AOB;

PW asked if a store had been found for the gardening equipment. SE said the current stores have been tidied and efforts would be made to find a new shed over the summer. PW questioned the gas store. JB and SE confirmed that although the store needs some tidying it is appropriate for storing gas. There is some equipment from Winterbourne Whitechurch scouts stored in there the future of which will be decided shortly.

PW advised that the Model Railway Club will trim the hedge.

It was noted that thanks need to be advanced to Sharon Jones for her service to the committee up until the last AGM. SE to send thanks.

AD – provided a quote for extending the carpark and distributing the soil onto the grass area behind. The quote was for £1200. This is in addition to the prior quote for either filling existing potholes for £680 or remake the road excluding the carpark at a cost of £2400 all excluding VAT. It was agreed that although this work is required it may well be less urgent that the roof repairs and a decision to be made once cost for roof repair are finalised.

BM to investigate with appropriate contractors the current state of the roof including the cost and extent of required repairs taking into account current roofing materials and access. JB to provide existing quotes.

Note – the fire extinguishers have been checked as required.

PW offered for the Model Railway Club to check the smoke detectors, this was accepted. PW informed the committee that a lock in the gents was missing and offered to get it replaced. This was accepted.

PW noted that a limb for a tree had fallen on the garage. SE to forward information about a possible individual for a tree survey to BM to follow up. BM to check of there are any TPO on any of trees on the Scouts grounds.

PW reminded the committee of the poor state of repair of a number of windows and offered to get three quotes for replacement both for all five damaged windows in one job or as individual replacements. SE to advise on how we would like the windows on the store end of the building after the leaders meeting. To be discussed at the next meeting. PW thanked the committee for the use of the hut for the Model Railway Clubs social on the 7th of August and asked if it was possible for the hall to be available early for set up. This was confirmed.

BM to follow up on getting the boiler serviced, SE to provide contact details.

PW noted that he had bled the radiators over the winter.

After a note on our last audit SE is going to run down the current stock of badges and order as and when required in future so costs can be tacked more efficiently.

Charites commission to be updated with current trustees by AD.

Grants – JB to investigate including a county council grant list mentioned by PW.

Note- one of the two toddler groups fell through the other is in running on a trial basis.

Note- The hall could be better promoted as an available venue around Blandford. Any suggestions or actions welcome.

Note-Gift aid reclaims are in process. No current action.
