By 2035, the SFCC has deepened its partnerships with regional school districts through the expanded Roadrunner Pathways program. From elementary through high school, students follow clear pathways to college and career, supported by strong collaboration between K-12 educators and college staff.


High school students are automatically enrolled in dual credit cohorts beginning in 10th grade, aligned with both CTE and transfer pathways. College representatives are embedded in school districts, providing support with applications, advising, and career exploration. Students also take part in college prep workshops, career fairs, and campus visits.

Early college awareness begins in elementary and middle school. Kids College summer camps bring young students to campus for hands-on learning, while goal-setting programs in 5th and 6th grades spark early interest in the future. Homework Labs staffed by college students are located throughout the service region, supporting learners at every grade level.

K–12 teachers benefit from ongoing professional development offered by the college and have opportunities to partner with college instructors on aligning instruction and fostering shared goals across systems.






