


We can enjoy the Christmas season, giving gifts to family and friends and spending time with others, but let's not get so busy we forget about the greatest gift we have received and all it encompasses. Let us spread love, peace, hope, and joy this Christmas and throughout the year. Give of yourself all the time. Celebrate God's love for us by spreading God's love continually.

Citrus Crinkle Cookies

Ingredients

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1 stick (8 tablespoons) unsalted butter, at room temperature
- 1/2 cup packed light brown sugar
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 large egg
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 tablespoons finely grated citrus zest (lemon, lime or orange) plus 3 tablespoons juice
- 4 to 6 drops yellow, green or orange gel food coloring
- 1/2 cup confectioners' sugar



Directions

Whisk together the flour, baking powder and salt in a medium bowl. Combine the butter, brown sugar and 1/2 cup granulated sugar in the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment. Beat on medium-high speed until light and fluffy, scraping the sides of the bowl as needed, about 2 minutes.

Add the egg and beat until incorporated. Add the vanilla extract, citrus zest, citrus juice and food coloring and beat until incorporated. Decrease the mixer speed to low and add the flour mixture, beating until just combined. Cover the bowl and refrigerate until firm, at least 2 hours and up to overnight.

Put the confectioners' sugar in a small bowl and the remaining 1/2 cup granulated sugar in another small bowl. Scoop tablespoons of the chilled dough and roll into balls. Toss each ball in the granulated sugar first, then in the confectioners' sugar, coating them very generously and thoroughly. Arrange the balls about 1 inch apart on 2 baking sheets (you should have 24 balls). Refrigerate for 20 minutes.

Position the oven racks in the top and bottom thirds of the oven and preheat to 350 degrees F.

Bake until the cookies spread, the tops crack and the edges are firm, 14 to 16 minutes. Let cool on the baking sheets for a few minutes, then transfer the cookies to a wire rack to cool completely. Store in an airtight container at room temperature for up to 3 days.

Prayer is the answer in all situations and conditions. Prayer is for everyone, young or old.

The Lord is near. 6 Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. 7 And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. 8 Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things. 9 Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me or seen in me—put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you.” Do not be anxious or worry about anything but pray. In every situation, as we pray, the peace of God comes to our hearts and minds.

Everyday Godly Living

Pray is vital in our walk as believers. Jesus instructed His disciples to “pray at all times.” We must pray no matter how we find ourselves in a difficult situation or overflowing with blessings. We need to stay in tune with the Lord in fellowship with Him. Prayer is communication with the Lord God. Like all communication in relationships, it can develop into great intimacy or deteriorate. What are we choosing?

It is easy to be distracted by everything in life and not pray. It is easy to become complacent in life and just think we got it. Too often, people who say they are believers and trust the Lord live their lives as if they do not need Him. The Lord wants us to be diligent and faithful in prayer.
