English Learner Teacher Helps Vista Achieve Award-winning Growth

In helping students grasp the English language, Alyssa Claucherty has given them an educational building block that will help them conversationally and academically.

Claucherty, who is in her third year as an English Learner teacher for first and second graders, is part of a staff that earned <u>Vista Charter</u> <u>Academy</u> the title of a "<u>Building the Hope</u>" school that can provide strategies to be leveraged for educational recovery. Vista made the list because its English learners demonstrated growth above the state average in English and math for three consecutive years.

Claucherty said some students come to Vista speaking no English and are qualified as newcomers. Most come in knowing social English in some capacity but are lacking in academic English. The support she and fellow EL teacher Emily Zamudio provide has helped some Vista students test out at a high enough level where they don't need to keep taking the same English language test every year to prove their proficiency.

"I work with the kids in many different settings, and I love when I see my students confidently using English in a way they had struggled with before, for example talking with a friend or comprehending a story," said Claucherty, who first taught English to Hungarian students in Budapest before coming to Vista.

In providing support in a specialized setting, teachers "push in" by working with students in the general classroom, or "pull out" a small group of students to work in a separate location. While "pulling out," students go over sentence stems exercises in which a phrase or word is missing.

"We'll work connecting to the classroom curriculum, but we'll have more in an intense small group session where we can add in all those language supports, too, so that they're still getting the same curriculum, but they have those supports needed to be able to comprehend and understand it. And then also use speaking and writing along with it, too," she said

Small-group instruction helps bridge the gap in academic language for some long-term EL students, which includes those who have lived in the U.S. their entire lives but grew up with parents who spoke Spanish, or

those who learned English from a sibling. Those students usually are able to hold conversations but need more support with reading and writing.

"There's a big cultural gap that we have to try to bridge with them coming from a different country," Claucherty said. "They're often able to learn social English pretty quickly from their peers, especially if they're younger. They pick it up really quickly, but the academic language is usually what takes a lot longer to for them to develop.

"The first couple days, they're not really sure, they're kind of following my lead. But after a couple of days it starts to click and they are able to answer deeper questions about this topic or they're able to apply it to different parts of their lives. That's been really exciting."

Vista Charter Academy outperformed the local district, Grand Rapids Public Schools, the past 13 years with a curriculum built on a character-based approach to learning through Moral Focus virtues that develop the whole child. With children in post-pandemic learning, Claucherty

has had to backtrack to make sure their English



skills are where they were three years ago. Some kids missed half of their kindergarten year or their whole first grade year, and some newcomers weren't exposed to English for months.

"Coming back, we've seen growth over the past couple years, but there's been bigger achievement gaps than there were before just because of all the learning loss," she said. "We're working through it and each year we kind of bridge the gap a little bit more."

In taking ownership for the success of their students with their detailed approach, Claucherty and the Vista staff have ensured the school is the best choice for parents and students.

"The staff is really supportive of each other. People come together to help out whenever it is needed, no questions asked," she said. "I love that. The real reason I love my staff and I love the school is because of the kids, because of the relationships I've been able to build."

Keep up the excellent work, Ms. Claucherty!

Vista Charter Academy superó al distrito local, las Escuelas Públicas de Grand Rapids, en los últimos 13 años con un plan de estudios basado en un enfoque de aprendizaje basado en el carácter a través de las virtudes del Enfoque Moral que desarrollan al niño en su totalidad. Con los niños en el aprendizaje posterior a la pandemia, Claucherty ha tenido que retroceder para asegurarse de que sus habilidades en inglés estén donde estaban hace tres años. Algunos niños se perdieron la mitad de su año de jardín de infantes o todo el año de primer grado, y algunos recién llegados no estuvieron expuestos al inglés durante meses.

National report: GVSU is third highest producer of Latino graduates in state

Grand Valley State University is the third highest producer of Latino graduates in Michigan, according to a new report by Excelencia in Education.

The Washington, D.C.-based organization also reported Grand Valley ranks fifth in Michigan in enrolling Latino students. The report, Latino College Completion: United States 2023, provides national data on enrollment and graduation rates, and degree completion gaps between Latinos and White non-Hispanic students.



President Philomena V. Mantella said Latino students in Michigan graduate from four-year institutions at a rate 10 points lower than their White non-Hispanic peers, 54 percent compared to 64 percent. Mantella said being active in Excelencia, advocating and supporting Latino students will help to close that gap.

"GVSU is proud to stand with other institutions within Excelencia's network that have pledged to support Latino students," Mantella said. "We were in the initial cohort to receive a Seal of Excellence four years ago. Our work has not stopped. We will continue to fulfill our promise to students and their families that GVSU will provide a welcoming community in which they can succeed and thrive."

Excelencia's Presidents for Latino Student Success network represents 4 percent of America's colleges and universities yet, in 2022, enrolled 31 percent and graduated 33 percent of all Latinos students.

Grand Valley is among 30 institutions within the network that have earned the Seal of Excelencia for demonstrating, through data, practice and leadership, how they intentionally serve Latino students while serving all.

Grand Valley State University es el tercer mayor productor de graduados latinos en Michigan, según un nuevo informe de Excelencia en Educación.

La organización con sede en Washington, D.C. también informó que Grand Valley ocupa el quinto lugar en Michigan en la inscripción de estudiantes latinos. El informe, Finalización universitaria latina: Estados Unidos 2023, proporciona datos nacionales sobre las tasas de inscripción y graduación, y las brechas en la finalización de títulos entre estudiantes latinos y blancos no hispanos.

La presidenta Philomena V. Mantella dijo que los estudiantes latinos en Michigan se gradúan de instituciones de cuatro años a una tasa 10 puntos inferior a la de sus compañeros blancos no hispanos, 54 por ciento en comparación con 64 por ciento. Mantella dijo que estar activo en Excelencia, defender y apoyar a los estudiantes latinos ayudará a cerrar esa brecha.

"GVSU se enorgullece de estar con otras instituciones dentro de la red de Excelencia que se han comprometido a apoyar a los estudiantes latinos", dijo Mantella. "Estuvimos en la cohorte inicial para recibir un Sello de Excelencia hace cuatro años. Nuestro trabajo no se ha detenido. Continuaremos cumpliendo nuestra promesa a los estudiantes y sus familias de que GVSU brindará una comunidad acogedora en la que puedan tener éxito y prosperar".

La red de presidentes para el éxito de los estudiantes latinos de Excelencia representa el 4 por ciento de los colegios y universidades de Estados Unidos y, sin embargo, en 2022, inscribió al 31 por ciento y graduó al 33 por ciento de todos los estudiantes latinos.

Grand Valley se encuentra entre las 30 instituciones dentro de la red que han ganado el Sello de Excelencia por demostrar, a través de datos, práctica y liderazgo, cómo sirven intencionalmente a los estudiantes latinos mientras sirven a todos

La trata de personas generalmente toma dos modalidades: tráfico sexual, en el cual un acto sexual comercial es provocado por la fuerza, fraude o coacción, o mediante el cual la persona persuadida para realizar tal acto no ha llegado a los 18 años; o el reclutar, albergar, transportar, proveer u obtener trabajo o servicios de una persona mediante el uso de la fuerza, fraude o coacción con el propósito de subyugarlos a servidumbre involuntaria, peonaje, servidumbre por deudas o esclavitud."

Los informes financieros internacionales afirman en su articulo Financial Flows from Human Trafficking que el costo estimado de ganancias es de unos 150 billones de dólares. Este siendo el segundo de mas ganancias después del negocio de venta de sustancias controladas.

Existe evidencia contundente de que sigue en crecimiento el trafico ilegal de niños, niñas y mujeres con fines de ser usados como esclavos sexuales y para la extracción y venta de órganos ilegal alrededor del mundo.

Según las estadísticas de las naciones unidas, los Estados Unidos son el consumidor numero uno de contenido de pornografía infantil y violaciones de niños.

Usualmente, estas organizaciones ilegales de trata humana y explotación infantil buscan a sus victimas en las áreas geográficas donde hay disturbios de guerras o de pobreza extrema. Se disfrazan de compañías para conseguir modelos y trabajos por un día con el permiso de los padres para luego desaparecer. Otros aprovechan a los padres que son adictos a drogas y alcohol para ofrecer drogas a cambio de actos sexuales con sus hijos. También pueden ser victimas de trabajos a la fuerza con amenazas de quitarle los papeles de inmigración.

Las víctimas de trata humana pueden ser de cualquier edad, raza, color, identidad de género, orientación sexual, sexo, nacionalidad, estatus migratorio y clase socioeconómica. Las víctimas podrían sufrir abuso físico, emocional y sexual. En muchas

ocasiones, no buscan ayuda por miedo o porque simplemente no se identifican como víctimas.

La organización Operación Underground Railroad, liderada por el agente Tim Ballard de ICE, ha identificado casos en países como África donde existen fabricas de bebes. En estos países, las niñas son secuestradas y llevadas a un lugar donde son violadas por personas que luego venden el resultado de la violación para la extracción de órganos.

Esta organización internacional que rescata los niños que están

siendo explotados sexualmente ha sido responsable por los arrestos de 6500 personas, han impactado a 7000 vidas, y hasta la fecha han hecho 4000 operaciones de rescate alrededor del mundo.

En este mes de julio, la empresa cinematográfica "Angel Studios" acaba de presentar por primera vez la película "The Sound of Freedom". La misma es una historia verdadera sobre la trata humana y como el agente Tim Ballard rescata dos hermanitos que son secuestrados en Honduras y rescatados en una selva remota de Colombia. La película va se está en todos los cines del país con el propósito de crear conciencia.

It was named Project Gutenberg in honor of the inventor of the printing press in the 15th century, Johannes Gutenberg. It currently has more than 70,000 digital books for readers to enjoy. It should be noted that it is a free service. Project Gutenberg is supported by donations of by copyright in the United States. 

Se llamó el Proyecto Gutenberg en books that are not currently protected honor al inventor de la imprenta en el siglo 15. Johannes Gutenberg, Actualmente tiene más de 70,000 libros digitales para el disfrute de los lectores. Hay que señalar que es un servicio gratis. El Proyecto Gutenberg works available are Romeo and Juliet, se mantiene con donaciones de libros que, actualmente no están protegidos por derechos de autor en los Estados Unidos. En consecuencia, son considerados de dominio público y pueden ser transformados en e-books. Algunas obras clásicas disponibles son Romeo y Julieta, Moby Dick y Alicia en el país de las maravillas.

> El Proyecto Gutenberg ofrece libros electrónicos en muchos idiomas, tales como el danés, inglés, español, francés y holandés, entre otros. También cuenta con audiolibros, grabaciones musicales originales e imágenes históricas y científicas. Otra ventaja es que muchos de los recursos pueden ser descargados de forma digital. Para facilitar el acceso a los e-books de la biblioteca Gutenberg se ha creado la página . Este enlace reúne a los lectores y permite el intercambio de opiniones sobre lecturas, fotos y audios. Eso hace del Proyecto Gutenberg una biblioteca dinámica con miles de recursos de entretenimiento y aprendizaje. Aprovechemos el conocimiento que esta biblioteca digital coloca en nuestras manos y como expresa su lema "cortemos los barrotes de la ignorancia y el analfabetismo". Seamos, por un momento, parte de la historia y protagonistas de la aventura que nos regala la lectura e imaginación.





Ignore the Man behind the Curtain

There are lies, damned lies and then there are Texan academics and politicians who deliberately omit Tejanos from history. During my childhood the white Texan population

treated us as unsympathetically as Germans treated Jews during the holocaust. Their method of destruction was the Texas education system as described by John Taylor

Gatto,[1] Weapons of Mass Instruction, 2009. Heartbreakingly, while Jewish

scholars condemned German citizen participation in the holocaust, they failed to say the same of white Texans. This is not true of Arnoldo De Leon[2] in his book "They Call Them Greasers", 2009 who compared white Texans to German citizens in the book "Hitler's Willing Executioners", by Hogan Goldhagen, 2002.[3] White Texan educators discriminated against Mex-Americans, who like Jews have survived attempts at re-education and extermination.

The Texas school system made no attempts to overcome language barriers or cultural differences. There was no interest in helping us adjust to a hostile environment or learn English. As per their eugenic thinking, we were expected to survive and if you didn't, well as they say, "tough shit". Marginal students of which there were many were forced out. White educators exerted draconian discipline but didn't care if we became laborers, prisoners, or cannon fodder in Vietnam. Teachers were so racially biased those students with learning problems were considered retarded. America's first bill proposing man-



datory sterilization was in Texas in 1849 introduced by Gordon Lince-cum,[4] a biologist and doctor. Without testing or an interview, I was classified as handicapped because I stuttered. White classmates viewed us as inferior foreigners even though we attended the same elementary, Jr. and high schools for 12 years. For example, before graduation I was pressured to join the Army on the buddy plan with Steve Boudreau by the assistant principal. Even though he'd never been friendly he assumed I'd protect him. Steve was slapped in the chow line at

Fort Lewis Washington for calling a black kid from Chicago a nigger. This mind staggering stupidity took place as the country tore itself apart and bodies arrived in flag draped coffins. James Earl Ray,[5] had allegedly assassinated Martin Luther King in 1968 and calling anyone that was suicidal. I remember that the slap sounded like a gunshot. Outdoing his stupidity, Steve replied as a true bigot, "that's what we call 'em in Texas." It's a mystery he was not gang stomped. More than 58,200 were killed and thousands wounded in the Vietnam War. Thousands of veterans remained undiagnosed with PTSD. Similarly, there are thousands of unidentified Mex-Am children suffering PTSD in rural gang areas and victims of mass shootings. Police have always known of child PTSD victims yet, as officer's children receive help, they knowingly ignore ours. Public schools receive federal funds and are obliged to offer services. Yet, I'll bet children in Uvalde Texas will be ignored or misdiagnosed with ADHA masking PTSD known to cause learning problems. No one has demanded survivors receive 504 designations.

The recent high profile admission scandal proves those who know the system, also game it. Research indicates white students make up 42 % of 504 designations, while Black and Hispanic students' only makeup 22%. Asian students make up as much as 49%. Commonly from blue-collar single parent families Mex-Am children need parents and teachers to advocate for them. Students with 504 designations usually receive better scores and are often placed in specialized schools.

Historically white industrialists never believed education was intended for the masses, nor considered it necessary. Racism has succeeded in cultural genocide as today's Mex-Americans rarely speak Spanish and know zero about their own history. We are being absorbed into extermination. Today's youth believe low-riders, gangs and violence is their culture. Mex-American citizens should consider this before voting Republican.

Jose Carlos Altuve, born in Maracay, Venezuela, continues to make a name for himself in the MLB as a second baseman for the Houston Astros.

The six-time MLB All-Star was signed as an amateur free agent by the Astros in 2007 and continued to work himself through the ranks in the franchise. He made his major league debut in 2011, also representing the team at the 2011 All-Star Futures Game. In his standout debut year, he tied Russ Johnson at seven for the Astros record for most consecutive games with a hit to start a career.

Altuve continued to excel from there on. On September 11, 2015 he recorded his 800th career hit, surpassing Biggo for the fastest Astro player to reach 800 hits. In the final game of that season, he also reached 200 hits for the second consecutive season, leading the American League, and becoming both the first Astros player and Venezuelan in history to accumulate multiple 200-hit seasons. He also led the AL in stolen

bases (38 and made the MLB playoffs for the first time in his career when the Astros clinched a berth.

In that same year, Altuve was awarded his first Rawlings Gold Glove Award, which is awarded to players who have exhibited superior individual fielding performances at their respective fielding positions, and also received his second Silver Slugger Award.

Altuve was a key player in the Astros continued success and their appearance in the 2017 World Series against the LA Dodgers. bringing home the first title in franchise history.

In the Astros' 18-game championship run, Altuve batted .310/.388/.634, had 22 hits, 14 runs scored, seven home runs, 14 RBI, and nine extra base hits. He also established a franchise record for total hits in a postseason, and was named winner of the Babe Ruth Award as MVP of the 2017 postseason.

Altuve accumulated other awards that season, including Baseball America's Major League Player of the Year, becoming the first Venezueland since Johan Santana to receive the award, and also the first second base-

man and Astro to ever do so. For the second consecutive season, he won the Players Choice Awards for Major League Player of the Year and AL

Outstanding Player, and won his fourth consecutive and overall Silver Slugger Award at second base.

In 2019, Altuve's role in what became known as the Houston Astros Sign Stealing Scandal for their use of technological aids to steal signs of op José Carlos Altuve, nacido en Mara-

> posing teams during the 2017 and 2018 seasons, gained national attention. With regard to his accused role of wearing a wire and stealing signs, Altuve said, "I'm not going to say to you that it was good — it was wrong. We feel bad, we feel remorse, like I said, the impact on the fans, the impact on the game — we feel bad."

Teammate Carlos Correa also came out to defend Altuve's 2017 MVP title and his stance against the Astros' rule-breaking tactics.

Altuve became the first player since Buster Posey in 2012— Johnson a siete para el récord de los and the eighth player overall—to win a batting title, MVP and Astros para la mayoría de los juegos World Series in the same season for 2017. Altuve became the 18th Major League Baseball player to win the award in its 64year history, and both the first Houston Astro and first Venezuelan player.



The crowd cheers and applauds. Most of them have gathered to see the Grammy-winning band, Los Lobos, but they are in for a treat. The young woman about to perform for them has accomplished so much at such an early age. Not only is she getting the chance to open for Los Lobos, but she has also made a name for herself here, as the woman who founded the first all-female Mariachi band in Michigan, Mariachi Femenil Detroit. She is also a recent graduate of the University of Michigan with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Biopsychology, Cognition and Neuroscience.

"I got involved in Mariachi music in the 8th grade. I was in the marching band in middle school and our band was approached by our

music director's husband, Denis Newhouse. He wanted to relaunch a youth mariachi ensemble in Detroit. We said yes and that same week he put a guitar in my hand and that was the beginning of everything, including my ten-year long Mariachi career, that recently included opening up for Mariachi

Flor de Toloache.'

Though Camilla does not come from a musical background, that did not stop her from becoming musically inclined. "My brother started playing drums, and being a competitive kid, I wanted to play. After playing drums awhile, I started to teach myself piano, and after picking up the guitar, I switched over to vihuela, a Mariachi instrument. Overall, I play guitar, vihuela, piano and bass and I also sing. I would have to say the vihuela and bass are my favorites to play."

So, what drew her to mariachi music? "I do love traditional mariachi music. I love performing it and I love the art itself. The vocal technique, musical discipline, and the synchronization with the rest of the band. Eventually I might consider a fusion album, but my first single, "So Far Gone" is a bolero rhythm with long falsettos that mimic traditional mariachi styles.'

What made her want to put together an all-female mariachi group? "After being the only young woman mariachi in groups in Detroit for years, it was refreshing and inspiring to see and meet Flor de Toloache from New York, an all-woman group that was so badass and so talented. They were like superheroes to me, so it was the opportunity of a lifetime when they started inviting me to gigs around the country when I was 19. Mireya Ramos and Shae Fiol are just powerhouse women, and it has been an honor being under their wing and listening to their advice and mentorship, as I begin to navigate the industry myself."

Does she still perform with Mariachi Femenil Detroit? "No, not anymore, really. I retired from the group to focus just on my independent music and career. My music is definitely easy on the ears, and I would say it is something like soulful Latin...soulfully syncopated Latin music."

Where does she see herself in five years? "In five years, I see myself touring the world with shows. Still doing occasional community classes and workshops, but making most of my income from just shows, being a DJ and touring. I see myself making music in my house, which will be a donation-based woman and non-binary recording studio within the next few years. I see myself doing music and doing it to the best extent that I can. Hopefully by then I will have collaborated with someone I musically admire. "Where can you see Camilla perform? It's never too early to start planning to return to school, especially when it comes to scheduling health screenings and annual physicals for students. As children and adolescents grow and mature, they change physically, emotionally and socially. To help parents get a head start on the next school year, here are five items to include in a back-to-school health checklist:

1. Find a primary care provider.

Parents who don't already have a pediatrician or family practitioner can start researching available physicians in their area who suit their child's health needs and participate with their health plan. Friends and family members may have physician recommendations to consider. Some physicians offer the opportunity to meet with them ahead of time over a video chat. This can help parents feel comfortable with the physician they have chosen and confident of his or her ability to care for their child or teen.

2. Schedule an annual physical.

In an annual physical, a pediatrician or family doctor will not only check a child's physical health, but also will check for developmental milestones and address any behavioral or social concerns. Doctors also will provide parents with health guidance for the upcoming year. It's a good idea to book this appointment well in advance, because doctors' schedules can

fill up quickly.

3. Make sure students' immunizations are up to date.

The COVID-19 vaccine is just one of the vaccinations a child or adolescent may need before starting school. In Michigan, students in grades K-12 must receive a series of to attend school. Immunizations are critically important protection against harmful and highly contagious illnesses like measles, mumps and whooping cough. These illnesses have seen a reemergence after decades of near elimination.

4. Schedule a sports physical.

Children and adolescents who participate in a sports activity or on a school athletic team may need to have a sports physical before they can play. Often, this can be completed during an annual physical. Even if a sports physical is not required, it's a good idea for children and adolescents to get one if they are participating in any athletic activities. In a sports physical, the doctor examines the child's fitness level and assesses any conditions or factors that may increase their risk for injury. Doctors also will evaluate any chronic conditions, such as asthma, and discuss strategies to appropriately manage the condition and meet the demands of the physical activity.

5. Prepare for a return to a school-year sleep routine.

After long days and later nights during the summer, it can take some time for bodies to get used to the earlier bedtimes and wake-ups needed for school. A few weeks before school starts, gradually make bedtime earlier in 15-minute increments. This allows the body time to adjust so children and adolescents will be refreshed and ready for the school day.

La vacuna contra el COVID-19 es solo una de las vacunas que un niño o adolescente puede necesitar antes de comenzar la escuela. En Michigan, los estudiantes en los grados K-12 deben recibir una serie de para asistir a la escuela.

4. Programe un examen físico deportivo.

Los niños y adolescentes que participan en una actividad deportiva o en un equipo atlético escolar pueden necesitar un examen físico deportivo antes de poder jugar.

5. Prepárese para volver a la rutina de sueño del año escolar.

Después de largos días y noches más largas durante el verano, puede tomar algún tiempo para que los cuerpos se acostumbren a acostarse y levantarse más temprano, necesarios para ir a la escuela.




