*********Changes to Membership Year and Dues*********

The VFAG Board of Directors has discussed and voted on membership changes. The membership year has always been aligned with our Fiscal Year, May 1 through April 30. The membership year will now be the calendar year! What does that mean to you?

Current members will NOT have to renew this April. Current members will pay dues for a calendar year beginning January 2026. Beginning the calendar year 2026, dues will increase to \$30. a year, payable through the month of January 2026. Members not paid by January 31, 2026 will be removed from the roster and membership privileges.

For the few members who have pre-paid a year ahead on the former schedule — you are paid members through December 2027. New members signing on now through December 2025 will pay dues of \$30 and be members through December 2027. We hope the new schedule will make life a little easier, leaving more brain space for creative fiber fun. 

Business meeting
Minutes
The minutes of the February 2025 meeting were approved as published.
Nomination for Vice President and Treasurer
Martha Fine announced the nominations of Gary Terlisner for the office of Treasurer and Susan
Bollinger
for the office of Vice President. A call for any further nominations will be made and voting will
take place at
the April meeting.
Reports
Vice President
Jol'ene Northup announced that the Arizona Federation of Spinning and Weaving Guilds (AZFED) is going to
have a special event : Nancy Willson, from the Sedona Guild, is going to be harvesting cochineal at the
Jerome State Historical Park and on April 26th will do a presentation on dyeing with that product.
Treasurer
Debra Brown reported a current balance of \$7,761. There have been recent payments totaling
\$4,075 for
workshops since the beginning of the fiscal year. A payment of \$585 has been made for the two-
year cost of
the Guild's website. There has been a deposit of \$3,587
Library
Melanie Fitz requested that all library items be returned in March. She has cancelled future magazine
subscriptions and the current collection will be available for sale at the March meeting for 25¢
each. She
announced that Mary Hughes has agreed to take the position of librarian in the fall.
Field Trips
Martha Fine described the recent field trip to the Tucson Desert Museum to see the exposition of
Navajo rugs
and a docent led exploration, Women of the West, about the process of natural dyeing of fabrics.
On March 27th, there will be a field trip to the Amerind Museum, participants will meet at the
Fry's parking lot at
9:00. Currently there are six special exhibits. For more information, contact Debbi Brunner.

Membership

Nancy Gould reviewed the change in the date regarding the Membership Year in which the Membership Year will now reflect the Calendar Year in lieu of the currently used Fiscal Year. The membership of all current members will thus be extended to December 31st, 2025. Beginning with the Calendar Year, January 2006, the yearly dues will be \$30 which will be payable no later than January 31st. At that time, the Guild Roster will be updated to reflect current members. 

ARIZONA FEDERATION OF WEAVERS AND SPINNERS GUILDS, INC. Individual Education Grant Guidelines and Application

Application on Next Page

An individual education grant may be offered to one or more individual members each year. The amount of each grant will be determined by the Board of Directors of the Federation, but the total amount of funds allocated to individual education grants each year will not exceed \$500. In order to apply for grant funds, an individual must belong to a currently paid-up Guild member of the Federation at the time the application is submitted.

The individual grant is intended to help augment expenses for conferences, workshops, retreats or other educational opportunities in the fiber arts. The recipient of the Grant must share their new learnings with the other members of the Federation through an article published in the Woven Word and a lecture or workshop in their home Guild.

This presentation must be open to all Federation members, and consideration should be given to provide ways in which any Federation member, regardless of location within Arizona, can access the presentation. Some ways this might be accomplished are through remote participation platforms, such as Zoom. For presentations that are easily and effectively recorded, such as lectures and some types of workshops, recording the event and making it available to Federation members on a private YouTube channel, or other appropriate platform, should be considered.

An individual may apply any year, but receipt of previous grant funds will be taken into account in evaluating applications.

Individuals should use the application form that is available on the Federation website. If there is a technical reason why the form cannot be used (i.e., software incompatibility) an application in an alternative form must address all of the items that are on the official application form.

Applications are due on September 1 of each year for activities to take place during the following calendar year. The Education Committee will review the grant applications and make a recommendation to the entire Board at the fall Board meeting.
