Tarts must be on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside of a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name, mailing address and fair represented. The size of the tarts must be full size tarts. (no mini or bite size tarts) and must not contain fruit or nuts (ie. no raisins, no pecans)

Provincial Competition: A total of 6 tarts will be required to be shown. Tarts must be on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside of a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name, mailing address and district represented. The size of the tarts must be full size tarts. (no mini or bite size tarts) and must not contain fruit or nuts (ie. no raisins, no pecans). 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place entries will not be returned to exhibitor but will be placed up for auction at the convention.

**Stan Darling Trophy for Family Achievement:

The purpose of this trophy is to encourage families to work together in a common goal at agricultural fairs, and to provide recognition of their achievement. The trophy shall be presented to the family group winning the highest number of points. The winning family may keep the trophy until the next fair. A family group shall be 2 or more persons living in the same household. In the event of a tie in points, the winner shall be the family with greatest number of first prizes.

***Hand Quilted quilts must be a minimum of 324" measured on the perimeter, to qualify for this award. Top quilt will advance to District level and if declared winner, quilt will advance for entry in the OAAS quilt competition. Top winning quilt has a \$500.00 prize and winner keeps their quilt. A \$100.00 Reserve Grand Prize will be awarded and exhibitor retains ownership of quilt.

****Machine quilt: Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 324" measured on the perimeter. A Grand champion prize and reserve grand champion prize will be awarded and exhibitor retains ownership of quilt.

CRITERIA FOR THE HANDMADE QUILTING COMPETITION

Size:

1. Minimum of 324" measured on the perimeter.

Colour:

1. The guilt should have a well planned colour scheme.

Design:

- 1. The overall appearance for the design of the guilt top should be appealing.
- 2. The design should be related to the use of the quilt.
- 3. The colour of the lining should be in proportion to the size of the guilt.

Material:

- 1. Fabrics and threads of similar quality should be used.
- 2. Good quality of materials should be durable and able to stand washing.
- 3. The colour of the lining should be a repeat of the dominant colour of the Quilt top or one that contrasts.

Workmanship:

- 1. Quilting stitches should be uniform, knots obscure and no obvious pattern marks.
- 2. Pieces should be accurately stitched and joined.
- 3. The binding should be neat and even.
- 4. If back is pieces, it should have a centre panel and two side panels, RATHER THAN two panels with a centre seam.

ANNUAL MACHINE QUILTED QUILT

Rules are the same as for hand quilted quilt.

Except for:

The Quilt must NOT be quilted using a long arm machine and must have visible machine quilting. Minimum of 324" measured on the perimeter.

A GRAND PRIZE will be awarded and the exhibitor will retain ownership of quilt.

CRITERIA FOR THE MACHINE QUILTING COMPETITION

Machine quilts are judged by the same construction criteria as Hand Quilts. They are judged on evenness of stitches. Pattern of the quilting should complement the design of the fabric.

There are two methods of machine quilting:

FREE MOTION: quilting enables one to construct carved designs consisting of loops and circular stitches.

STIPPLE: quilting is machine quilting that includes a meandering line achieved by sewing small circular loops that do not cross over each, similar to a puzzle piece.

Scoring Points:

General Appearance and Design – 25 points Colour and Materials – 20 points Workmanship – 55 points Total: 100 points.

TIPS FOR PREPARING CRAFTS

- 1. Articles must be clean and unused.
- 2. If using a glue gun, make sure there are no strands of glue left. Easily removed by turning on your hair dryer and blowing them away.
- When a prize list calls for "a pair", both items must be the same size: ie: mitts, socks, tea towels, pillow cases must have identical patterns on each.
- Use the right needles and/or crochet hook for the yarn and pattern being used.
- 5. Flat press knitting or crochet only if necessary.
- There should never be knots on any piece of needlework, knitting or crochet.
 All loose ends must be woven into the article and well hidden.
- When doing cross-stitch or counted cross-stitch, all top stitches must go in the same direction.
- 8. Latch hook rugs need to be finished with rug binding on the back.
- 9. Braided rugs must lie flat. Try them on a flat surface to make sure.
- 10. Cushions are 50cm (20") or less. Pillows are more than 50cm (20")
- 11. A doily is less than 30cm (12"). A centerpiece is over 30cm (12")
- Stuffed toys should be washable, firmly stuffed with self-locking eyes or preferably embroidered eyes.
- 13. Use the proper yarn for needlepoint and do not press the stitches flat. All stitches must slant in the same direction. No holes, no canvas or stamped pattern visible. Blocked with straight row and square corners.
