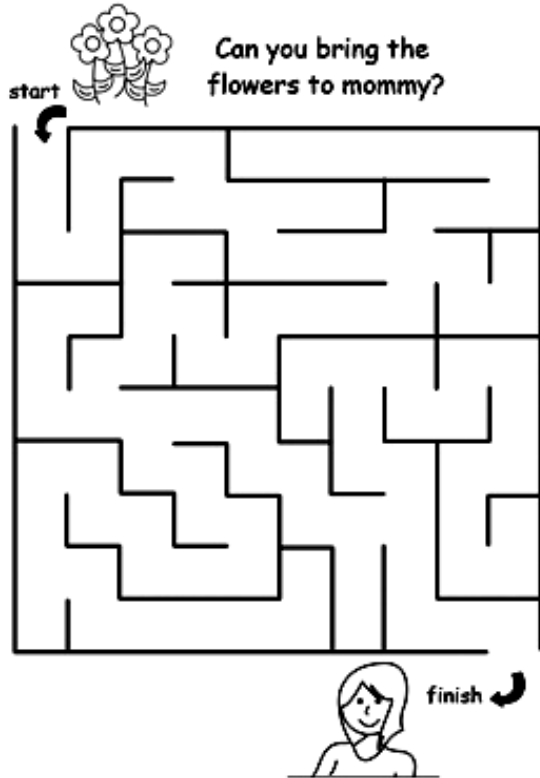

So we must ask ourselves what is influencing and controlling us. Is the devil controlling our lives with the “D’s?” The person that should be influencing and controlling our lives is the power giving Holy Spirit. Acts 1:8 states that you shall receive power (ability, efficiency and might) when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. If we are walking in the Holy Spirit’s power, ability, efficiency and might we will not be walking in any of the “D’s.” The Lord gives us His grace daily His enabling ability. We are not limited in the Lord God Almighty. All things are possible in Him. With the Holy Spirit is our guide, we will do awesome things, more than we possibly image or even think. As we yield to the Holy Spirit’s leading and influence, we will not be below average but Supernatural. We will soar!

Lemon Pudding Cake with Fresh Mixed Berries

Ingredients

- 1 tablespoon unsalted butter
- 2/3 cup superfine sugar, plus more for dusting
- 2 eggs, separated
- 2/3 cup reduced fat buttermilk
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 tablespoon lemon zest
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/4 teaspoon salt

Garnish:

- 1 cup fresh raspberries
- 1 cup fresh blueberries
- 1 cup fresh blackberries
- 2 tablespoons confectioners' sugar



Directions:

Preheat oven to 325 degrees F. Butter and lightly sugar 4 ramekins (about 1-cup size).

In a mixer, add egg yolks, buttermilk, lemon juice and lemon zest and beat until well combined. Reduce the speed to low and sift in flour, sugar and salt. Continue to mix until combined. Beat egg whites until you get stiff peaks then combine the 2 mixtures by gently folding them together, a little at a time. Divide evenly amongst ramekins then bake in a water bath - set ramekins in a roasting tray and fill with water half-way up the sides of the ramekins.

Bake for 45 minutes until the top springs back when gently pressed and the cakes have a nice golden brown color. Allow to cool slightly, then carefully invert onto a plate. Serve with fresh berries and dust with powdered sugar.

Are we allowing the Holy Spirit to transform our heart? We as believers should realize that the Lord God through His Spirit is working in each of our lives for the better. We should always pray for the person and seek understanding from the Holy Spirit. James 1:5 (AMP) "If any of you is deficient in wisdom, let him ask of the giving God [Who gives] to everyone liberally and ungrudgingly, without reproaching or faultfinding, and it will be given him." We need to ask ourselves if what occurred will truly matter five minutes, hours, days, months or years from now. Will it really have an impact on eternity? Perhaps the Lord is trying to teach us

something from the situation and we have something we need to change in us.

I Samuel 16:7 (AMP) "But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not look at his appearance or at his physical stature, because I have refused him. For the Lord does not see as man sees; for man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart." God tells Samuel to go anoint someone as king but then gives this instruction. Only the Lord knows the heart. We too often judge things by outward behavior and speech. We must comprehend that we can't read the intent and secrets of someone's heart and we often do only judge on outward appearance of things.

Matthew 7:3-5 (AMP) "Why do you stare from without at the very small particle that is in your brother's eye but do not become aware of and consider the beam of timber that is in your own eye? Or how can you say to your brother, Let me get the tiny particle out of your eye, when there is the beam of timber in your own eye? You hypocrite first get the beam of timber out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the tiny particle out of your brother's eye." Jesus shows how we are generally far more tolerant to our own sin than we are to

the sin of others. Often times we are blind to our own shortcomings or faults. Jesus calls people hypocrites who fuss about small things in others, and do not pay attention to or ignore the great matters in their own personal life. Remember King David's reaction to Nathan's story about a man unjustly stole and killed another man's lamb and David quickly condemned the man, but was blind to his own sin in II Samuel 12.

John 13:34-35 (AMP) "I give you a new commandment: that you should love one another. Just as I have loved you, so you too should love one another. By this shall all [men] know that you are My disciples, if you love one another [if you keep on showing love among yourselves]." The question should be when someone is not acting the way we think they should how I can respond in love, build them up instead of judging.
