What started as a utilitarian way to not waste valuable fabric then developed into "country" style of repetitive blocks and motifs, finally morphing into artistic expression. The last show I attended identified original designs both in the piecing of the quilt and also in the stitching that holds the quilts together. It has taken a long time for women artists to be recognized as such in fine arts and in differentiating fine art from decorative arts. I laud the Tucson Quilt Guild for focusing on original and unique works and giving credit to the people who made them. I hope the time of differentiating decorative arts from fine art and giving artist status to the makers has finally arrived.
