
The Season of Lent

Encore Post: “Mardi Gras” — “Fat Tuesday” or “Carnival” — “Farewell to meat” — are names given to the days full of parties just before Lent. In Christian countries, people celebrated these days, knowing that with the beginning of Lent, they would spend forty days fasting. By the time of the Reformation, the season of Lent had become a very somber time of self-denial, where repentance, meditation upon the sufferings and death of Jesus, dominated the everyday life of Christians. In order to earn some merit before God, the serious believer would not only fast, but give alms to the poor, go on pilgrimages and do anything they thought would please God.

This way of looking at Lent differs greatly from the way it was seen during the Early Church. The season arose as a part of the process of becoming a Christian. A new convert to the faith spent forty days being taught the basic truths of God’s word, especially about the life, sufferings and death of the Lord Jesus. Forty days is the symbolic period of testing, fasting and discipline done to focus a believer’s mind on prayer and meditation on God’s word. Since the customary day to baptize new Christians moved early on from the day celebrating the Baptism of our Lord to the Vigil of Easter (Holy Satur-

day), *catechumens* (new Christians studying the faith) and their *Catechists* (teachers of the faith) would fast the forty weekdays prior to Easter each year. Since Sundays are always a celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus, they would not fast on the Sundays. They found the practice to be a great blessing and so the whole church soon began to fast with them. Ash Wednesday, therefore, begins Lent, which lasts until Holy Saturday.

Lutherans reformed the practice of Lent, so that rather than being a season of sorrow, it is a season of discipline. Beginning in repentance for sins with Ash Wednesday, it continues in quiet reflection on the

Christian Symbols

Ship—The Christian church has long been symbolized by a ship. St. Ambrose described the church as a ship with the cross as its mast, and others have compared salvation to being drawn out of the sea of death into the safety of the church (ship). Indeed, many large churches are constructed to represent a big boat, with the main worship space called the nave — Latin for ship.

Invitations that Appeal to Head, Heart, or Hands

There comes a point in the conversations with people to whom you are witnessing when it will be time to invite them to something. Invitations are most likely to be of interest to persons if they appeal to how they connect and communicate. An invitation that is appealing to a “head” person may not be appealing to a “heart” person.

Once again, you should put yourself in the place of the other person and think about how the person connects and communicates. Don’t extend an invitation based on how interesting *you* find it to be; extend it on how interesting it is to the person.

Head people are generally open to invitations that provide opportunities to explore truth or work through challenging ideas. An invitation to a study that is “heady” and led by someone with a strong academic background would be of interest to a head person.

Heart people are attracted to activities through which they can connect with other people and develop relationships with them. A “heady” study would be of little interest to them, but the same topic studied in a small group setting could be of interest.

A study of any kind probably would not interest a **hands person** who would rather be involved in an activity. Their desire is to make a positive difference in some way.

The most appealing invitations for hands people are those that involve doing something to help other people (e.g., a service project or mercy work).

So we now see that it is important to realize how people connect and communicate when extending invitations.

Soft music plays. Then another message comes on:

“Listen carefully to the following options and press the appropriate number.

- Press 1 for prayer for a loved one.
- Press 2 for prayer for your church.
- Press 3 to give thanks.
- Press 4 to confess sins.
- Press 5 for salvation.
- Press 6 for physical needs.
- To repeat this menu, press 9.”

Since I had a sin to confess, I pressed 4.

Another voice responded cheerfully:

“We’re so glad to help you with your confession of sins. Please select from the following options:

- If you cursed, press 1.
- If you yelled at your spouse or another family member, press 2.
- If you gossiped, press 3...”

The list went on and on.

About then I decided to hang up and keep on gossiping. But then I remembered what the Bible says about God and how he attends to our needs. He doesn’t route our prayers through a heavenly call center or put us on hold. We don’t get busy signals, menus or automated voices.

Instead, our Father listens instantly, personally, and lovingly. Instead of a voice mail system, he says, “*Before they call I will answer; while they are still speaking I will hear.*” (Isaiah 65:24, KJV)

Absent: **Pastor** Gary Brandt, **Vice President** Noah Estes, **Treasurer** Peg Callahan, **Trustee** Chuck Kral and **Stewardship** Candi Tostenrud

The minutes from the January 13, 2026 meeting were approved as printed.

Financial Secretary: Brett presented a balance sheet listing all assets owned by Peace Lutheran Church. He recommended moving some money into the LCEF open account when the largest CD comes due. Brett's report was accepted and approved.

Treasurer's Report: Brett presented Peg's report.

- All bills are currently paid.
- The spending reports for November, December and January were presented.
- Our electronic sign was repaired. The charge for labor was \$1,187.50. The parts that were replaced were under warranty.
- The cemetery CD was renewed on January 23, 2026, with an interest rate of 4%.
- Pudge has access to the church debit card if immediate payment is required.
- Peg is waiting for approval to pay the snow removal invoice.
- Several members donated Thrivent Choice Dollars to Peace.

Board of Elders: Jeff reported the following:

- The elders met on 2/1/ 2026. The attendees were Pastor Brandt, Jeff Emery, Jeff Hedberg, and Larry Trick. Pastor Brandt gave the opening prayer.
- Pastor Brandt will not be available for the February 8 service. Pastor Alter will cover the service.
- Bids were obtained from Tom's Heating and Cooling and from American Heating and Cooling to replace the furnace that is no longer working. American Heating and Cooling is scheduled to install a new unit on March 3rd.
- Jeff Hedberg recommended that a new snow removal service be found. The present service was told to do nothing until he was contacted by a

church official. The removal was performed without approval.

Pastor Brandt closed with prayer. Jeff's report was accepted and approved.

Trustees: The trustee report was covered in the elders' report.

Old Business: None




