President's Message ~

It seems like yesterday that we had our May Guild meeting and dispersed for the summer. A few study groups have been active while many of you have been off gallivanting around. Clothing, Basketry and Knitting are the three study groups that come to mind. Debbi Brunner and Pat Merritt have been actively



investigating the fall 2020 Retreat: *The Red Ruana*. Our December holiday focus will be on a gift we make for ourselves: *A Red Ruana*. Debbi Brunner sent out a message on our website July 24th, setting the stage for some seriously creative work in progress.

I have finished a free-form, red, knitted and felted wool ruana which I will bring for SHOW and TELL at our September 3rd meeting; commencing at 9:30 AM. I am also working (struggling) with a linen red ruana, with the most challenging lace I have ever experienced. My focus leaves a lot to be desired. We'll see how far I get towards finishing it for the meeting. I am also nearly finished with my wool *Swoncho* which goes with me mid-September to Norway and on to Canada (yep -50th Anniversary).

I attended the *Flag Wool and Fiber Festival*, June 1st, in Flagstaff, and made a nuno felted silk scarf in under two hours (!!). I also attended the *Bisbee Fiber Art Guild Regional Workshop*, and got to hear Louie Garcia (a native cotton fiber artist) twice, and I would travel to hear him speak again. Perhaps we will be blessed to have him speak at one of our future programs. Debbi Brunner taught a Boro class, and Pat Merritt and Gary Terlisner were also in attendance.

I have been busy working two days a week in Juvenile Detention, biking six islands in six days in Tahiti (50th Anniversary, still) and learning to make pine needle baskets in preparation for the upcoming workshop in January, by Toni Best: "Gourd and Pine Needle Baskets."

Word has it that Toni Best will also be teaching in Bisbee this winter.



Celebrating the Red Ruana

As announced at the May meeting, the VFAG Board has decided to change things up a bit for our Holiday meeting and luncheon. In the past, we exchanged handmade gifts, then had three years of scarf exchanges. After some thought and consideration, we believe it would be fun to give ourselves a gift: a handmade Red Ruana, perfect for the holidays and the cooler weather that follows. It may be felted, knitted, crocheted, woven (see the newest issue of Handwoven magazine, talk about timing), you name it, size doesn't matter. Think about that, all you mixed media and beading folks!

If you're not familiar with a Ruana, it is a wrap to cover the shoulders and drapes the body. It has many names; American-Spanish Ruana, Mexican Serape, Peruvian Manta just to name a few. It is used to keep a person warm; not only as a cloak but as a blanket. It may be wrapped and tied to carry a load of goods, even a baby. A versatile textile of varying sizes, it may be square, rectangular, short or long and most often slit open down the center front. Ruanas were first woven and worn by the poor as they had many utilitarian purposes and they were long wearing. Today's Ruanas are a fashion statement, so make your statement and celebrate creativity with fellow members December 3rd! Only three months to go!
