Victor's Cross

Also called the conqueror's cross, the victor's cross is composed of the Greek cross, recognized by its four equal arms, adorned with Greek letters in each quadrant. The top left letters stand for "Jesus" and the top right, for "Christ" (the horizontal lines above them indicate they're abbreviations). The four letters across the bottom spell the Greek word for "conqueror."

One of the most common questions Christians ask is, "If God loves me, why does He allow me to suffer?" It's an honest question. We naturally assume that a loving Father would remove pain from His children. So, when suffering comes, we wonder if something has gone wrong. Maybe God is angry with us. Maybe our faith is too weak. Maybe we've somehow stepped outside His will.

Scripture paints a different picture for us. Jesus was perfectly obedient, yet He suffered more than anyone. The apostles faithfully proclaimed the Gospel, yet they were imprisoned, beaten, and many were killed. Throughout history, some of God's most faithful servants have endured tremendous hardship. Their suffering was not evidence that God had abandoned them. Nor was it proof that they lacked faith. The Christian should not be surprised by suffering because we follow a crucified Savior.

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This doesn't mean that every hardship is directly sent by God or that we should stop praying for healing, deliverance, or relief. Christians rightly ask God to ease suffering and rejoice when He does. Nor does it mean suffering is good in itself. Disease, death, injustice, and grief remain enemies that Christ came to overcome. What the theology of the cross teaches is something different: suffering is not incompatible with God's love.

In a fallen world corrupted by Sin, Christians experience the same brokenness that everyone else does. We get sick. We bury loved ones. We lose jobs. We struggle with depression. We face betrayal and disappointment. Yet through all of it, God continues His work of sustaining faith, drawing us to Himself, and conforming us ever more closely to Christ.

The cross reminds us that God's love is not measured by how com-

fortable our lives are. It is measured by the lengths to which He went to redeem us. If God did not spare His own Son in order to save you, then your suffering cannot be interpreted as evidence that He has stopped loving you. The cross has already settled that question.

Every One His Witness Encourage

The encouragement of the Gospel
rather than the accountability of the Law

For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us so that whether we are awake or asleep we might live with Him. Therefore, *encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing.*

(1 Thessalonians 5:9-11)

The E in LASSIE stands for
“Encourage.”

Encouragement is a vital part of your life as Christ’s servant. As the devil, the world, and our own sinful nature work against you, it’s easy to lose heart. You need encouragement to be a witness for Christ.



The people you witness to need encouragement as well. The same forces that work against you work against them too.

Sometimes churches substitute accountability for encouragement. This is a mistake for several reasons.

In the first place, God’s Word calls us to encourage one another rather than hold each other accountable.

Encouragement is found in the Gospel, which is the basis and motivation for our work as Christ’s witnesses.

In contrast, accountability is based on the Law, which ends up accusing and condemning. There is certainly a place for the Law and for accountability to the Law in the lives of Christians. But if the Law becomes your reason or motivation for sharing Jesus, evangelism will be a great burden on you causing shame, guilt, and angst.

Unfortunately, many ideas about evangelism do just that. Encouragement of the Gospel frees you up from the shame, guilt, and angst and you are free to encourage others.

The second reason is that you are working to bring the Good News of Jesus to those who do not know and confess Him. You extend invitations to them with the hope that they will accept those invitations and continue to hear of and learn about Jesus. It make no sense to try to hold someone accountable to an invitation. Instead, you influence a person to accept your invitations through appealing acts of encouragement.

Some Survive

Then the waters had overwhelmed us, the stream had gone over our soul: Then the proud waters had gone over our soul. Psalm 124:4-5

On May 21st a man went over Niagara Falls and lived.

Police reports say there have been three kinds of people who have gone over the falls without protection and lived. Let's see, in 2009 there was a 30-year-old fellow from Ontario who failed at committing suicide. Then, in 2003, an American went over the edge as part of a stunt. Finally, there was a seven-year-old boy whose boat had capsized.

Did I say there were three types of survivors? That's wrong.

There's only one kind of survivor. All of these survivors are people whose time on this earth is not yet over. You might call it incredible luck.

I'd say it was God's intervening hand.

I mean, think about it. What are the odds on surviving a fall

over the falls? Pretty small, I'm guessing.

Of course, the odds on going over the falls and living are infinitely better than expecting to get into heaven without Jesus as your Savior.

We've already seen that some people, for whatever reason, manage to make it over and through a drop over Niagara. But there is nobody who is going to get into heaven without the Savior's blood-bought forgiveness.

Nobody. Period. End of reading.

This leads me to two questions:

1. Why would anyone in the Christian church not throw a rope to someone who was spiritually adrift, being swept along to certain disaster? It ought to be as unthinkable as withholding a life rope from a person who is about to be swept over Niagara's precipice.
2. And the second question? Why would anyone not take hold of and desperately cling to the Savior?

I can only think of one answer to that question: the person doesn't think he is in any kind of

danger. He doesn't understand the imperative of holding fast to the Christ.

Well, I guess I don't have to understand why people don't want the Savior. I don't need to understand. Understanding is not my job. My job is to keep calling out a warning ... and tossing out the lifeline provided by the Savior. Who knows? Maybe someday they'll grab hold.

THE PRAYER: Dear Lord, today I bring before you those who are close to me, those who are headed for certain destruction without the Savior. In my heart I list them by name and pray You will — while there is still time — help me keep the Savior before them. This I ask in Jesus' Name. Amen.

Stewardship is WORK

When it comes to stewardship, a favorite Bible verse is the account of the widow's mite (Luke 21:1-4). It's a moving account. Our Lord praises the seemingly small gift of two copper coins given by a poor widow above the abundance of gifts given by the rich, saying, "Truly, I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all of them" (Luke 21:3).

And that is usually where we stop. But the text goes on. "For they all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on" (Luke 21:4).

"She ... put in all she had to live on." She gave everything. She held nothing back. She trusted that the Lord who made her and all creatures, who gave her everything she had, who redeemed her from her own sin, from death, and the power of the devil, who called her by the Gospel and enlightened her with His gifts of Word and Sacrament, would continue to do this. He would provide her with all that she needed for this body and life because that is the character of the God she had.

But this is not why we give small gifts. Her gift, though it appeared small, was actually large. When we are tempted to give small gifts it is precisely because we want them to be small! We

don't trust the Lord to provide for us.

We give small gifts because we lack faith in the One who created us, redeemed us, sanctifies and keeps us in the one true faith. We give small gifts because we doubt that God will really give us what we need and desire. We give small gifts because we are not content with what God has already given.

We are not slaves, children of the slave woman, under the Old Covenant (Gal. 4). We are adopted sons of the free woman. And since we are sons, we are also heirs. And heirs receive the inheritance. For everything is already ours in Christ. And thus, moved by the willing spirit of adoption, we do the will of God in financial matters far beyond all that done by those under the Old Covenant who were forced by legal demands.

So what have you decided to give? How do I decide what to give? Let the Scriptures be your guide.

We are to give proportionally to what we have received from God's giving to us (Luke 12:48; 1 Cor. 16:1-2, 2 Cor. 8:12). But you have not been set free to give nothing. See that you excel in the grace of giving (2 Cor. 8:7).

We are not free to live selfishly outside the Gospel, without

regard for God who gives us all good gifts, without generosity for our neighbor who needs us and our gifts, without supporting the community of faith in which we live, without care for our spiritual fathers and those who teach and help raise our children in the faith, without resources for the poor and needy – in short, we are not free to live unto ourselves, hoarding what God has given us only for us.

For love is the fulfillment of the law (Romans 13:10). And the sum of the law is this: Love God and love your neighbor (Matt. 22:34-40). We love because He first loved us. We give because He has given to us.

Luther once said, "Possessions belong in your hands, not in your heart" (LW 14:240). There is a reason your 10 fingers spread apart. With your hands you catch God's gifts for what you need and let the rest fall through your fingers to your neighbors – your family, your friends, your community, your church.

The minutes from the June 9, 2026 meeting were approved as printed.

Financial Secretary: Brett stated that giving is slightly behind this time last year. His report was accepted and approved.

Treasurer's Report: Peg reported the following:

- All bills are paid.
- Peg presented the current information regarding expenses and balances in line items.

The report was accepted and approved.

Board of Elders: Larry reported the following:

- The elders met on July 12, 2026. Pastor Brandt, Jeff Emery, Jeff Hedberg, and Larry Trick were present.

- Russell and Rodney Schulz picked up limbs and branches that were downed.
- Pat removed a downed tree in the cemetery.
- There are fifty to one hundred tree branches that need to be trimmed due to storm damage. The council is looking for volunteers to assist in keeping our grounds looking cared for.

Chuck's report was accepted and approved.

New Business:

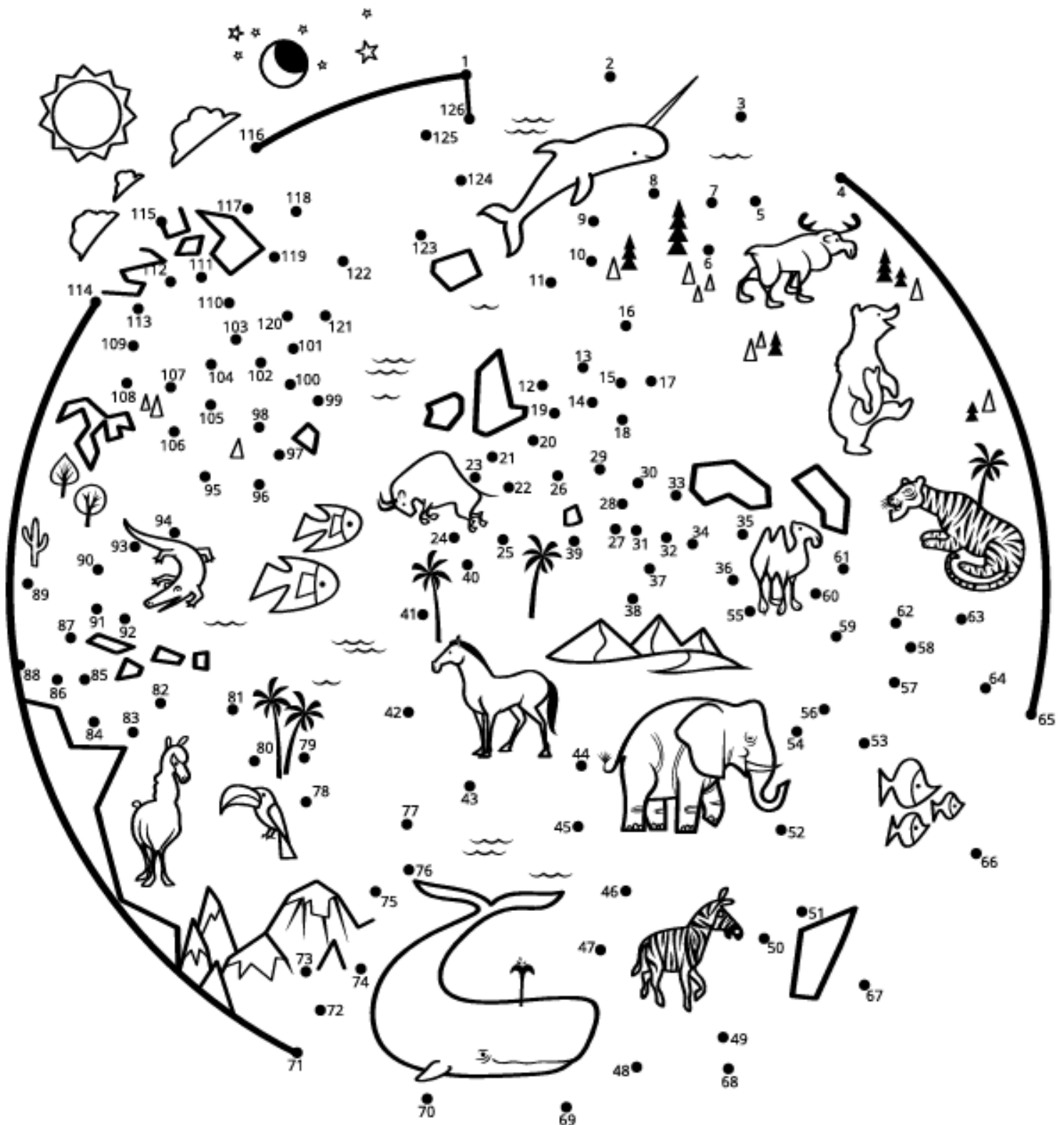
- Jeff Emery reported that \$1400.00 was contributed for the Hutton family at the July 19th gathering.
