he Christmas season is upon us, hardly seems possible.

I thank our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ for bringing us through these past nearly six months. We have much to be thankful for during this celebration of his birth.

From my perspective, it has been good to see everyone circle the wagons and proceed forward with regular services and a renewed commitment to Peace. Think about it, we lost our Pastor, and we have had only one family transfer to another church. That in and of itself has been remarkable.

Our Circuit Counselor and District Office have helped us establish a rather regular rotation of retired pastors to provide our weekly worship. From what most of you have told me, you are enjoying these retired ministers and the services they have provided. Each of them bring a comfortable *Lutheran service and sermon* to us each Sunday. We have been blessed.

It is also good to see how the congregation and these pastors react to each other, before, during and after our services. It is certainly nice to have these pastors mingle with us, and get to know us. It is a comfortable setting that we have not had for quite some time. We have started our Congregational Survey, with a few bumps in the road. You will get emails helping you through the pitfalls we

have discovered. Hopefully everyone will participate and we will get your input. At one of our Call Committee Meetings with our Circuit Counselor and District representative, I was very interested to hear him say that the District President utilizes the survey information when he is putting together a list of Pastors for a church to consider. Your input is important!

A special thanks to our member who issued the challenge to the congregation for donations to fund paying for the replacement HVAC unit. That member ended up contributing \$4,000. The initial \$1,000 and the \$3,000 to match the \$3,000 the balance the congregation contributed.

A special thanks to the members who met the challenge and donated \$3,923 to the HVAC replacement Challenge that was issued. Together, challenger and challenged we raised \$7,923. Remember any funds we do not use will be placed in a newly established Depreciation Fund for future replacement needs.

A special thanks to all of you for all you do, and for making this the friendly church in the woods.


Christmas Party





Lutheran Church Charities K-9 Ministries



Jessy Comfort Dog was the guest at the fall LWML Rally at Trinity, Clinton.

Jessy was born November 11, 2012. She loves to play ball, run and loves hugs! Her Bible verse is Psalm 28:6, *Praise be to the Lord, for He has heard my cry for mercy*.

Jessy is a trained Lutheran Church Charities (LCC) K-9 Comfort Dog for St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Concordia, Missouri. She is used in sharing the church's ministries of compassion and community outreach.

Lutheran Church Charities (LCC) mission is to share the Mercy, Compassion, Presence and Proclamation of Jesus Christ to those who are suffering and in need. LCC works through churches to help individuals and families. Headquartered in Northbrook, Illinois, LCC serves nationally and internationally.

The Lutheran Church Charities K-9 Comfort Dog Ministry was launched in August of 2008. This is a national human-care ministry embracing the unique, calming nature and skills of purebred Golden Retrievers. The LCC K-9 Comfort Dogs are working animals, trained to interact with people of all ages and circumstances who are suffering and in need. The dogs partici-

pate in scheduled and special events. Comfort Dogs are permanently placed with churches, schools and other ministries involved in Christian human care by LCC. Permanent placement includes full training for volunteer handlers and caregivers along with ongoing support, coaching and training. Comfort Dogs live in the homes of assigned caregivers and have several handlers. The comfort dogs serve every day in the community in which they are placed and are dispatched in times of disaster and crisis to bring comfort to all those affected, including first responders and those who serve them. The LCC K-9 Ministries include the LCC K-9 Comfort Dogs, LCC Kare 9 Military Ministry serving the Military, Veterans, and their families, and the LCC K-9 Police Ministry serving law enforcement officers and their families.

There are currently 130 dogs in 24 states which include puppies in training. Puppies are eight weeks old when they begin their training. There are two training locations, one in Grand Island, NE and the other in Northbrook, IL, LCC's home base. The dogs go through 2000 hours of training and are placed based on when they are ready. They serve as long as they are able and stay with a church family. Each dog has a Bible verse.

There are eight dogs that currently live in the Missouri Region. They are LCC K-9 Comfort Dogs Noah (Timothy – St. Louis, MO), Louie and Jackson (Immanuel – Joplin, MO), Jessy (St. Paul's – Concordia, MO), Sheba (Immanuel – Washington, MO), Tabatha [Tabby] (St. Paul's – Des Peres, MO), Esther (Holy Cross – Collinsville, IL) and Patience (Immanuel – St. Charles, MO).

LCC never charges those they serve. They are able to do that with the support of donors.

Council Meeting Held November 13, 2018

President Mic Carlson called the meeting to order at 6:30 P.M. and opened with prayer.

The following board members were present: Mic Carlson, Susan Kral, Vicki Stauch, Chuck Kral, and Russell Schultz.

The minutes from the October 10, 2018 meeting were reviewed and approved as printed. The evangelism report that Russell Schultz submitted will be included in these minutes.

President: Mic Carlson reported the following:

- All Sundays in December have pastoral coverage.
 Mic has not yet arranged for a pastor to cover Christmas Eve.
- A check for approximately half of the cost of the new furnace was sent to McGuire Heating and Cooling. Enough funds were donated to cover the entire cost.
- Mic has requested that Rita begin putting excess funds into our Lutheran Church Extension Fund account. The council wants to have a depreciation account in order to have funds available when large item repairs are needed.
- The church constitution and by-laws require that the president appoint a member-at-large to the board. Mic intends to nominate Penny Jost.
- Mic will compose a letter to the congregation requesting donations for our two organists who donate their talents to enhance our services.

- Mic asked for permission to purchase gift certificates for the five pastors who have covered our services. The expense will be covered by weekly offering funds.
- The Call Committee met with Bill Geis on Nov. 4. As a result of this meeting, a congregational survey will be sent to each member. The results will be reviewed by the committee and be discussed at the January Voters Meeting. The report was accepted and approved.

>> Financial Secretary: Vicki Stauch reported that the goal has been met to pay for the new furnace without affecting regular offerings. The board thanks the congregation for their generosity. The report was accepted and approved.

- Mic and the elders plan services for 2019 based on the Church Year calendar. Jerry Schwab will review hymn selection and make recommendations.
- Every Monday morning a copy of the planned worship service is emailed to the scheduled visiting pastor for him to review or make suggestions.
- The current membership of Peace Lutheran is 73 baptized and confirmed members and 6 baptized members. The report was accepted and approved.
