In this segment I want to cover something you'll never hear at church, in the sense of what people usually define as church services in a building. These kinds of gatherings are run by a figurehead, usually called a Pastor or Priest (Bishop etc.). Church is rightly defined as an "assembling" of God's people, and even more specifically, this would be the "congregation of Israel". But the modern church even rejects this Biblical theology by mislabeling engrafted theology as replacement theology. Certainly the term church in the Bible is not a building. Words like tabernacle, temple, and house are what the Bible uses for the place of meeting. Using the word church does not necessarily exclude some kind of building as long as the purpose is for God's people to "assemble" there. However, nowhere in the Bible would you ever have these large buildings like we have today concerning the idea of church. That would be foreign to all the Biblical Patriarchs! By comparison, the tabernacle and the temple were both very small compared to today's buildings. The Tabernacle itself was only 675 SF and Solomon's Temple was about 2,700 SF. This range of 675 SF to 2,700 SF by comparison to today's standards is about the size of Pastor's office (675 sf) and a small to medium sanctuary (2,700 sf). Furthermore, "very few people" were allowed to enter these structures, and the purpose concerning YHWH's commandment for a sanctuary was exclusively for God's lessons and shadows to be taught, along with being the distinct place where His Glory would preside.

So here is how you can know the whole system of "church" is broken, for we normally have a false definition of church, because the proper definition is theatre, and up front we have someone in key position of authority that <u>usually always</u> speaks in defiance of God!

So let's have a little church right now and do a run through on what Your Pastor Lies about! I'll be judging Pastor's doctrine, and you can judge my doctrine. So get out your Bible, since that's the mirror we need to be using to judge our doctrine, and see if it's me or Pastor who is lying. We'll call today's session: You be the Judge! And to be clear we aren't judging each other's souls. We are judging doctrine.

First let's look at a couple verses about doctrine to be clear on why it's important. The first is 2 John 1.9 where John said: "Whoever transgresses and does not abide in the doctrine of Christ does not have God. He who abides in the doctrine of Christ has both the Father and the Son".

That's both simple and heavy, and we want to make note that it is abiding in Christ's doctrine that determines whether Your Pastor has the Father and the Son. This goes for all of us as well, but we also know that James said "My brothers, let not many of you become teachers, knowing that we shall receive a stricter judgment" (James 3.1). After this teaching you're going to want to warn your Pastor to check-self against the mirror, if you love your Pastor?

Let Pastor know that Key Teacher is not Paul. And while I do understand that we all look through a glass darkly and prophesy in part (1 Corinthians 13.9-13), many teachers are looking

through *Satan's Deception Glasses Very Darkly*, rather than the Light the Father and the Son have "already successfully provided". So our first understanding for Judging Pastor's Doctrine begins with which came first (?): Paul of Tarsus or Jesus Christ the Seed of David and the Only Begotten Son of God? Who taught who? Did Jesus repent or Paul? The answers are obvious. Therefore we must look at Paul's teachings through the lens of Jesus Christ's doctrine, rather than looking at Jesus' teaching through the lens of Paul. I'm not suggesting we throw Paul out, but rather change the order of your filters.

Additionally make special note that the Holy Spirit "appears" to be left out of this key verse: 2 John 1.9 where John said: "Whoever transgresses and does not abide in the doctrine of Christ does not have God. He who abides in the doctrine of Christ has both the Father and the Son". Don't you find that strange that the Holy Spirit would be missing in action on such a strong and direct statement? We will find out shortly that the Holy Spirit is in fact "not missing".

So moving forward to seek the answer to our core question: Does Your Pastor Lie on the Scripture, teaching and preaching in the Wrong Spirit? Or does Your Pastor Tell Truth, teaching and preaching by the Word of the Holy Spirit? Let us consider the words of Jesus our Lord first.


Now...Jesus answered them, and said, my doctrine is not mine, but his that sent me. If any man will do his will, he shall know of the doctrine, whether it be of God, or whether I speak of myself (John 7.16-17). So John said you must have Jesus' Doctrine to have both Father and Son, and Jesus said his doctrine was not his own but God's doctrine. Paul agrees with this (Colossians 3.16, Titus 2.10), and so does the writer of Hebrews (Hebrews 6.1-2), and so do all of the Apostles (Acts 2.42). Everyone in the New Testament pointed to Jesus Christ's teaching, and Jesus pointed to the Father's doctrine. It's really very simple. You can't make Paul say something that Jesus did NOT say, and you can't make Jesus say something different than the Father, otherwise you call the Father a liar, and thereby Jesus a liar too.

Let's look at some Jesus Doctrine and go right to the heart of the matter. A "friendly" scribe approached Jesus and asked Jesus "Which is the first commandment of all (Mark 12.28)?


Jesus answered him, "The first of all the commandments is: 'Hear, O Israel, YHWH our Elohim, YHWH is one. 'And you shall love the LORD your God [YHWH Elohim] with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.' This is the first commandment. "And the second, like it, is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' <u>There is no other</u> commandment greater than these" (Mark 12.29-31).

Notice that in the two verses quoted so far, Jesus has twice "directly stated" that someone else besides himself is God. In John's quote he says his Doctrine belongs to God who is not himself, and Mark's verse he quotes Deuteronomy 6 which tells us who God is; that is YHWH Elohim.

Do you believe Jesus is YHWH Elohim too (two), or that Jesus is the God of the Old Testament, or that there are two (or three) YHWH's? If so, then you believe the Doctrine of the Black Arts, wherein they call one of the YHWH's the Evil One, i.e. the Holy Spirit. They say the Serpent in the Garden did us a favor by freeing us from the Evil YHWH's lies; see the Key of Solomon, etc.




James White's Trinitarian Diagram is below. Compare to the magical circle symbols used in the evocation of the seventy-two spirits to the left. It should not be difficult to spot such an arrogant association to witchcraft! You will find White's Enneagram in the middle below in the Intendant of the Building Degree of the Scottish Rite. The Enneagram is 3 triangles overlaid to form the Satanic Trinity. What is James really trying to say with his talisman? Interestingly, by his own image of confession, "inside his triangle", he still has The Father being the Spirit!





You'll find the talisman below referenced in Morals and Dogma in the "Master Mason" section. Note the 1 2 3, the Tau (the phallus) formed by the words Alohayim & Tsabaoth, and the names lahaveh, Adonai, and Agla, the latter being a magic acronym.

"Now this is the commandment, and these are the statutes and judgments which YHWH Elohim has commanded to teach you, that you may observe them in the land which you are crossing over to possess, that you may fear YHWH Elohim, to keep all <u>His</u> statutes and <u>His</u> commandments which <u>I</u> command you, you and your son and your grandson, all the days of your life, and that your days may be prolonged. Therefore hear, O Israel, and be careful to observe it, that it may be well with you, and that you may multiply greatly as YHWH Elohim of your fathers has promised you—'a land flowing with milk and honey' (Exodus 3.8). Hear, O Israel: YHWH Elohim, is <u>one YHWH</u>! "You shall love YHWH Elohim with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength. And these words which I command you today shall be in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up. You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your e.e. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates" (Deuteronomy 6.1-9).

So Jesus answers the scribe by quoting Deuteronomy, which Moses proclaimed as the words that YHWH Elohim spoke.

Jesus also quoted Leviticus 19.18, and one thing I've noticed amongst Christians is they often miss the context of the verses Jesus was quoting. In this case "Loving your neighbor" is filled with the definition from YHWH Elohim. So let's look at it from that perspective rather than the usual perspective Christianity takes on this idea of Loving Your Neighbor in hyper-grace without any judgment whatsoever.

"And you shall not swear by <u>My</u> name falsely, nor shall you profane the name of your Elohim: am YHWH. You shall not cheat your neighbor, nor rob him. The wages of him who is hired shall not remain with you all night until morning. You shall not curse the deaf, nor put a stumbling block before the blind, but shall fear your Elohim: <u>1</u> am YHWH. You shall do no injustice in judgment. You shall not be partial to the poor, nor honor the person of the mighty. <u>In</u> <u>righteousness you shall judge your neighbor</u>. You shall not go about as a talebearer among your people; nor shall you take a stand against the life of your neighbor: <u>1</u> am YHWH. You shall not hate your brother in your heart. <u>You shall surely rebuke your neighbor</u>, and not bear sin <u>because of him</u>. You shall not take vengeance, nor bear any grudge against the children of your people, but **you shall love your neighbor as yourself**: <u>1</u> am YHWH" (Leviticus 19.12-18).

While you're noticing the singular personal pronoun concerning YHWH who says "I AM YHWH", let's also consider what it actually means to Love Your Neighbor. There are a few items here that you'll want to hold up to your Pastor's Doctrine to see if they match. If they don't match the mirror of The Word then Your Pastor Lies! It's simple, and if this makes you mad, that's good. Hopefully it's a righteous anger (Matthew 21.12-17). We're just cleansing our temples today, so whip yourself into shape according to Jesus Christ's Doctrine and don't let the sun go

down on your anger (Ephesians 4.26). No matter what Your Pastor teaches, I can assure you by a holy accounting of the Doctrine of Jesus Christ, the Messiah did in fact uphold YHWH's Laws and commandments and taught that whoever breaks and teaches against even the least of YHWH's commandments would be called the least in heaven (Matthew 5.19).

<u>Mirror Item #1</u>: Judging your neighbor is part of loving your neighbor. Hmmmmm? I can hear someone shouting Matthew 7.1 right now, but go read all of Matthew 7 and quit Scripture Plucking to fit your religion. Jesus Christ was not contradicting the commandments of the One YHWH. The Messiah taught that you need to clean out your own house first so that you are able to judge righteously. Leviticus 19 says "Judge Righteously"!

<u>Mirror Item #2</u>: Not Hating your neighbor is synonymous with rebuking your neighbor for sin. Consider that carefully in light of "ear-tickling" Christianity.

Did you know Leviticus 19.18 is one of the most quoted Scriptures by Jesus and his disciples in the New Testament? And the most quoted verse by far is Psalm 110.1. <u>YHWH said</u> to adoni, "Sit at <u>My</u> right hand, till <u>I</u> make your enemies your footstool. Christians would do well to become very familiar with why the Apostles were so interested in quoting this verse while upholding Christ's Doctrine. It's the key to understanding there is NO Trinity!

Know therefore this day, and consider it in your heart, that YHWH is Elohim in heaven above, and upon the earth beneath: <u>there is none else</u> (Deuteronomy 4.39). Exalt YHWH our Elohim, and worship at <u>his</u> footstool; for <u>he</u> is holy. ... Exalt YHWH our Elohim, and worship at <u>his</u> holy hill; for YHWH Elohim is holy (Psalm 99.5, 9). YHWH is the Holy Spirit.

Ironically, Pastors are always interpreting Jesus' Doctrine through the lens of Paul, while also teaching God is a Trinity of which is a mystery that cannot readily be explained. But of course, Paul held up Jesus' doctrine and would not agree with your Pastor's Lies. Now to Him who is able to establish you according to my gospel and the preaching of Jesus Christ, according to <u>the revelation of the mystery kept secret since the world began **but now made manifest**, and by the prophetic Scriptures <u>made known to all nations</u>, according to the commandment of the <u>everlasting God</u>, for obedience to the faith—to <u>God</u>, alone wise, be glory through Jesus Christ forever (Rom 16.25-27).</u>

In the next segment we'll unravel "The Mystery" so called, and get to the heart of the Trinitarian Idolatry and how it is leading many toward destruction through false spirit building. In the meantime remember this: "He who overcomes shall inherit all things, and <u>i will be his</u> <u>God</u> and he shall be <u>My</u> son. But the cowardly, unbelieving, abominable, murderers, sexually immoral, sorcerers, <u>idolaters</u>, <u>and all liars</u> shall have their part in the lake which burns with fire and brimstone, which is the second death" (Revelation 21.7-8). It's time for Christian Leaders to repent.
