Equinox September 21-22, 2024 Highlights

Ceremony at Pinnacle National Park

On Saturday, September 21, 2024, a significant ceremony took place on the west side of Pinnacle National Park. Special thanks to **Sonya** and **Frank Dorado**, **Arianne, Manny** and **Cameron Garcia**, and **Audrey Alvarado** for preparing the circle on Friday evening to ensure everything was ready for the next morning's start time. The ceremony was attended by 45 individuals, ranging from 6 to 93 years old. Four park rangers were present, many of whom had not experienced a ceremony before.

The ceremony was described as beautiful by Acting Superintendent **Julie Drugatz.** She shared, "Then to find my voice to tell you the story of my walk with the condors through my life and finally their divine intervention to bring me to Pinnacles National Park in celebration and ceremony with Chalon. This is my special story, and I'm glad to know and understand why I was there that great day." Tribal members also expressed that this ceremony was particularly emotional and special for them. The presence of our departed elders, who had been deeply involved in preparing and leading our ceremonies, was felt throughout the day.

During the ceremony, we blessed and delivered handmade regalia to the rangers for the visitor center. The men's and youth regalia, adorned with condor feathers, were officially presented to the rangers in attendance. Last year, we had previously presented a woman's regalia.

On Sunday, September 22, we were invited to attend a mass at Our Lady of Solitude in Soledad, CA. The deacon and priest warmly welcomed all thirteen of us in attendance with a blessing from the congregation. This gesture of "welcome back home" deeply touched many of our tribal members. The deacon arranged for a tour guide for our visit to Mission Soledad, the birthplace of our ancestor, Piu-Uina. Thirty people attended this tour, many visiting the mission for the first time. Cameron Garcia. The conference covered a wide range of topics of interest to the attendees.





Special Cultural Event: Native American Dentalium Necklace Making Workshop

The Chalon Indian Council of Bakersfield sponsored a special event on October 22, 2024, at the Avani Staffing office. **Leann Miranda** shared her expertise and taught a group of 25 eager participants, of all ages, how to make Native American-style necklaces using dentalium shells. These shells, also known as tooth or tusk shells, are a type of seashell from scaphopod mollusks used in indigenous jewelry.

The workshop was a huge success, with all participants leaving with a beautiful necklace of their own. The hands-on experience provided a meaningful connection to our Native American craftsmanship and cultural heritage.

On the 24th of November we were able to provide our citizens with a cultural workshop on the Stave game. This workshop was open to all ages. Staves is a traditional Ohlone game played for many reasons including to settle disagreements, gambling, & playing for fun! Our Sargent at Arms Julian Behill instructed the workshop. We had 25 citizens participate in the workshop. After creation of the sets we played a mini tournament. Special Thanks to Inyana Creations, as they donated sublimation cups, shirts and hats as well as a fishing pole, Flashlight tool kit and a few more items for prizes. We had participants from ages 3yrs to 83yrs old. Everyone was able to make a complete set and now carry the knowledge to share with their family and friends.
