


Hey Children's Caucusers!

Caucus Elections

All CADEM's <u>caucuses</u>, are open to all registered Democrats. As a CADEM Children's Caucus (CademCC) member, you may vote in our leadership elections if your membership dues for CademCC were settled by 4/26/25.

Please verify your voting membership status and your email of record, by locating the confirmation receipt/thank-you that was emailed to the address we have on record for you. <u>That is where your ballot will be sent</u>.

Ballots to elect CademCC leadership by acclamation (there are no contested races) will be emailed to the address on record of all eligible voting-members on Saturday night of the Convention, 5/31/25, between **7:30pm – 7:45pm**; balloting will close **at 8:15pm**.

To report a concern, missing confirmation email or request accommodations voting, please <u>email</u> Elections Chair Cea-Heier as soon as possible.

If you are in Anaheim, *JoinUS* in-person **on Saturday, 5/31/25 at 7:30pm, in meeting room 264 ABC** when balloting opens. Do bring your phone, laptop or other electronic device in order to vote there.

And if you cannot join us in-person, you still can vote via email from wherever you are.

Our elections team will be available to assist with any voting issues or complications whether you are voting in-person or via telephone, while we mingle in Anaheim and mull the words of fellow members and candidates over ice cream and popcorn, delivered *a capella* from an old-timey soap box (see above invitation).


