

VALLEY FIBER ARTS GUILD GENERAL MEETING MINUTES JANUARY 17, 2022

Meeting convened 9:34 a.m. via Zoom

The guest speaker for this month was our very own Cindy Wolf who has been a member of Valley Fiber Arts Guild for 11 years. Cindy is an avid weaver who also learned Norwegian crafts at home in Wisconsin. She became intrigued when she saw her first example of Hardanger embroidery, named for the town in which it originated. In the 1980's while a stay--at-home mom she sold the Hardanger pieces she embroidered to earn enough money to buy a microwave!

Hardanger embroidery is made with white thread on white plain weave cotton or linen. It uses counted thread and drawn work in geometric patterns. Cindy showed the essential steps and the basic stitches used in Hardanger in her beautifully illustrated power point presentation. She showed examples of very traditional Hardanger and how it is being modernized by embroiderers today. Her presentation will be uploaded to the website for members who were unable to attend the meeting or those who want another look at this beautiful craft.

After the presentation a 5 minute break was given.

Peggy McGaughey President reconvened the meeting by announcing that in the interest of keeping meetings brief we would no longer have Study Group reports during the meeting. If you are interested in a particular study group the contact information for each is on the website.

The minutes of the November meeting were accepted as written. The Treasurer, April Boysen reported \$9327 on our account.
