I'm writing this as I return from a 5-day whirlwind visit to the Houston International Quilt Festival. This was my first visit to this show and I jumped in with both feet; 2 classes, 3 lectures and thousands of steps viewing quilts and shopping the market. It was simultaneously overwhelming and inspiring. The array of guilts on display ranged from vintage and modern Baltimore Album Quilts, quilts from Guatemala, Japan, France, Australia, Canada and elsewhere. There was a Kaffe Fasset retrospective and a special exhibit from SAQA (Studio Art Quilt Associates). The range of subject matter was all-encompassing - representational depictions of people, pets, wildlife, architecture flowers and foliage to all manner of abstract and geometric designs. The colors were monochromatic to every color on the spectrum.

Strangers became friends even if only for a few moments spent gazing at the same quilt. Festival was attended by tens of thousands of people (that was the best estimate I could get)


There is a powerful force that drives so many of us to create and come together with others who respond to this same drive. The question that intrigues me is the "why". Lately, I have felt the need to find my own voice. I am no longer content to only work on others' designs. I want to find my own voice in my preferred crafts of knitting and quilting and to join my voice in a glorious harmony with other fiber artists. I can't sing but I can sew.

Spotlight on Jere Moskovitz — November 21st Program

As a young girl I learned from my mother and grandmother how to knit and crochet and delighted in turning balls of yarn into something that could pass for clothes. It was some years later that I developed a passion for yarn and design which led to a BFA in Apparel Design from the Rhode Island School of Design and a 20 year career in the Fashion Industry in New York City.

My current direction was inspired by Arline Fisch's seminal book "Textile Techniques in Metal". I taught myself to crochet with wire; then studied knitting with wire under New England Fiber Artists Adrienne Sloane and Joy Raskin. My designs use 4 different wire knitting techniques as well as crochet, macrame, and kumihimo. My jewelry collection includes adjustable or magnetic closure bracelets, earrings and necklaces.

I use non tarnishing copper wire due to its malleability and availability of colors. Mixed media designs incorporate variegated yarns, hand dyed ribbons and glass or resin beads. Beaded embellishments include gemstones, glass beads, raku, and bead weaving techniques.


