Word of the Day

Woliwon/Wela’lin/Wela’lioq (Wolastoqey / Mi’kmaq)
Meaning: Thank you
Pronunciation: WOH-lee-won

A word commonly used to express gratitude, respect, and appreciation.

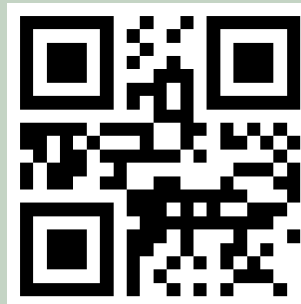
- NBICC is an **Indigenous-led, non-profit post-secondary institution**
