Matthew 22:37-39 (AMP) "And He replied to him, You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind (intellect). This is the great (most important, principal) and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as [you do] yourself. 



RECIPE CORNER

Lemon Pudding Cake with Fresh Mixed Berries

Ingredients

- 1 tablespoon unsalted butter
- 2/3 cup superfine sugar, plus more for dusting
- 2 eggs, separated
- 2/3 cup reduced fat buttermilk
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 tablespoon lemon zest
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/4 teaspoon salt

Garnish:

- 1 cup fresh raspberries
- 1 cup fresh blueberries
- 1 cup fresh blackberries
- 2 tablespoons confectioners' sugar

Directions

Preheat oven to 325 degrees F. Butter and lightly sugar 4 ramekins (about 1-cup size).

In a mixer, add egg yolks, buttermilk, lemon juice and lemon zest and beat until well combined. Reduce the speed to low and sift in flour, sugar and salt. Continue to mix until combined. Beat egg whites until you get stiff peaks then combine the 2 mixtures by gently folding them together, a little at a time. Divide evenly amongst ramekins then bake in a water bath - set ramekins in a roasting tray and fill with water halfway up the sides of the ramekins.

Bake for 45 minutes until the top springs back when gently pressed and the cakes have a nice golden brown color. Allow to cool slightly, then carefully invert onto a plate. Serve with fresh berries and dust with powdered sugar.

We usually only want to love those who love us in return, but Jesus tells us something different; we are to love even those we believe to be our enemies. When we are offended or hurt, and we do not forgive, we are refusing to love others. Matthew 5:44 (NKJV) "But I say to you, love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you," We should actively seek the wellbeing of others, regardless of the hurt and mistreatment they seek to inflict upon us. Only with the help of the Holy Spirit can we do this. We must continually rely upon Him. When we walk in the Spirit, we will not carry out the desires of the flesh. Jesus is telling us we need to have unconditional love. It is not based on reciprocity. We are not to love like the world loves but love like God loves without limit. Love is a decision it is not based on feelings. In John we are told by Jesus to love in a particular way; to love as He loved. How did He love? He took the initiative to love first. He laid down His life for others, sacrificial love. We decide that we will walk in love with the help of the Holy Spirit.



Nuggets of Treasure

Jesus tells in Mark 11:22, "Have faith in God." Exactly what is faith? It is trust, belief, confidence, reliance, certainty or assurance. An acronym for "faith" forsake or forget all I trust Him.

F=Forsake or forget

What do we forsake or forget? What we perceive or see, the circumstances or situations. Forsake how we think we are going to solve it ourselves, and instead rely on Him. Forsake what we believe is impossible or insurmountable. Forget our timeline and trust Him to know how and when. We need to forsake worry and anxiety and trust the Lord. We forsake moaning and complaining about things and instead be assured that He is in control. Trust Him, that all things are possible with Him. We trust Him because we are assured of His ability, and love, and He is all-knowing. He tells us He will never leave or forsake us. We forsake what we are uncertain of and trust Him, we trust Him with our families, with our finances, jobs, and health. Psalm 56:3 (AMP) "What time I am afraid. I will have confidence in and put my trust and reliance in You."

Everyday Godly Living

Life in general involves some form of trust or faith. For example, we go to a doctor whose degrees you have never verified, who states what he believes is wrong with us. He gives us a prescription we cannot read. We take it to a pharmacist we have never seen before. He gives us a compound we do not understand. Then we go home and take the pill according to the instructions on the bottle. We sit in chairs trusting they will hold us up. We fly in an airplane, and we do not know who actually built it or put it together. Someone services it that we do not know. Someone flies it that we do not know. We purchase an automobile, and we do not know the person who designed or built it. We get in and drive it. We purchase food at the grocery store not knowing who grew it or how they grew it, or where it was boxed, butchered, etc. All in trusting, sincere faith!

The Word of God is full of promises that we can look to and trust. The question is do we have confidence in God and His Word? We please Him by having continual confidence in Him. Faith is taking God at His word.

When we received Jesus as our Lord and Savior, we trusted Him. So as a believer, faith in Him is involved in our continual walk with Him our entire life. Reliance on ourselves can cause bigger situations to deal with. Continual trusting, and relying on the Lord we are not trying to cope with things on our own; instead, we are going to Him the greater source. So, we go to Him in prayer and leave all matters in His hands. Peace comes as we continually trust the Lord in each situation of life. Trusting the Lord is the stabilizing force in our lives. Isaiah 26:3-4 (NKJV) "You will keep him in perfect peace, Whose mind is stayed on You, Because he trusts in You. Trust in the Lord forever. For in Yah, the Lord, is everlasting strength." We should have a fixed stance or mindset that we will trust the Lord. Psalm 68:2 (AMP) "Trust in, lean on, rely on, and have confidence in Him at all times, you people; pour out your hearts before Him. God is a refuge for us (a fortress and a high tower). Selah [pause, and calmly think of that]!" We must trust, rely on, and have confidence in Him at all times.
