### Burning Bush

In Exodus 3, God speaks to Moses from a bush that is burning but not consumed. When Moses asks what he should say if the Egyptians question who sent him to lead the Israelites out of slavery, God states, "I AM WHO I AM." Centuries later, when people wonder who Jesus is, his answers hint at his divinity: "I AM the light of the world; I AM the good shepherd; I AM the bread of life" and, perhaps most profoundly, "Before Abraham was, I AM" (John 8:58). On Pentecost, God's Holy Spirit comes upon the apostles as fire. Thus the burning bush is a powerful symbol of God's presence echoed through time.

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## You're No Angel: Things Angels are Not

**Encore Post:** Beautiful young women in long, flowing white gowns, with big, downy wings, with a glowing, gold halo. A chubby, winged baby. The spirits of deceased Christians, also bearing wings and a halo, carrying a harp, are floating on clouds. Images like these fill our pictures, movies, TV shows, and songs. Yet none of these are real, nor do they share much in common with God's Holy Angels. They are very different creatures and are not mild, gentle beings. They are God's Heavenly Army, powerful and, when they appear, command respect.

First of all, angels are not people. They are spirits created by God to serve him (Hebrews 1). Christians do not become angels when they die. Our spirits are unnaturally separated from our bodies at death — bodies which decay. But we do not remain in that state. On the last day, God will raise our bodies from the dead and reunite our spirits with them.

Angels are powerful beings, sometimes tasked with battling Satan and his demons (these are fallen angelic creatures). They guard us, plead for us before the throne of God, and stand in his eternal presence. When they appear to people, they so often inspire fear that almost always their first words to humans are "fear not." Some of God's people are even tempted when they appear to fall down in worship. Scripture even poetically refers to them as gods.

Unlike the popular TV series and movies, angels are not like humans with flaws, prone to temptation and sin. Good angels are now eternally sinless, having been tested by Lucifer's rebellion. They have a perfect knowledge of God. While they always take the form of a male human when they appear to humans, they never marry. They also are not young,



having existed since before the fall of Adam and Eve, nor are they ever female. The scriptures do not mention halos (these are put into medieval art to draw eyes to images of holy people and beings, especially in stained glass) and only describe angels with wings when referring to seraphim and cherubim.

Most importantly, they ministered to Jesus during his earthly ministry. Angels are used by God to draw us to Jesus. On our last day and the last day, they will escort us to the throne of God, where we will live with God forever. So we thank God for the ministry of Angels and sing with them his praises, both here on earth and forever.

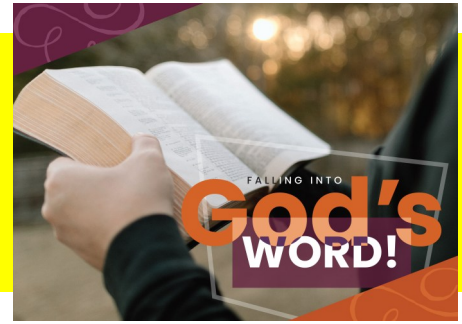
## Hospitalized?

# September Devotion



## One-Way Street



(Jesus said) “Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on My account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you.” Matthew 5:11-12

**A**fter the president decided to come out in favor of gay marriage, Monsignor Gerard O'Connor thought he ought to respond.

He had a sign put up on the church bulletin board of his parish, St. Francis Xavier of Acushnet, Massachusetts. The sign read: “Two men are friends, not spouses.”

When I read the sign, I thought it was tasteful and didn't push the bounds of freedom of speech or freedom of religion.

At least that's how I saw it.

Apparently, I was wrong. In a short time ...

- sign-carrying members of the homosexual community began to picket the church;
- somebody put up a placard near his. This new sign read “Spread love, not hate”;

- some people called the parish phone and threatened physical violence;
- one person called and promised to burn the church down.

Shocked by the intensity of the response against his bulletin board, the monsignor said, “We understand people disagree with us, but we do it out of love. We never said we hate anybody.”

Yes, the monsignor was shocked. He probably shouldn't have been.

The Lord Jesus told us such things would happen to those who follow Him. It so happens we live in an age where Christians are supposed to be understanding, open and supportive of every idea that comes down the pike. That's *every* idea — no matter how cockamamie that idea is.

If he doesn't, he's narrow-minded, prejudiced and opinionated.

On the other hand, when a Christian stands up for what he believes, for what is contained in Scripture, he's being pushy. As the monsignor found out, nobody has to be understanding, open and supportive of a Christian. That's because, quite often, open-mindedness is a one-way street.

All of this leaves each of us with a choice. We can bend, fold, spindle and mutilate the Gospel, so it seems to accept all which the world suggests, or we can stand up for what we believe is true. We can run the risk of being unpopular and threatened with physical harm.

It sounds like a no-brainer, and it is until people start picketing and phone-callers threaten to burn down your buildings. That's when Christians start to wonder if there wasn't another way.

To help them all stand firm, I'd like you to join me and pray for all those who are standing up for the Savior who gave His life, so we might have eternal life.

## EVERY ONE HIS WITNESS Encourage through the Head, Heart, or Hands

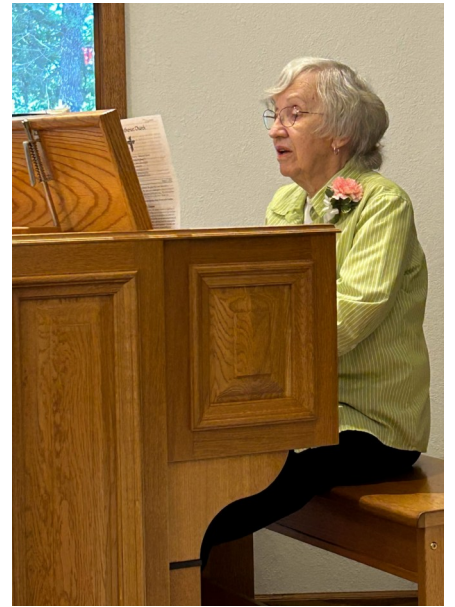
Follow up and follow-through are shaped by how a person connects and communicates.

Like other elements of the LASSIE approach to witnessing, encouraging people is most effective when we consider how they primarily connect and communicate. A HEAD person often needs time to process information or consider an invitation. Such a person may feel pressured by immediate follow-up or respond in a negative way. Encourage them by giving them some time to think through things and then keep in touch to revisit previous conversations. You could also share any news articles or ideas you run across that are of interest. A quick email saying, “I saw this and thought it might be of interest to you.” Is an effective way of encouraging a head person (but not so with a heart or hands person!).

Heart people need to be nurtured and assured. If you let too much time pass between contacts, they might think you don't care about them. It's better to send them a cheery short note, email, or text until you have something meaty to share. Listen and ask to gauge the frequency you should make contact. On one hand, you don't want them to feel neglected, but on the other, you don't want to come across as a “stalker for Jesus.” They will be encouraged knowing you are thinking of them and that you are praying for them.

The best way to encourage a hands person is to share how the work he has done is having an impact on people's lives. Sharing media posts, sending pictures, or providing thank-you cards from people who have been served are all good ways to provide encouragement. Also, keep in contact to let them know about new opportunities to serve.

We closed the meeting with the Lord’s Prayer.

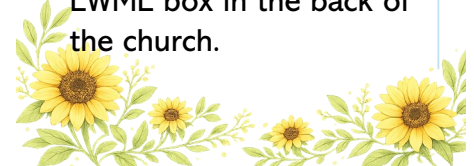
**After the Meeting:** We had fun crafting with Paula as our guide! We made whimsical spoon figures and wrapped them with Tootsie-Roll Pops!

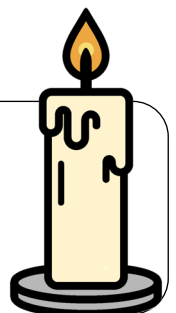

# Stewardship is WORK

It's September, and everything is in full swing again: back to school and back to church attendance after vacations and weekends away. And since everything is back into full swing, it's a perfect time to get back to basics, back to the foundation.

At the end of the first of his chapters on the virtue of faith in *Mere Christianity*, C.S. Lewis provides a helpful reminder, by way of analogy, for the foundation of stewardship. He wrote:

*Every faculty you have, your power of thinking or of moving your limbs from moment to moment, is given you by God. If you devoted every moment of your whole life exclusively to His service, you could not give Him anything that was not in a sense His own already. So then, when we talk of a man doing anything for God or giving anything to God, I will tell you what it is really like. It is like a small child going to its father and saying, "Daddy, give me six pence to buy you a birthday present." Of course, the father does, and he is pleased with the child's present. It is all very nice and proper, but only an idiot would think that the father is*

*would think that the father is six-pence to the good on the transaction. When a man has made these two discoveries God can really get to work. It is after this that real life begins. (128–129).*

This is the first thing we are given to confess about stewardship, and it has to do with ownership. God owns everything, and we are simply managers — stewards — acting on His behalf. This is true not only of all that we have in this life (Deuteronomy 8:17–18), but also all that we are in this life (1 Corinthians 6:20).

The rest flows from here. Since we are stewards, or managers, of what belongs to God, entrusted to make use of it according to His will, there is an expectation of responsibility and accountability.

For the Lord said, "Everyone to whom much was given, of him much will be required, and from him to whom they entrusted much, they will demand the more" (Luke 12:48b).

And from this comes blessing and reward: "Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master" (Matthew 25:21).

We have everything we need to support this body and life from our God's fatherly divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in us. We have everything we need for our spiritual life also from His merciful hands.

On account of the sacrifice of His Son, our Lord Jesus, through the preaching of the gospel and the administration of the sacraments, we have the forgiveness of sins, eternal life, and everlasting salvation delivered to us with absolute certainty that it is ours — not as stewards but as sons (Gal. 4:1–7).

Let us then, as His own sons, press all that He gives to us into the service of His church and to His glory.

### New Business

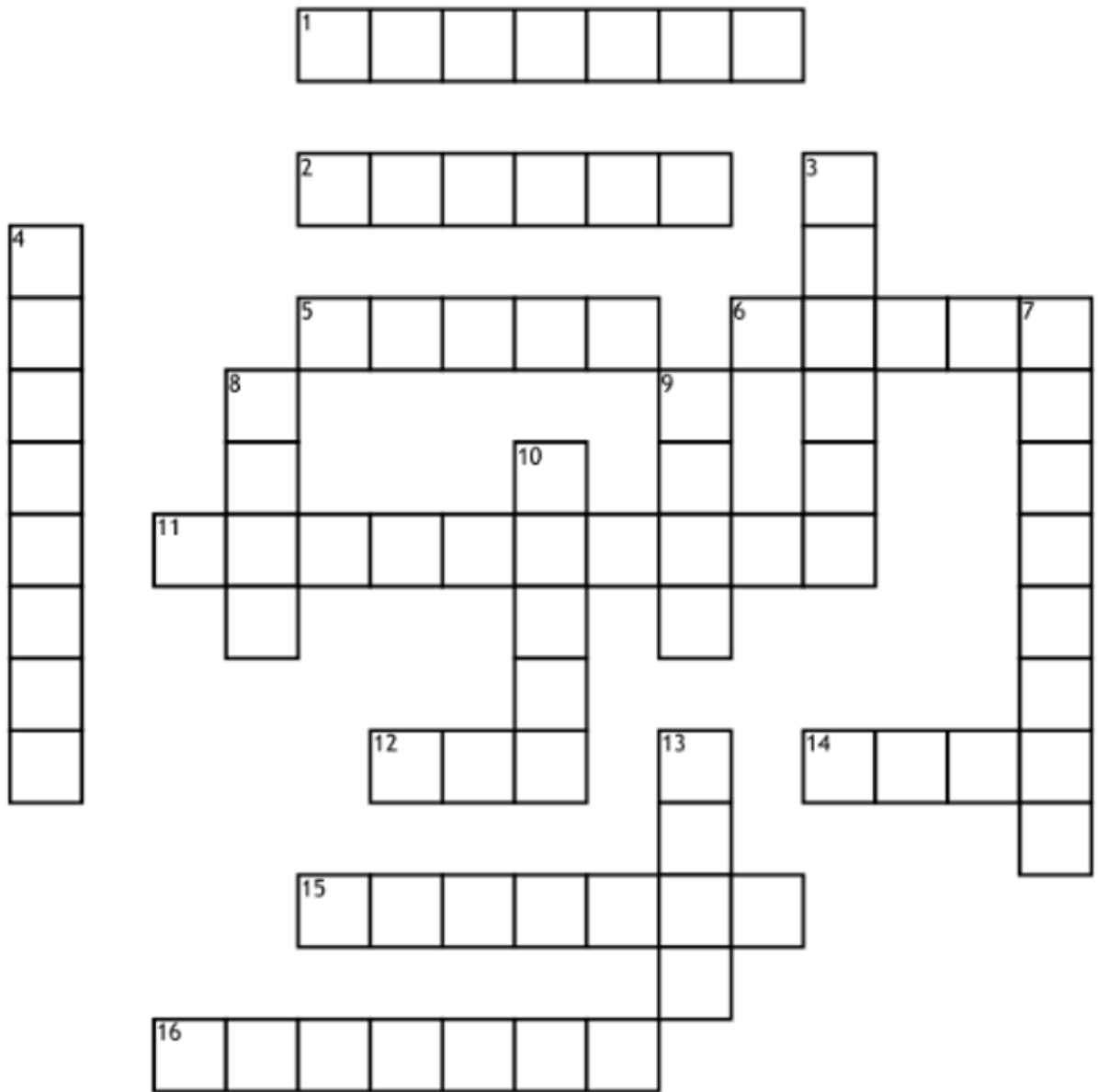
There was a discussion regarding the acquiring of outside help to set up the garage sale tables and items.
