During the past month I have attended two quilt shows -The Tucson Quilt Fiesta and the other in Sierra Vista, two fiber art shows at the JCC in Tucson, explored the Sonoran Desert Museum, watched in wonder as butterflies flitted



about the Tucson Botanical Gardens, was delighted by an elephant mom and her child romping at the Reid Park Zoo and watched snow fall on the desert.

During the break of our February meeting a few headed out the door to photograph a moody gray mist hovering about the Santa Rita mountains. I fully expect this scene to appear in



future Show and Shares. Mother nature smacked me upside the head and showed me the powerful inspiration we fiber and other artists can get from her. While at the Reid Park Zoo, I stopped in at a rest room and photographed a ceramic tile of an elephant standing under a palm tree. The ceramic artist was inspired by an elephant and I figure I can

adapt this artist's line drawing to make a perfect design for a rainbow elephant quilt. Entranced by the butterflies at the Botanical Gardens I searched for images on google and found a lovely multicolor butterfly intended as a pattern for cross-stitchers. I simplified the design and reduced the number of color changes so it could be used as an intarsia knitting pattern

My forays to quilt and fiber art shows showed me the cross pollination of ideas between artists as we are all inspired by nature.

And then I'm going to just sit!

Thank you Debbi for such an informative presentation!



During Show and Share, members presented their creations: a dyed table cloth by Lynn Swan; a fabric bowl and slow stitch needle case by Dale Box; twined baskets and a slow stitch design by Debra Brown and felted scarves by Lyndy Runyon. Guests and new members were introduced. The Guild business meeting then followed.
