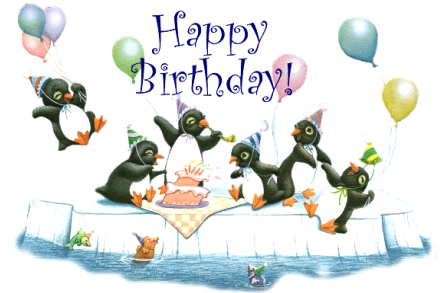

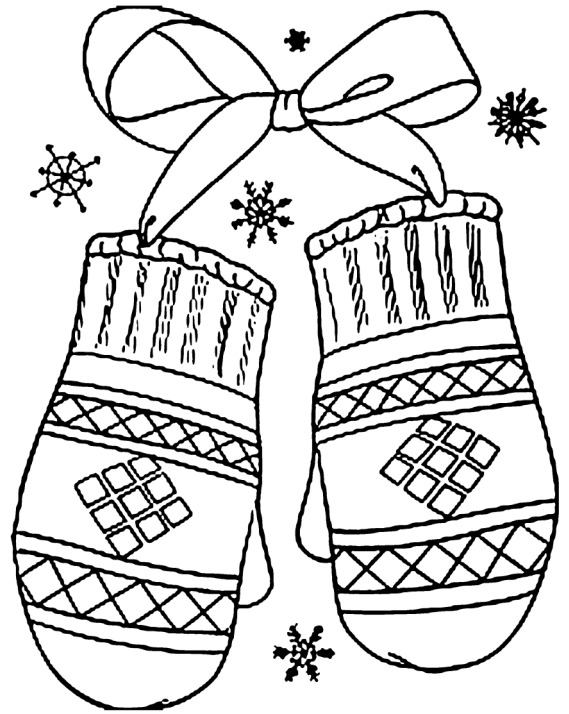

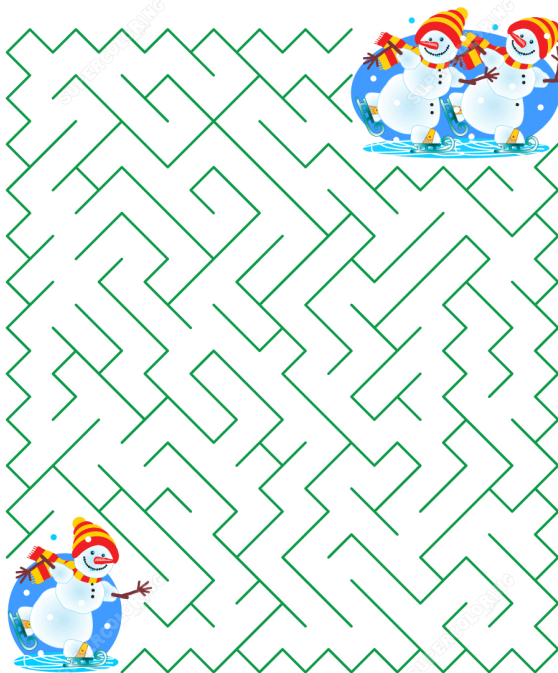

### Chicken and Brussels Sprouts with Apple Cider Sauce

#### Ingredients

- 1 pound Brussels sprouts, trimmed and halved or quartered if large
- 2 sweet apples (such as Gala), cut into wedges
- 1 red onion, cut into wedges (root left intact)
- 2 small sprigs rosemary, plus 1 teaspoon finely chopped leaves
- 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper
- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 4 skinless, boneless chicken breasts (about 8 ounces each)
- 2/3 cup apple cider
- 1 teaspoon apple cider vinegar



#### Directions

Position racks in the upper and lower thirds of the oven; preheat to 450 degrees F. Toss the Brussels sprouts, apples, red onion and rosemary sprigs with the olive oil, 1/2 teaspoon salt and a few grinds of pepper on a baking sheet. Spread in a single layer and roast on the upper oven rack, flipping halfway through, until tender and browned, 25 to 30 minutes.

Meanwhile, heat 1 tablespoon butter in a large ovenproof skillet over medium-high heat. Season the chicken on both sides with salt, pepper and the chopped rosemary. Add the chicken to the skillet and cook until browned on the bottom, about 6 minutes. Flip and cook 2 more minutes, then pour the cider into the skillet around the chicken. Transfer to the lower oven rack and roast until just cooked through, 10 to 12 minutes.

Transfer the chicken to a cutting board to rest and return the skillet to medium-high heat. Simmer until the pan sauce is reduced by half, about 1 minute. Remove from the heat and swirl in the remaining 1 tablespoon butter and the vinegar; season with salt and pepper.

Slice the chicken and divide among plates along with the roasted vegetables and apple. Spoon the sauce over the chicken.

II Tim 3:1-13 (AMP) "BUT UNDERSTAND this, that in the last days will come (set in) perilous times of great stress and trouble [hard to deal with and hard to bear]. 2 For people will be lovers of self and [utterly] self-centered, lovers of money and aroused by an inordinate [greedy] desire for wealth, proud and arrogant and contemptuous boasters. They will be abusive (blasphemous, scoffing), disobedient to parents, ungrateful, unholy and profane. 3 [They will be] without natural [human] affection (callous and inhu-

man), relentless (admitting of no truce or appeasement); [they will be] slanderers (false accusers, troublemakers), intemperate and loose in morals and conduct, uncontrolled and fierce, haters of good. 4 [They will be] treacherous [betrayers], rash, [and] inflated with self-conceit. [They will be] lovers of sensual pleasures and vain amusements more than and rather than lovers of God. 5 For [although] they hold a form of piety (true religion), they deny and reject and are strangers to the power of it [their conduct belies the genuineness of their profession]. Avoid [all] such people [turn away from them]."

Too many people who call themselves believers today want to pick and choose what they want. They feel free to do whatever they want, but with no sense of being obedient to the Word. Those individuals do not want the Lord to tell them what to do through His Word. They do not want the Lord God to mess in their lives, revealing their true character, thoughts, attitudes, behavior or speech.

As believers, we need to ask ourselves are we willing to yield ourselves to the Lord to test our thoughts, attitudes and intentions, not just our outward actions? Our thoughts, attitudes and intentions are known to the Lord but often we do not recognize

our own shortcomings. Only the Lord knows our true character. The Lord sees through all our disguises. The real issues of life proceed out of the heart. The Lord examines hearts. Eventually our heart will be exposed. The Lord God wants true transformation. We need to keep close to the Lord by the Holy Spirit; draw near the God and He will draw near to you. We should be obedient to the Word, following God's standards, ways and principles as we deal with the things happening in our society. We cannot give into the pressures from the world. We need to live according to the Word.

As believers, we cannot be superficial; just attending church, even repeating the right words because that does not work. Their only way to live is to be led by the Holy Spirit, so we empowered to live according to God's standards. We must have an intimate personal relationship with the Lord. We cannot play church. We must continually submit and draw near.
