

Deuteronomy 11:1 (NKJV) "Therefore you shall love the Lord your God, and keep His charge, His statutes, His judgments, and His commandments always." We choose to love. 

RECIPE CORNER

Cheesecake Tart With Berries

Ingredients

For the crust:

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup pecans
- 3 tablespoons sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon fine salt
- 1 stick cold unsalted butter, cut into 1/2-inch pieces

For the filling:

- 1 2/3 cups whole milk
- 4 large egg yolks
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup cornstarch
- 8 ounces cream cheese, at room temperature, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 2 teaspoons fresh lemon juice
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

For the topping:

- 5 cups mixed fresh berries, such as raspberries and blackberries
- 2 tablespoons sugar

Directions

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F. Make the crust: Pulse the flour, pecans, sugar and salt in a food processor until the pecans are finely ground. Pulse in the butter until the mixture resembles coarse meal. Add 2 tablespoons ice-cold water and pulse until the dough just comes together.

Turn out the dough onto a piece of plastic wrap, form into a disk, wrap and refrigerate until slightly firm, about 15 minutes. Put the dough in a 9-inch tart pan with a removable bottom and press into an even layer over the bottom and up the sides. Freeze until firm, about 10 minutes.

Place the tart pan on a baking sheet. Line the crust with foil and fill with pie weights or dried beans. Bake until the edges of the crust begin turning golden, about 20 minutes. Remove the foil and pie weights and continue baking until the crust is golden brown, 15 to 20 more minutes. Transfer to a rack and let cool completely.

Make the filling: Whisk 1 cup milk, the egg yolks, 1/4 cup sugar and the cornstarch in a medium bowl. Heat the remaining 2/3 cup milk and 1/4 cup sugar in a medium saucepan over medium heat and bring to a simmer. While whisking, slowly pour the hot milk mixture into the egg mixture. Return to the saucepan and cook, whisking constantly, until the mixture starts to bubble and is very thick, about 2 minutes. Remove from the heat, then whisk in the cream cheese, lemon juice and vanilla until smooth. Pour into the cooled crust and refrigerate until set, about 1 1/2 hours.

Make the topping: Toss the berries and sugar in a bowl and let sit at room temperature, 20 minutes. Top the tart with the berries.

involves love. Love is more than what we say and do it is who we are. Jesus was our example of this. Do our actions say we love God?

I John 4:20-21 (NKJV) "If someone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, how can he love God whom he has not seen? And this commandment we have from Him: that he who loves God must love his brother also." It is easy to say we love God, but John is saying our love for God must be seen in how we love others. We can attend church and never miss, know the Word of God, and pray but not love others. Jesus states the world will know we are His disciples by our love for others. Having a relationship with God gives us the ability to love but it is our choice to draw upon the resources of the Holy Spirit to walk in love.

The Holy Spirit gives gifts to use to bless others. They are diverse but one Giver works through the gifts. In I Corinthians 12:4-10 (NKJV) "There are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are differences of ministries, but the same Lord. And there are diversities of activities, but it is the same God who works all in all. But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to each one for the profit of all: for to one is given the word of wisdom through the Spirit, to another the word of knowledge through the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healings by the same Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another discerning of spirits, to another different kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. But one and the same Spirit works all these things, distributing to each one individually as He wills." The Holy Spirit supplies the gift that is needed for each situation. The gifts are given to serve and help others not for personal enrichment or recognition. Sometimes individuals believe these gifts are not for today but we live in the dispensation of the Holy Spirit, the time the Holy Spirit is in operation.

The gifts listed by Paul are the Word of wisdom, the Word of knowledge, the gift of faith, the gift of healing, the working of miracles, prophecy, the discerning of spirits, tongues, and interpretation. Paul gave a list to illustrate the wide variety of gifts from the Holy Spirit, it is not meant to be exhaustive, merely to illustrate the different kinds of spiritual gifts. Just like a plumber carries a tool kit, He does not use all the tools in one particular job but uses the tool needed for that job. The nine spiritual gifts are not based on our whim or what we think is needed but by the Holy Spirit who determines the need.

Everyday Godly Living

They are gifts to be used to help others, to encourage, and build up. Here is a quick overview of the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

We should expect the gifts to operate and realize the importance of using the gifts to help others. Many individuals only think the Holy Spirit is moving in service if there are tongues and interpretation as they do not know how to recognize the other gifts in operation.

Many of the gifts work together. The gifts that reveal something are the Word of Wisdom, the Word of knowledge, and the discerning of spirits. The utterance gifts are tongues, prophecy, and the interpretation of tongues. The power gift of healing, the gift of faith, and the working of miracles.

What does the Word of Wisdom do? It brings the supernatural revelation of the plan and purpose of God. What is the Word of Knowledge? The Word of Knowledge is exactly a word the Holy Spirit gives about something from God for a given time. It can be facts about people, places, or things now, past, or future. What is the discerning of Spirits? It is seeing or hearing into the spirit world. It reveals what kind of spirit is in operation behind a supernatural manifestation. It is not just the discerning of evil spirits but of good and human spirits also.

The gift of faith is a gift of the Spirit to the believer so that he might receive miracles. The working of miracles, on the other hand, is a gift of the Spirit given to the believer that he might work miracles. One gift receives, and the other does something. All the gifts work by faith. The gift of faith is also different from the working of miracles, although both gifts produce miracles. One of them is an active agent and the other is passive. The working of miracles is active; it actively works a miracle. The gift of faith passively receives a miracle. The gift of healing's purpose is to deliver the sick and to destroy the works of the devil in the human body. In the New Testament, we see many instances of the gift of healing. There is a difference between receiving healing by our faith and receiving healing from the gift of healing which happens from one person to another person.

Prophecy is speaking forth for God. Prophecy is to bring edification, exhortation, and comfort. Some people think of prophecy as a prediction. Prophecy is equal to tongues and interpretation. Most frequently the utterance of tongues is manifested in the church. Different kinds of tongues a supernatural utterances by the Holy Spirit in languages never learned by the speaker, nor understood by the speaker, nor necessarily always understood by the hearer. The interpretation of tongues is the supernatural utterance by the Spirit the meaning of an utterance in other tongues. Also, it is not a translation of tongues; it is the interpretation of tongues. It does not operate unless tongues have been in operation.

So we should be open to the Holy Spirit operating in our midst with the different supernatural gifts that help individuals.
