administrators, staff and children's health and welfare professionals everywhere, preparing, practicing and protecting our children.



Having concluded our business before the start of the Anaheim Convention, there was time for partying during our **SoapBox Social** on Saturday evening.



Replete with popcorn and ice cream, the venue was an opportunity to hear from members and elected officials informally. Our seating was scattered about the microphone, with the "a capella" part not quite working out, and a single room challenged to simultaneously support both private conversation and public discourse. We need still to improve the venue for networking across this vast statewide territory; stay tuned for our initiative to focus attention on local constituencies.


