May 16th Make and Take Fabric Beads

Following VFAG tradition we will once again have a Make and Take hands-on experience for our members. Originally, Gretchen Ramsey was going to lead us but now others from the Clothing Study Group will teach us this wonderful technique to use fabric scrap and create a one of a kind necklace or bracelet. Join us for a fun afternoon of play. You will also learn options for assembling when you finish your full complement of beads.

Supplies to bring: A few fabric scraps to cut circles at least 6" in diameter Printer paper: 2 pieces Ruler or compass for drawing circles on paper Straight pins to hold paper templates to fabric Scissor to cut templates and fabric Sturdy thread: upholstery or quilting thread, any color Hand sewing needles (Size 7 and 8 Sharps are easy to thread) Swizzle stick, chop stick, crochet hook, etc. for poking fabric

VALLEY FIBER ARTS GUILD GENERAL MEETING MINUTES April 18, 2022

The "Stash Sale" meeting took place in the meeting room at Continental Plaza, Green Valley. Members began to arrive at 9:30 to set up displays of their wares and the sale took place from 10-10:30.

The business meeting convened at 10:32 with Vice-President Jol'ene Northrup presiding. The nominating committee presented their slate of candidates which had also been published in the newsletter; President - no candidate Secretary - Martha Fine Membership Co-chairs - Peggy McGaughey and Cindy Wolf

A motion was made to approve the slate and seconded.

The 26 members present voted unanimously to elect the slate as presented. Congratulations to our new officers.

Gretchen Ramsey informed the membership that a webmaster is also needed as Kay Burrows, our previous webmaster, has moved out of the area.

Jol'ene spoke about our need for members to step up and fill the vacant president position, it is critically important for our Guild to have a president to continue to function. While this is a very important position it is not very difficult nor very time-consuming. A job description will be published in the next newsletter that delineates the duties of the officers.

The \$25 annual membership dues for the 2022-2023 year are due by May 31st and the membership form is available on the website.

The March general meeting minutes were unanimously accepted as written.

April Boysen reported \$9034.17 in the Guild's account.

Melanie Fritz reported that the library stash sale raised \$289 and reminded members that the library catalog is online but you must be a member to borrow items.

The Arizona Fiber Guild has started publishing a quarterly newsletter and has a new facebook page. Our newsletter is published on their forum. On Facebook, search for "Arizona Fiber Arts Federation" to join.

Marge Lind told us the customary May "Make and Take" meeting will feature cloth beads. Gretchen modeled a lovely necklace of cloth beads that coordinated perfectly with her outfit.

The May meeting will most likely be held in the same venue as the stash sale. A materials list will be sent out to members.

Marge requests that members give her suggestions for speakers and programs for the future.

The business portion of the meeting adjourned at 10:53am.
