With the help of new and old friends, Emily and James begin to sort out the clues. Together, they unlock the secrets of Mr. Griswold's new game.

I liked that while the book doesn't contain many images when needed to explain a complex cipher, there are visual aids and keys to show you what you need to know. There are three books in the series. Every book offers different plots and adventures and interesting clues and sleuthing.

Also, there are websites that were featured on the book jacket, and I learned that there are places where people can hide their copy of Book Scavenger and post a clue to where it's hidden so others can find it. People are already hiding and finding books all around the world. And I think that's very cool!

So, to sum it up, I really like the book series and I think they're interesting books to read, and they're well-written and engaging, overall, a good read.
