

# "DECONSTRUCTED SCREEN PRINTING: DIVA DUO DIVULGE DETAILS"

Our own guild members (and fiber enthusiasts!) Marie Gile and Sharon Laws will share their love of a relatively new dye printing process, Deconstructed Screen Printing, developed by noted fiber artist Kerr Grabowski. Unique and unusual images emerge with this printing technique! The process makes use of the resist properties of thickened dye that has dried on a screen, and is then used in printing images that are very natural, spontaneous and organic. Sharon and Marie will discuss how it all works and share examples of the entire process — and their results — in a PowerPoint presentation.


