May Program: Make-and-Take

"WRAPPED STICKS"

May's "Make-and-Take" activity will be the art of stick decorating. The finished wrapped and decorated sticks can be displayed in pots (with or without plants in them), hung on the wall, or placed in any corner that needs some color.

Per guild policy: Guest fee is \$2/meeting



Please bring:

- ✓ Interesting sticks that are not thorny and not too brittle/crumbly.

 Try to snip off branches and buds that are too skinny to wrap and clean off loose bark. The more angles and twists, the better. *JoAnn Fabrics* has bunches of corkscrew willow that can be used with success.
- ✓ Colorful /bright yarns, ribbons, fabric strips, leather. Different textures make it more interesting.
- ✓ Beads, buttons, earrings, pendants, found objects to use as decoration.
- ✓ Different glues can be used. *Elmer's, Tacky* or *Elmer's glue stick*.
- ✓ Scissors
- ✓ Something to work on to protect the table, i.e., waxed paper or firm plastic.
- ✓ Wet Ones to clean hands as working.
- ✓ AND...your creativity!!!

Recycle for Upscale Scarf Accessory with Sharon Laws

October 3, 2017 ~ 1:00-3:30pm ~ Limit 10 Students ~ Workshop Fee: \$15.00

Learn the technique for the scarves some of our guild members displayed in January. We all 'oohed and aahed' over the unique construction! Sharon will show different ways for us to collage scarves and fabric in our stash or from the thrift store. You will come away with a one-of-a-kind accessory. We'll plan, pin and tape our creations together for permanent assembly at home.

Weaving in the Saori Way with Laura Lundy

November 8 &-9, 2017 ~ 9am – 4pm ~ Workshop is limited to 8 Students ~ Workshop Fee: \$90.00

Students will provide their own pre-warped looms and yarns for weaving and learn Saori Weaving Techniques in this 2-day workshop. Laura will discuss; What is Saori? How is the Saori philosophy expressed in weaving? Techniques to be taught will be chosen from a list of 11 techniques, with class input, including a collaboration of Saori and Sakiori (weaving w/rags). Discussion of how to finish woven cloth and if time permits, how to sew up and instructions for a simple garment.

Eco-Dyeing and Indigo Shibori Dyeing with Ric Rao THIS WORKSHOP IS FULL!

October 14, 2017 9am-4pm & October 15, 9am-12noon ~ Workshop is limited to 8 Students ~ Cost: \$100.00 (1-1/2 day workshop) Ric Rao of Las Cruces New Mexico will be with us again this Fall. On Day 1 we will learn Ric's technique for Eco-Dyeing using two silk scarves and local plants. While steaming the scarves eco-dye silk scarves we will prepare Shibori pieces for dyeing the morning of the second day.

I have always been impressed with the gifts we've received for this project. Many of you provide knitted goods, but many of the members have donated items that are felted, crocheted, sewn, beaded, and other crafts.

Whatever your craft, I hope you will consider making an item or two for the low income seniors in the area this year. The gifts are distributed at the end of December. You can definitely make a difference in the lives of many.

I will not be at the May meeting, but Sharon Laws, Elaine Cselenko or Kathe Alves will be happy to take any gifts that are ready and store for the summer. We will also be collecting gifts through the November meeting.

Worn as Art: Reversible Capes by Eleanor Bostwick. Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport Terminal 3, level 2 display case. Over a period of three decades, Eleanor Bostwick created a series of eight unique capes. They are all reversible and similar in basic form, but that is where their similarity ends. Each cape is executed in different combinations of materials such as silk, wool, taffeta, beads and leather. She incorporates various fiber art techniques including hand-weaving, applique, embroidery and quilting. All of the capes are rich with layers of meaning and detail.
