Place: 386 E El Valle, Green Valley (Fairways II neighborhood)



Members began to log onto zoom by 9:15 for some catch up time , the meeting was officially opened at 9:30 by our President "Captain Peggy"

The guest speaker for this month is Jane Herrick who is a mixed media artist. Her retirement from being a professor of textiles allows her time to be a practicing studio artist. Jane treated us to a slide show of her back yard on the shore of Lake Michigan where the natural objects inspire her creations. She augments these materials with manufactured materials such as fiber rush. Jane also uses a variety of techniques that allow her creations to develop as she proceeds. Lucky for us Jane spends part of her time here in southern Arizona where she also uses desert landscapes and materials as inspiration. Quite a few of us were fascinated by her use of cactus skeletons as frameworks for her pieces. I for one will be collecting some on my next walk through the desert.

Jane will be giving a mixed media fiber workshop next year using hand stitching and collage techniques for our guild.

Break started at 10:36, we reconvened with a brief business meeting.

Minutes of the January general membership meeting were accepted as written.

Cindy Wolf's woven tea towels are sure to brighten any kitchen! Created with 8/2 cotton on an 8 shaft loom. Six colors in the warp with black as weft.

Gary Tersliner, busy as usual, set an agate in resin as the base of a pine needle basket. Copper wire and blue wrapped linen showed his southwestern spirit. He also wove table runners in blue and white in a houndstooth design using 5/2 mercerized cotton on an 8-shaft loom.

Kay Burrow, Jane Tempel, BarbCopeland and Bernie Olson did their best to herald the arrival of spring with truly joyous pink and red crepe paper roses.

Debra Brown's designs include: a colorfulWedge Weave Tapestry; The tapestry is 5.5 x 6 inches in wedge weave with a feather technique; the brown and natural basket is 6" tall and twined using waxed linen; the small bowl is 5" and twined using waxed linen, copper and glass beads, and copper wire; and the last basket is 6.5" and made using wool yarn coiled around a paper rush core.


