So, Linda and Melanie will be sorting through the existing and amazing library that Linda has created and we will have a BOOK SALE at the October meeting. When Linda leaves for her sojourn around the globe at the end of the year, she will be very much missed. Everyone on the Board is in awe of the amazing job Linda has done maintaining the library, transporting books of interest to Guild meetings and storing the entire library in her home. With Linda leaving - the library needs to find a new home. This posed a major storage problem! I checked with the Good Shepherd Church to see if they had any storage options, but they are bursting at the seams until the Sahuarita Food Bank is built (another 2-4 years). The Board discussed the problem and a committee of three was sent off to find storage for the library. The committee visited the Sahuarita American Legion that has a nice space for workshops but no storage room. It turns out storage is seriously hard to find!


Currently the Guild spends \$1,026.00 annually for a non-climate controlled small storage space.

Then your committee of three visited the Community Performing Arts Center (CPAC) on Continental Road. The room space was well filled with existing music groups and Olli. The Theater however, was available and 'saints be praised' they had STORAGE available. The theater has very comfortable seating with a great sound system and a sound technician. The parking is great and there is an extra lobby and outdoor space for sales and events. Chris Ashcraft, CPAC's director was quite impressed as to the variety of artistic endeavors we enjoy and was excited by the possibilities of integrating VFAG into the larger art community.

A Board meeting was called Monday, September 9th and it was agreed to move the VFAG meetings to CPAC in January 2020. The library will be housed in two large metal, wheeled and locked storage containers. At each meeting, the library will be available for perusal and check out.

Melanie and Linda have a huge project to get us to this point and I cannot thank either of them enough for their dedication. The plan is for Melanie to have a computer in order to keep records and checkouts/check-ins current each month.

While we are editing and re-housing the library, it was suggested to clean out the storage unit as well and have a storage unit sale in the near future. Any items deemed valuable to the membership will likely be stored by the Study Group that values them. Anything not sold or stored by members will be sent to the White Elephant. The storage unit should be cleaned out and no longer a budget item by December 2019. This will allow us to maintain our library and meet in a very nice setting with ties to the greater arts community. We have all enjoyed the wonderful meeting space of the Good Shepherd Church and will miss the beauty and peace of the sanctuary each month.
