Prize money may be forfeited if entries are removed before the times listed.
4. Name and school attending must be marked on the entry tag.
5. Items marked with an " X " become the property of the sponsor. If items are removed by the exhibitor and damaged, they are responsible for replacing the item for the sponsor or prize will be forfeited.
