

The World of Beef!

WHAT DOES 2025 LOOK LIKE ON THE WORLD STAGE?

Its been a common theme of late that producers are craving more information to make more informed decisions within their business's. Luckily, through the careers and networks of both Sean and Will, we are readily able to keep up to date and on the pulse of the beef industry both domestically and globally. We know though that with the benefit of knowledge comes the ability to share it with others. So here are our 3 big points for 2024 in the world Beef production, that we think will shape 2025 for us and Australian producers as a whole!

Poor seasonal condition's have led to a 73 year low in total cow herd inventory in the US with an expected 800,000 head deficit in feeder and processed stock over the next 12 to 18 months. What will this mean for Australian Beef exports? Speaking to Simon Quilty of Global Agri Trends a number of times this year, he suggests a golden opportunity for Australian Beef exports is right around the corner! Is Australia ready to jump when the opportunity comes into site?



We heard a statistic recently that 70% of the global beef cattle population are now located within the Tropics, between the Tropic of Cancer and Tropic of Capricorn. Yet over 90% of the research and development into beef production, efficiencies, reproduction and environmental management of beef cattle has occurred outside of the Tropics on non tropical cattle in temperate zones in the US, Europe, New Zealand and Southern Australia. R&D will be critical for tropical cattle producers moving forward and our ability to tell a story through science, not emotion. Can tools like Repro BI begin to fill the void and improve efficiencies in the North, especially for fertility and female selection and can we start bench marking production now to tell a story on the future?



The introduction of the European Union Deforestation Regulation (EUDR) is going to impact beef exporters into the EU, especially EU accredited beef from Australia. In a time where vegetation management remains relevant across Western, Central and Northern Queensland, what will processors and exporters be asking of producers in the coming years to ensure product fits export criteria, and will producers be paid for it? Global consumer's are now demanding products be produced in certain ways, so we will need to understand and adapt to buyer/ consumer sentiment in order to maintain market access.





RCB 2025 Yearling Bulls


