- The visit from MD 51 Puerto Rico Lions brought 63 Lions to Aruba, where they participated in an insightful lecture and a tour of the museum. Additionally, the group joined the club in planting 20 native trees as part of the “Ban Lanta y Planta” initiative.
- The Diabetes Awareness Program, in partnership with the Diabetes Foundation and POH, included educational sessions on diabetes prevention and management. Sessions were held for 4th-grade students at Fatima, Pius X, and Dominicus College, and an additional session was provided for an elderly group.
- The club organized a joyful Christmas party for 50 children, where they enjoyed games, snacks, and received thoughtful gifts from Santa Claus, spreading holiday cheer to the community.

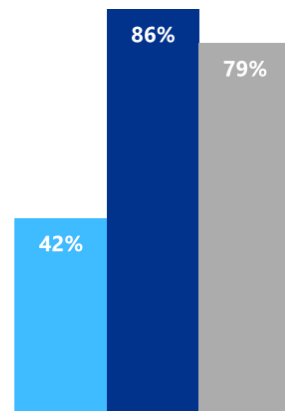

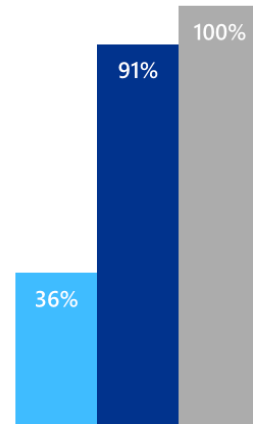

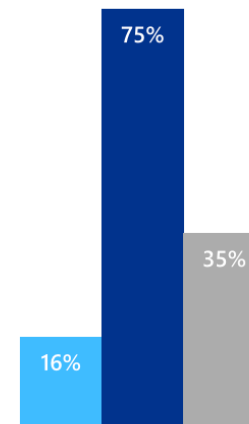
