President's Letter ~ April 2024 Dear Members

I've just returned from visiting yet another quilt show, this one sponsored by the Arizona State Quilt Guild and I spent a very pleasant day viewing quilts and shopping at vendors. Being tempted to spend way over budget at many of



the vendors' stalls, I stopped to think about materials and tools. To me the distinction is that materials become an integral part of the item being created such as yarn for knitters, crocheters and weavers, pine needles for basket makers, fabric and thread for guilters, floss and needles for embroiderers and so on. Tools are sewing machines, looms, knitting needles and crochet hooks which are also necessary to create something. The last few decades has seen a plethora of tools such as items for marking fabric, special hoops for embroidery, rulers, rotary cutters, templates and so on many of which have become essential to modern craftspeople. Many of these tools make our creations better, faster to produce and more enjoyable to work on. But- and there is alway a but or a downside - and for me it is the cost, the storage and the organization of these tools. I find space for them so they are not intruding on my work space but then I sometimes forget which tools I already own and spend time searching for the one I need at that moment. I certainly don't want to go back to hand piecing every bit of fabric in a quilt. So, in crafting as in life, there always needs to be a balance. How many tools do I need, how many can I store in my allotted and finite space and retrieve when needed? This is a tough guestion to answer when face to face with the one magic tool that will make all of my guilts so much easier to construct and look more professional. I'm going to step out of my sewing room, pick up my needles and yarn and work on a low-tech knitting project.

A major solar event, an eclipse is approaching and I want to remind all of our members of the president's challenge which is to create something inspired by space or time. Stars and sunshine readily come to mind but seasons and weather are also part of this.

So let your imagination soar and create beautiful items. Continued on pg. 5

Valley Fiber Art Guild Minutes of the General Meeting, March 11, 2024

PROGRAM

The guest presenter was Deb Deaton, an award winning art quilter and instructor. Displaying a wide variety of her pieces, she shared the techniques and media she uses in the construction of her art quilts.

BUSINESS

The General Meeting was called to order at 10:45. The minutes of the April meeting were approved as published. New members and guests were introduced.

I. President's Report - Martha Fine

1) Slate of Officers. Election of Officers will be held at the April meeting. Martha announced the slate of officers for the positions of President, Martha Fine, and Secretary, Marge Delker, and emphasized that other nominees are welcomed.

II. Vice-President Report - Jol'ene Northup

1) The Arizona Fiber Festival. Jol'ene displayed the raffle basket containing contributions from the Study Groups which VFAG will provide for the Festival and thanked the board members who constructed the felt needle cases that will be put in Festival goodie bags. There is a need for volunteers to help at the event and members who would be interested can sign-up on the Festival website : https://azfed.org/arizona-fiber-festival/

2) The Fiber Artists of Northern Arizona is hosting a two hour presentation by Marilou Schultz, a Navajo weaver, in Flagstaff on Saturday, April 15th. This event will be zoomed. Debbi Brunner related that Marilou has done a workshop in the past for VFAG and if there's an interest, could be asked back. 3) Martha Fine passed around a sign-up for those going to the Festival so a meet-up can be planned if desired.

III. Treasurer's Report - Debra Brown

Debra reported a current balance of \$7,721. She also suggested that when members prepare their Arizona Tax returns they consider utilizing the Qualified Charitable Organization Credit that allows a portion of state tax due can be paid to charity rather than to the state. One of the qualifying organizations is Friends in Deed where a number of VFAG Study Groups meet free of cost.

IV. Membership - Cindy Wolf

Cindy reported that are now have 100 members in the Guild. She introduced Nancy Gould who has joined the Membership Committee. Dues of \$25 are to be paid by April 30 using exact cash or by check. The membership form is available on the VFAG website and copies will be at the April meeting.

V. Program Committee - Debbi Brunner

1) The committee will meet next week to plan the programs and workshops for next year. She invited members who are willing to provide workshops to contact her. April's program will be the Stash Sale where members can display and sell their 'stash'. Members are asked to donate 10% of their proceeds to VFAG to help fund workshops, speakers, books for the library, etc. Members are invited to bring a Brown Bag lunch.

VI. Newsletter – Debbi Brunner

The deadline for submitting items for inclusion in the Newsletter are due by the 27th of the month. Study Group leaders are asked to provide related write-ups for the newsletter.

VII. Study Groups

A description of each of the Study Groups was provided.

VIII. Show and Share.

1) Jol'ene Northup modeled a woven shawl made of naturally colored pygora goat fleeces which she carded and spun.

2) Dale Box showed a wall hanging and fiber pieces which she made at a Deb Deaton workshop and three totebags that she made at a Quilt Central workshop.
