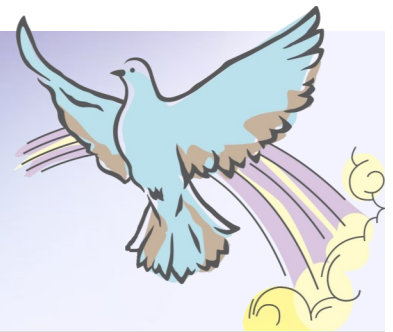

Lessons in wise faith

“The Magi teach us true faith,” said Martin Luther. Given the obstacles they encountered, we would understand if they had given up altogether!

First, the travelers were “off the mark,” coming to Jerusalem to seek a newborn king in a “royal palace.” Then, directed to Bethlehem, the wise men found a sight “so utterly out of keeping with a king” — a poor young woman and child, in a “poor hut” — that one might expect them to head straight home. “But,” declares Luther, “with a great, strong and full faith they ... follow the word of the prophet and the witness of the star in all purity of heart,” bowing to worship and honor the Savior.

Hot Chicken Salad

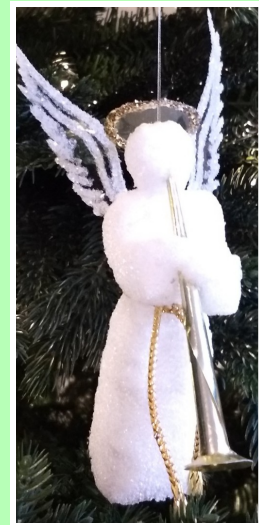

Council Meeting December 11, 2018

President Mic Carlson called the meeting to order at 6:30 P.M. and opened with prayer.

The following board members were present: Mic Carlson, Rita Riemann, Vicki Stauch, Diane Borgmann, Bob Borgmann, Russell Schultz, and Bob Mueller. Absent: Dale Lawson, Susan Kral, Chuck Kral, Dawn Hedberg. A quorum was present.

The minutes from the November 13, 2018 meeting were reviewed and approved as printed.

President: Mic Carlson reported the following:

- Thanks to the challenging member and all the members of the congregation for their donations to the HVAC challenge. We received \$4,000 from the challenger and \$3,943 from the congregation.
- Motion was made, seconded and passed to authorize the treasurer to establish an account at Lutheran Extension Fund for the Peace Lutheran Church Depreciation Fund. Signatories: Treasurer (Rita Riemann), Elder Chairman (Bob Mueller), President (Mic Carlson).
- Motion made, seconded and passed to have the following signatories on our Lutheran Extension Fund Account: Treasurer (Rita Riemann), Elder Chairman (Bob Mueller), President (Mic Carlson).
- Recommendation that we only keep \$5,000 end of month balance in our operating fund account at Bank of Versailles, and the treasurer deposit any excess funds into the Lutheran Extension Fund account, after we have paid the balance of the cost of the new HVAC unit.
- The Constitution and By-Laws call for the President to nominate a Member at Large at the beginning of the year. Will make that nomination at the Jan. 15, 2018 Voters Meeting.
- We received a check from Southwest Electric Cooperative in the amount of \$214.01 for a refund to members who purchased services in 1996.

Financial Secretary: Vicki Stauch presented the November and year to date report. The report was accepted and approved.

Treasurer: Rita Riemann presented the Treasurer Report. Rita's report was accepted and approved.

Elders: Bob Mueller no report.

Member at Large: No report

Trustees: Chuck Kral reported the following (via email):

- Thanks to Mark Riemann for getting the outdoor lights' timer set properly.
- Chuck changed the security lights in the front of the church.
- Mark Riemann and Chuck set up the front yard manger scene.
- Lakewood Alarm and Security is working to correct problems with the alarm system. They still have to replace the smoke detectors in the Chapel area. There is now only one code for people utilizing their keys to get in the church.

- Propane was added to the propane tank.

The report was approved and accepted.

Evangelism: Russell Schultz discussed continuing progress being made with the Chambers with our Face Book page and with the website. We discussed other avenues to get greater exposure for Peace. The report was accepted and approved.

Stewardship: No report

Cemetery: Diane Borgmann reported the following the current cemetery checking account balance. The report was accepted and approved.

Pastor: Vacant.

Mic Carlson reported that we continue to be served by a really good group of ministers. We have coverage for the Advent services from Pastor Anderegg and for Christmas Eve by Pastor Brandt.

Old Business:

Call Committee was receiving the results of the Congregational Survey this evening. It is the Call Committee's intention to review these results with the congregation some time during January.

New Business:

There was no new business.

The meeting was adjourned, the council closed with the Doxology.
