# Natural Dyeing with Ric Rao

Ric Rao has been involved in fiber arts for more than 35 years and he has been experimenting with natural dyes since 1975. Ric started a dye garden in 2000 in Las Cruces New Mexico and it was showcased on the PBS Series, "Southwest Yard & Garden," under the subheading, "Innovative Gardeners," in the fall of 2002. Ric had an article on dyeing published in the Spring -2016 issue of Cotton for *Ply Magazine.* 

Ric will speak to us about how to grow a dye garden with easy to grow garden plants, both annual and perennial. The dried dyestuffs will be shown along with samples of the colors achieved with each dye/plant. He will also talk about plants that can be harvested from the desert (be sure to check with local BLM to see where this is possible in your state) as well as dye sources from plants and bugs that must be purchased from foreign sources.


