Helpful Hints for Presentations

- 1. Use a word processor and an equation editor to ensure your presentation looks professional
- 2. Ensure your visuals are neat, well organized and clearly visible
- 3. Don't read your paper to the judges
- 4. You have 15 minutes to present know the math as it refers to the topic and show your enthusiasm presenting it.
- 5. Be prepared for questions on any part of your paper.
- 6. A paper that is no more than an outline of a textbook chapter will probably not win.
- 7. Dress appropriately Business Casual.
- 8. Practice presentation as often as you can and at least once with your mentor.

Hints for Teachers new to the Fair

- 1. Call the LI Math Fair Committee if you need help
- 2. Students should be familiar with library resources (and other resources in your school)
- 3. The students should use a variety of sources which should be used in the development of the paper
