DACA (Deferred Action for Child Arrivals) Immigrants and their Supporters **Must Push Harder For Immigration Reform**

thorization who crossed the border with parents or other adults as youth find themselves in a continuing struggle to end a cycle of desperation. DACA "Dreamers" as they have become known to us are or-

dinary American youth that have grown up speaking

English, adopting By Dr. José A. Flores American customs

and values while living in a state of limbo due their legal status. During my many years of teaching, I have met many of these students and their parents. Most of the children aspired to complete high school and go on to earn college degrees. A few aspired of owning their own businesses and some dreamed of joining our armed forces. In Grand Rapids Public Schools, we had many enrolled in our J.R.O.T.C Program which prepares students for entry into the military officer corps.

Many of my former students applied for DACA status when former Pres-

ident Barack Obama through executive order created the Deferred Action for Child Arrivals. The stay on deportation action against nearly two million children was under constant attack by right wing white nationalists in the Republican party and by for President Trump who prefer to deport them all. Many legal challenges have been made by conservative lawmakers and groups who want more deportations and stricter border enforcement.

A devastating blow was struck against this group late last month through a legal ruling in a Texas courtroom. Prior to this decision DACA has provided temporary protection from deportation and work authorization to over 800,000 undocumented people who were brought to the U.S. as children. In his ruling, Judge Andrew Hanen, who was appointed by former President George W. Bush, said the program exceeded President Obama's authority when he created DACA through executive action in 2012. The ruling effectively put a halt to any new applications for DACA status and requires re-application for eligibility for all applicants. The application process and fees are costly. In most cases they require a lawyer prepare the documents and a fee of \$495 dollars along with enrolling in college. Many of the first-time applicants, an estimated 800,000 may not have trusted the government or had other obstacles that prevented them from previously applying including the cost of application preparation and fees. President Biden vowed his Justice Department will appeal the ruling.

Meanwhile, Immigrants and their supporters continue to push forward for the approval of The Dream and Promise Act. In West Michigan there are several groups advocating for immigration status "clemency" for these children, now adults facing potential deportations. One group in Holland has initiated advocacy efforts including training for community to engage in voter mobilization on the issue. I spoke with LIBRE's President, Daniel Garza about what Michigan supporters need to do to help move the U.S. Senate to approve the Dream and Promise Acts that were approved in the House of Representatives in March. Mr. Garza emphasized that a bipartisan approach is needed to accomplish immigration reform and that regardless of what party you belong to, it is important to work together for the common good. "Americans are tired of single party solutions," said Garza who believes there is a good chance that Republicans and Democrats working together can get the Dream and Promise Acts passed in some form. He encourages Hispanic/Latinos/LatinX and supporters to work harder to influence our Senators and House Representatives to be more vocal on the topic in Washington and complimented the great

Children brought to the United States without legal au- work and unity he sees among national Hispanic and other immigrant advocacy groups. "The polls show that 3 out of 5 Americans support legal status for dreamers," said Daniel Garza. He went on to say "Congress representatives Tony Gonzalez and Henry Cuellar are working together in a bipartisan way and have suggested supporting the S. 1358 The Border Solutions Act of 2021 which proposes creating

> regional processing centers, hiring more magistrates to hear asylum petitions and

greater border security.

Los niños traídos a los Estados Unidos sin autorización legal que cruzaron la frontera con sus padres u otros adultos cuando eran jóvenes se encuentran en una lucha continua para poner fin a un ciclo de desesperación. Los "Dreamers" de DACA, como los conocemos, son jóvenes


estadounidenses comunes que han crecido hablando inglés, adoptando costumbres y valores estadounidenses mientras viven en un estado de limbo debido a su estatus legal. Durante mis muchos años de enseñanza, he conocido a muchos de estos estudiantes y a sus padres. La mayoría de los niños aspiraban a terminar la escuela secundaria y obtener títulos universitarios. Algunos aspiraban a tener sus propios negocios y algunos soñaban con unirse a nuestras fuerzas armadas. En las Escuelas Públicas de Grand Rapids, muchos se inscribieron en nuestro programa J.R.O.T.C, que prepara a los estudiantes para ingresar al cuerpo de oficiales militares.

Muchos de mis exalumnos solicitaron el estatus de DACA cuando el expresidente Barack Obama mediante una orden ejecutiva creó la Acción Diferida para los Niños Llegados. La suspensión de la acción de deportación contra casi dos millones de niños fue objeto de ataques constantes por parte de los nacionalistas blancos y derechistas del Partido Republicano y de los seguidores del presidente Trump, que prefiere deportarlos a todos. Legisladores y grupos conservadores han presentado muchas impugnaciones legales que quieren más deportaciones y una aplicación fronteriza más estricta.

El grupo de inmigrantes bajo las protecciones de DACA recibió un golpe devastador a fines del mes pasado a través de un fallo legal en un tribunal de Texas. Antes de esta decisión, DACA ha brindado protección temporal contra la deportación y autorización de trabajo a más de 800,000 personas indocumentadas que fueron traídas a los EE. UU. Cuando eran niños. En su fallo, el juez Andrew Hanen, quien fue designado por el expresidente George W. Bush, dijo que el programa excedía la autoridad del presidente Obama cuando creó DACA a través de una acción ejecutiva en 2012. El fallo efectivamente detuvo cualquier nueva solicitud para el estatus de DACA y requiere una nueva solicitud de elegibilidad para todos los solicitantes. El proceso de solicitud y las tarifas son costosos. En la mayoría de los casos, requieren que un abogado prepare los documentos y una tarifa de \$ 495 dólares junto con la inscripción en la universidad. Muchos de los solicitantes por primera vez, un estimado de 800,000 pueden no haber confiado en el gobierno o tener otros obstáculos que les impidieron presentar una solicitud anteriormente, incluido el costo de preparación de la solicitud y las tarifas. El presidente Biden prometió que su Departamento de Justicia apelará el fallo.

Bill Cosby's Conviction Overturned How This Victory Reconfirms What Black Supporters Initially Knew

When the black communities all over the world heard that the iconic and lovable Hollywood television father, Bill Cosby, was convicted of multiple sexual assault cases in 2018, there was a lot of shock and disbelief. This case was a very high profile case in the height of the Me Too Movement, as they publicly supported all of the sup-

posed victims, yet they weren't so high profile with the case of Daniel Holtzclaw sexually assaulting 13 black women - all of which were proven to be true. In 2016 there were 60 supposed victims coming forth all at the same time alleging that they were victimized by Cosby. People are always at different stages in their lives and the simultsneous rise of power among all of the alleged victims, painted a very sketchy picture for the public. Sexual assault is a very serious and sensitive matter, but even in legitimate cases, victims may lose credibility when the time of the harm and reporting reaches and exceeds a decade.

The alleged victims' public accusations weren't the only coincidence in the matter of Bill Cosby. In 1992, it was reported that Bill Cosby was in the process of buying the well-known television network, NBC, from its owner, General Electric Company. There were rumors that the deal wasn't real, but Cosby had discussed with his attorney, Herbert H. Chaice, about numbers and his interest in buying the network. The public was also aware of the constant decline of the network, which is why the consideration of selling wasn't beyond belief to citizens outside of the deal. Matters of this deal were present up until 2015 and then sexual allegations from multiple victims began in 2016. It is believed that someone with social influence had a problem with Cosby's attempt to prosper.

Let's discuss the alleged victims for a bit. A false victim, former model, Janice Dickinson, admitted to falsifying her sexual assault perpetuated by Bill Cosby in her memoir. The only reason that she later cut



the passages from her book, was due to the fact that her publisher, Judith Reagan, warned that it could ruin her career if not corrected, but not out of moral fortitude. Furthermore, there was never any DNA evidence found from any of the alleged victims. Everything was found to be hearsay, which is inadmissible in court, yet it was allowed to fulfill the plan of convicting Cosby. Another victim admitted to visiting Cosby nineteen times after alleging that he assaulted her. Then a

black model in the early 2000s or late 1990s admitted that she was offered \$5,000 - \$10,000 to lie on Bill Cosby, which again, drives the point that someone during the initial interest that Cosby had to buy the NBC, was being sabotaged. Then, one of the more unethical tactics against Cosby, was when alleged victim, Andrea Constand, decided to pursue her claim against him, even though it was legally agreed that she and her attorneys wouldn't pursue the matter, yet Cosby was still convicted in 2018.

It is behaviors of the justice system, the alleged victims and angst from the public against Bill Cosby, that make his supporters wonder if there is a hidden agenda that's been set into motion. Though no one can be certain about the behind-the-scenes activities of people, there was a clear attempt to defame and slander Bill Cosby's character and ruin him in all aspects of his life. Prosecutors violated the law by prosecuting Cosby, though it was agreed upon that there was supposed to be no prosecution. Due to Cosby's character of not falling for the sneaky attempt to have him take classes for a sexual assaulter, his fight for justice may continue, even as he enjoys his freedom. Black supporters of Bill Cosby need to continue to stand together like other communities and notice the agendas being pushed by mainstream media, along with members of their community to act as allies of those against us. © 2021 Written by Kindra A. News Noticias MDHHS gains federal approval to continue additional emergency food assistance benefits for 1.25 million people

LANSING, Mich. - All Michigan families who are eligible for food assistance benefits are received an additional monthly payment in

July in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Gov. Gretchen Whitmer and the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) announced that more than 1.25 million people in close to 700,000 Michigan households will benefit under approval from the U.S. Department of Agriculture Food and Nutrition Services.

All households eligible for SNAP receive an increase of at least \$95 monthly, even if they are already receiving the maximum payment or are close to that amount. Households that received over \$95 to bring them to the maximum payment for their group size will continue to receive that larger amount.

Eligible families do not need to re-apply to receive the additional benefits. People who receive food assistance can check their benefits balance on their Michigan Bridge Card by going online to www.michigan.gov/MIBridges or calling a consumer service representative toll-free at 888-678-8914. They can ask questions about the additional benefits by calling or emailing their caseworker.

están recibiendo el pago máximo o están cerca de esa cantidad. Los hogares que recibieron más de \$ 95 para llevarlos al pago máximo por el tamaño de su grupo continuarán recibiendo esa cantidad mayor.

Las familias elegibles no necesitan volver a presentar una solicitud para recibir los beneficios adicionales. Las personas que reciben asistencia alimentaria pueden consultar el saldo de sus beneficios en su Michigan Bridge Card en línea en www.michigan.gov/Ml-Bridges o llamando gratis a un representante de servicio al consumidor al 888-678-8914. Pueden hacer preguntas sobre los beneficios adicionales llamando o enviando un correo electrónico a su asistente social.

Republican lawmakers in Michigan recently approved a law that stripped emergency powers from Gov. Gretchen Whitmer seriously limiting her actions to declare emergency responses to illness and disasters beyond 28 davs.

The move to strip powers from Whitmer comes as state health officials report a doubling of the Covid-19 case count in the last two weeks of July fueled by the Indian Delta variant.

The GOP-led House voted 60-48 to repeal the 1945 law, with four Democrats joining all Republicans in support.

It gave governors broad powers to declare an emergency and promulgate rules to 'protect life and property or to bring the emergency situation within the affected area under control.'

She has defended the rules as necessary to save lives in a state with more than 21,000 confirmed or probable deaths linked to the virus.

Cases have gone up in all but one state over the past several weeks, which health officials nationally have attributed to the fast-spreading delta variant of the coronavirus.

Michigan's infection average, 332, in late July doubled in a two-week period. The nation likewise has experienced rapid growth in the number of Covid and Delta Variant cases in every state as many refuse to wear masks and/or get vaccinated causing other Governors to consider reinstituting mask mandates and restrictions.

Meanwhile Michigan students are scheduled to return to school in late August and early September. Many school districts guided by the CDC and local Health Departments have wrestled with the issue of requiring children and staff to continue wearing masks as the threat of Covid 19 and the Delta Variant renew their surges across Michigan and the nation. Politics seem to have entered the arena of health and common sense with new initiatives being proposed to curb the power of government to

save lives. Alabama Governor Kay Ivey had harsher words, directly blaming Americans who have refused to get vaccinated against coronavirus for rising COVID case rates.

'Folks are supposed to have common sense. But it's time to start blaming the unvaccinated folks, not the regular folks. It's the unvaccinated folks that are letting us down,' Ivey, a Republican, told reporters.

> La medida para quitarle los poderes a Whitmer se produce cuando los funcionarios de salud estatales informan que se duplicó el recuento de casos de Covid-19 en las últimas dos semanas de iulio impulsado por la variante Indian Delta.

Los casos han aumentado en todos los estados menos uno en las últimas semanas, lo que los funcionarios de salud a nivel nacional han atribuido a la variante delta de rápida propagación del coronavirus.

Mientras tanto, está previsto que los estudiantes de Michigan regresen a la escuela a finales de agosto y principios de septiembre. Muchos distritos escolares guiados por los CDC y los Departamentos de Salud locales han luchado con el problema de exigir que los niños y el personal continúen usando máscaras a medida que la amenaza de Covid 19 y la Variante Delta renuevan sus oleadas en Michigan y la nación. La política parece haber entrado en la arena de la salud y el sentido común con nuevas iniciativas que se proponen para frenar el poder del gobierno para salvar vidas. La gobernadora de Alabama, Kay Ivey, tuvo palabras más duras, culpando directamente a los estadounidenses que se han negado a vacunarse contra el coronavirus por el aumento de las tasas de casos de COVID.

Mientras tanto, los inmigrantes y quienes los apoyan continúan impulsando la aprobación de la Ley de Sueños y Promesas. 



The state of Texas has been declared a crime scene by historians with regards to the rewriting of its origins. Unlike the myth, they've drawn a real line in the sand. The so-called heroes of The Alamo were symbols of white suprem-

By Jorge Martinez life in Texas. I grew

up listening to tales of bravery by national heroes who turned out to be scoundrels of their era. After 180 years of the 1836 Battle of the Alamo and the alleged 13 days of glory, it turns out the heroes were ordinary slave traders, land thieves, racist syphilitic philanderers and foolhardy self-promoters. The authors risked their lives by publishing Forget the Alamo, 2021, the rise and fall of an American Myth, by Bryan Burrough, Chris Tomlinson and Jason Stanford.

As indebted as we are, we must not overlook a groundbreaking, grass roots book published by Don Jesus M. Ramirez, a student of Carlos Castaneda in 2012. He writes in an alarmingly truthful, poetic style and describes life at Tuloso-Midway High School in Corpus Christi Texas, a typical white majority school. We should stand and cheer for an unsponsored Latino who overcame tremendous obstacles to publish his work. Don Jesus M. Ramirez is a direct descendant of Pancho Villa's dreams of a better life. He reflects the grit necessary to stand up to tyranny during the Vietnam War wherein America claimed to fight for democracy while denying it to Mexican American citizens at home in the U.S.A. His grandfather is a documented, certified and verified hero of the Mexican Revolution and served as an officer in the famous Division del Norte. It is essential that Tejanos recognize they have been systemically robbed of their heritage via deliberate efforts to whitewash history as the book "Forget the Alamo" illustrates. In the whitewashed version, good white Christian immigrants mostly from the south came to Texas seeking freedom and cheap land. White mythmakers forgot to report to receive land, immigrants were required to take an oath of allegiance to Mexico, learn the language, adopt the Catholic religion, surrender allegiance to other countries and become Mexican citizens. Most importantly they were to free their slaves, which was why southerners sought cheap land. Of course, the land grabbers escaping tyranny and lower-class status agreed to all requirements, until they received the land.

Upon observing how little supervision the Mexican Government imposed, they elected to rebel and President Van Buren agreed to grant them statehood, if they won their freedom. Texan mythmakers forget to mention that thousands of native Tejanos fought alongside slave master Sam Houston throughout the war. Another secret is that the hero of Texas, Stephan F. Austin was pro slavery as were those fighting within the Alamo. The socalled fight for Texas independence was sparked by greedy land hungry slave masters, not honest good Christian freedom lovers. Also omitted are the hundreds of unarmed Mexican soldiers butchered at the battle of San Jacinto in revenge for the Alamo.

Unashamedly, Texas was the last to free it's slaves in Galveston in June 1886 and holds the record for the highest amount of lynchings in the country. All Americans should regrettably rec-

ognize most of the white population does not want justice, they want control and power. Never forget forcible sterilizations, lynchings, illegal imprisonments, massacres, murders, while law men, and legal injustice

made possible by Texas legislators as they are doing today suppressing voting rights. We must understand our children's future is at stake and vote. It is an undeniable truth: we cannot rely on our white bias justice system to offer justice to those they view as inferior. Along with having to endure endless verbal assaults by badly misinformed white students, the author rejected brainwashing re-

peated ad-nauseam by racist teachers and

Hollywood bigoted fools like John Wayne. The author translated Mexican books, letters and documents challenging Texan myths drawing his own line in the sand. As a Tejano confronted by white supremacy daily, I find the book an inspirational guide for freedom. Don Jesus M. Ramirez's book "Escape from Texas", can be ordered from Amazon.com. The book was recognized by the Toltec Institute in 2013. Its author continues to work towards iustice.





The Crucial Impact of COVID Vaccines

The U.S. launched its COVID-19 vaccination quest on December 14, 2020, when a critical care nurse at Long Island Jewish Hospital in New York received the first COVID-19 vaccine outside of clinical trials. Since

then, it's been a race to vaccinate as many Americans as possible.

Early on, each state applied its own procedures to administer vaccines, using guidelines from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention that prioritized groups based on risk levels. This is because vaccine production was not yet at full strength, and systems were still being created to be able to administer the shots to the mass public.

Since the spring, however, the vaccine program has greatly expanded through federal and state efforts, and both public and private partnerships. The COVID-19 vaccine is now being administered in retail pharmacies, public clinics, doctors' offices, hospital outpatient sites, nursing homes and more.

HOW MANY PEOPLE HAVE BEEN VACCINATED?

The U.S. has made significant progress in the vaccine effort. By July 12, more than 159 million people, or nearly 56% of the eligible population, had been fully vaccinated. At the same time in Michigan, more than 4.4 million residents, or 52% of the eligible population, had been fully vaccinated.

All Michiganders age 12 and up are eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine, as of May 12. And all adults in all U.S. states, Washington D.C. and Puerto Rico are eligible for a COVID-19 vaccine, as of April 19.

However, despite this significant progress, the threshold needed to reach herd immunity has still not yet been met.

WHAT IS HERD IMMUNITY?

Herd immunity happens when a large enough portion of a population becomes resistant to a highly contagious disease, such as the coronavirus,

and therefore provides indirect protection to people who are not resistant. Resistance typically occurs through immunization.

Estados Unidos lanzó su búsqueda de vacunación COVID-19 el 14 de diciembre de 2020, cuando una enfermera de cuidados intensivos del Long Island Jewish Hospital en Nueva York recibió la primera vacuna COVID-19 fuera de los ensayos clínicos. Desde entonces, ha sido una carrera para vacunar a tantos estadounidenses como sea posible.

Al principio, cada estado aplicó sus propios procedimientos para administrar vacunas, utilizando las pautas de los Centros para el Control y la Prevención de Enfermedades de EE. UU. Que priorizaban los grupos según los niveles de riesgo. Esto se debe a que la producción de vacunas aún no estaba en plena potencia y aún se estaban creando sistemas para poder administrar las inyecciones al público masivo.

Sin embargo, desde la primavera, el programa de vacunas se ha expandido enormemente a través de esfuerzos federales y estatales, y asociaciones públicas y privadas. La vacuna COVID-19 ahora se está administrando en farmacias minoristas, clínicas públicas, consultorios médicos, hospitales ambulatorios, hogares de ancianos y más.

Estados Unidos ha logrado un progreso significativo en el esfuerzo de la vacuna. Para el 12 de julio, más de 159 millones de personas, o casi el 56% de la población elegible, habían sido completamente vacunadas. Al mismo tiempo, en Michigan, más de 4,4 millones de residentes, o el 52% de la población elegible, se habían vacunado por completo.

Todos los habitantes de Michigan de 12 años en adelante son elegibles para recibir la vacuna COVID-19, a partir del 12 de mayo. Y todos los adultos en todos los estados de EE. UU., Washington D.C. y Puerto Rico son elegibles para recibir la vacuna COVID-19 a partir del 19 de abril.

For example, if 10 people are seated around the dinner table, eating and talking, and nine of them have been vaccinated, the non-vaccinated person wouldn't get infected because the other nine are immune and therefore, unable to transmit the virus.

WHEN WILL WE REACH HERD IM-MUNITY AGAINST COVID-19?

Unfortunately, there is no magic number or arbitrary percentage that indicates herd immunity has been achieved. But medical and public health experts agree, the higher the percentage of people immunized, the greater the benefit.

Michigan has set a goal of having 70% of the eligible population vaccinated by the end of 2021. There is enough capacity and vaccines available to reach this goal even earlier, but only if enough people take advantage of the opportunity to receive the vaccines.

In the most general terms, a strong indication of increasing herd immunity would be declining infection rates that remain low over a sustained period. Until then, it's important to keep following precautionary measures to limit the spread of COVID-19 and for people to remain vigilant regardless of their vaccination status.

Individuals should continue to follow the basic public health guidelines, such as thorough handwashing, staying home if sick and, if unvaccinated, so-

cial distancing and wearing face masks in public settings. Most importantly, get the COVID-19 vaccine.
