
The Countdown Begins for Our 3rd Annual Xmas Party Scarf Exchange!

History Tidbits

Founding members of our guild, husband and wife Shelby Adams and Zoey Adams, were avid fiber artists. They were both weavers - Shelby a very good weaver, weaving beautiful Navajo style rugs, and Zoey particularly loved to spin. She would spin anything! As told by Shelby to members including Evelyn Britten (she joined the guild in 2000), Zoey would save cotton from the tops of medicine bottles and spin the cotton on her special spinning wheel, the charkha, similar to the one used by Ghandi. Then she would use these spun threads in making tapestries.
