Es importante señalar que la paz es una cuestión compleja en la que influyen muchos factores, como la estabilidad política, la prosperidad económica, la justicia social y la diversidad cultural. 

París 2024: inicia la cuenta regresiva para los primeros Olímpicos postpandemia.

“La gente pasa frente al reloj de cuenta regresiva que muestra 600 días faltan para la ceremonia de apertura de los juegos

Olímpicos de París 2024, cerca de la Torre Eiffel en París, Francia el 26 de Julio

Los juegos Olímpicos con miles de visitantes en los eventos deportivos volverán luego de la pandemia de Covid-19 y la plaza será París. La cita es un alivio después del escenario desolador de los Olímpicos de Tokio 2020 celebrados un año después de lo previsto. En este especial de France 24 analizamos lo que implica para la capital francesa en temas logísticos el inicio de esta cuenta regresiva. Los organizadores, atletas y fanáticos se preparan para las competencias en París y otras ciudades francesas como Lille y Marsella, además de la lejana sede de surf de Tahití en el Pacífico Sur. Los juegos Olímpicos de París 2024 están a un año de comenzar y desde ya son históricos porque serán los primeros celebrados luego de la emergencia sanitaria de la pandemia que impidió la concentración de multitudes.

También serán históricos porque incluirán un nuevo deporte: el breaking, un estilo de baile urbano originario del Bronx de Nueva York. Nació durante la década del 70 como parte de la cultura del hip-hop y se caracteriza por la combinación de movimientos atléticos como giros sobre la cabeza, volteretas, saltos y complejos movimientos corporales.



Alrededor de 10 millones de entradas se pusieron a disposición para los juegos Olímpicos de París con 329 eventos de medallas en 32 deportes diferentes repartidos en 18 días diferentes de competencia. Ya se han vendido cerca de siete millones de boletas a un año de la apertura el 26 de julio. El sistema de venta de entradas online del comité organizador se agilizó por intermedio de la empresa estadounidense "On Location". Los organizadores están vendiendo directamente alrededor de ocho millones de boletos con la promesa de que un millón estén disponibles para todos los deportes a un precio de 26 dólares y otros más de 55 dólares o menos.

París promete poner a disposición sus amplias y diversas opciones de alojamiento, desde campamentos a lo largo del río Sena hasta algunos de los hoteles de lujo más famosos del mundo. La región de París tiene mayor concentración de alojamiento hotelero de Francia, sus 160.000 habitaciones constituyen una cuarta parte del total del país de 640.000. Casi el 90% de los hoteles de la región de París tienen una clasificación de dos estrellas o superior.

Nominations Encouraged for Michigan Lottery's Excellence in Education Awards to Honor Outstanding Educators

The Michigan Lottery is celebrating 10 years of recognizing outstanding educators with the 2023-24 Excellence in Education awards. During the program's 10 years, the Michigan Lottery has recognized more than 300 public-school educators across Michigan and highlighted the impact they have in their respective communities.



Nominations are currently open, and parents, students, school staff members, and others are encouraged to nominate outstanding public-school educators for awards. All public-school employees may be nominated for the awards, which recognize educators who go "above and beyond" to make a difference in the lives of children. To nominate a public-school educator, go to <https://www.michiganlottery.com/excellenceineducation>.

"Public-school educators play a critical role in our students' lives by serving as role models, offering encouragement and motivation, and teaching critical skills that prepare Michigan's students for future success," said Acting Lottery Commissioner, Jessica Weare. "The Lottery's Excellence in Education awards shine a light on dedicated educators who go above and beyond for their students and inspire them to reach their full potential."

The Michigan Lottery established the Excellence in Education awards in 2014 to recognize outstanding public-school educators across the state during the school year.

One outstanding educator will be selected each week and will receive a \$2,000 cash prize. At the end of the school year, one of these weekly award winners will be selected to receive the Lottery's Educator of the Year award and will receive a \$10,000 cash prize.

Winners of the weekly award are featured in a news segment on the Lottery's media partner stations: WXYZ-TV in Detroit, FOX 17 in Grand Rapids, FOX 47 in Lansing, WNEM-TV in Saginaw, and WWTV-TV in Traverse City.

The winner of the 2023 Educator of the Year award was Kathryn Kluzak, a kindergarten teacher at Robert L. Green Elementary in East Lansing.

Hundreds of educators were nominated during the 2022-23 school year, which was the ninth year of the Excellence in Education awards program. Thirty-four of these nominees, including Kluzak, were selected to win a weekly award.

Previous winners of the Educator of the Year award:


2022 – Spencer Vanderheide, a high school teacher with Kenowa Hills High School in Grand Rapids.

2021 – Janice Smith, a school social worker at Fisher Magnet Lower Academy in Detroit.

2020 – Megan Sidge, an Autism Spectrum Disorder teacher at Hickory Woods Elementary in Walled Lake.

2019 – Stewart Kieliszewski, an Earth science, biology, mechatronics, and media teacher for eighth through 12 graders at the Ubly Community Schools.

2018 – Kerri Moccio, a first-grade literacy intervention specialist at Bedford Elementary School in Dearborn Heights.



2017 – Linda Holzwarth, a social studies teacher at Portage West Middle School in Portage.

2016 – Daniel Carr, a Spanish and sports marketing teacher at Waverly High School in Lansing.

2015 – Michael Craig, a special education teacher at the Charles Drew Transition Center in Detroit.

Excellence In Education award nominees should demonstrate the following qualities:

- **Excellence** – Their work consistently helps students and/or their schools or school districts advance to higher levels of academic achievement.

- **Dedication** – They consistently go above and beyond expectations to help students succeed.

- **Inspiration** – Their work inspires others around them to exceed expectations either academically or professionally.

- **Leadership** – They demonstrate clear leadership skills in their positions with their school or school districts.

- **Effectiveness** – The nominee's work has clear and positive results on the educational advancement of students within the school or school district.





Mauricio Dubón

Mauricio Dubón is a Honduran utility player for the Houston Astros of Major League Baseball who proved his worth to the team throughout this past season.

Dubón took over as starter at second base after Jose Altuve fractured his thumb at the World Baseball Classic. He started 35 of the team's first 42 games while Altuve recovered from surgery, and started 13 more consecutive games in July while Altuve dealt with a left oblique injury.

For the entirety of the season, Dubón started games at five different defensive positions—64 at second base, 24 in center field, six in left field, nine at shortstop, and two at first base. He reached career highs with 76 runs scored, 130 hits, 26 doubles, three triples, 10 home runs, 46 RBIs, seven stolen bases, 19 walks, and 70 strikeouts.

The 29-year-old was born in San Pedro Sula, Honduras and moved to Sacramento, California at 15. He was selected during the 26th round of the 2013 MLB draft by the Boston Red Sox, being ranked by Baseball America as the best defensive player for that draft class.

He spent his time with the Red Sox in the minor leagues before being traded to the Milwaukee Brewers in 2016. After spending the 2017 season with the Biloxi Shuckers and Colorado Springs Sky Sox, the Brewers added him to their 40-man roster after the season.

In 2019, Dubón was promoted to the major leagues and made his MLB debut against the Pittsburgh Pirates on July 7. This made him only the second Honduran to make it to the MLB, after outfielder Gerald Young.

He was traded to the San Francisco Giants at the end of July 2019, where he spent three years before being traded to the Houston Astros in May 2022.

Dubón started at shortstop on June 19, 2022,

and hit his first home run as an Astro against the Chicago White Sox. In 2022, Dubón batted .208/.254/.294 in 197 at bats. On defense, he played 45 games at center field, 17 at shortstop, 16 at second base, nine at left field, and three in right field.

When the Astros defeated the Philadelphia Phillies in the World Series in 2022, Dubón gained his first career World Series title, becoming the first Honduras-born player to both play in and win a World Series.

He appeared in his second World Series in 2023, where the Astros lost to the Texas Rangers.

Dubón was named finalist for the Golden Glove Award in 2023, given to the best MLB player at each fielding position for both the National and American Leagues, at two positions – second base and utility player.

He was awarded the Golden Glove for utility players and became the first Honduran player to win a Golden Glove award.

El jugador de 29 años nació en San Pedro Sula, Honduras y se mudó a Sacramento, California a los 15. Fue seleccionado durante la ronda 26 del draft de la MLB de 2013 por los Boston Red Sox, siendo clasificado por Baseball America como el mejor defensivo. jugador para esa clase de draft.

En 2019, Dubón ascendió a las ligas mayores e hizo su debut en la MLB contra los Piratas de Pittsburgh el 7 de julio. Esto lo convirtió en el segundo hondureño en llegar a la MLB, después del jardinero Gerald Young.

Apareció en su segunda Serie Mundial en 2023, donde los Astros perdieron ante los Texas Rangers.

Dubón fue nombrado finalista del Premio Guante de Oro 2023, otorgado al mejor jugador de la MLB en cada posición de fildeo tanto de la Liga Nacional como de la Americana, en dos posiciones: segunda base y jugador utilitario.

Los logros diarios son muy importantes porque nos ayudan a sentirnos bien con nosotros mismos, a mantener nuestra motivación





And, because he could not stomach a lowly Mexican bandit robbing and killing his men. On February 6, 1929 the caretaker of the municipal cemetery of Parral, Chihuahua, Mexico named Juan Amparan reported Villa's body had been decapitated and his head was missing.

Villa's name was Jose Doroteo Arango Arambula. Amongst his crimes was attacking Columbus New Mexico March 9, 1916. There followed a random massacre of innocent Mexican peasants by American troops giving chase. America invaded Mexico soon thereafter and a bounty of \$50,000 to \$100,000 was offered. He was ambushed on July 20, 1923 and his body riddled with over 40 bullets as were his bodyguards. Villa was hated by many whom he'd harmed directly or via his role in the revolution. The Mexican elite resented having lost millions while Villa, whom they saw as a bandit, benefited. American investors feared Villa would again take up arms and were better served with Villa dead.

The alleged culprit was a Swedish-American named Emil Holmdahl who'd invaded Mexico with General Pershing. The investigation was poorly handled and a mysterious airplane landed in Parral the night of the incident, which it's believed is how Holmdahl got rid of the head before he was arrested, then released. Holmdahl is said to have admitted he sold the head to Bonesman Prescott Bush, father of the 41st president at Yale University's Skull and Bones Society for \$25,000, in a book by Ben F. Williams, Let the Tail go with the Hide, 1984. Other legends claim his head is in the possession of his family somewhere in Mexico. However, knowing what I know about the majority population like Trump, Vanderbilt, Rockefeller, Ford and Hearst I remain skeptical. Mexico's situation reflects the times and violence of that period in history. While ours reflects the troubled times before WWI and WWII. As in both times, we need a hero. Return the Head of Pancho Villa!

Fue robado después de que la tumba fuera profanada por un mercenario estadounidense, supuestamente pagado por William R. Hearst y sus colegas. Se dice que el magnate de los periódicos estadounidenses que inició la guerra entre Cuba y Estados Unidos perdió millones en ferrocarriles, tierras y ganado durante la Revolución Mexicana. Y porque no podía sopor tar que un humilde bandido mexicano robara y matara a sus hombres. El 6 de Febrero de 1929 el cuidador del cementerio municipal de Parral, Chihuahua, México lla-

mado Juan Amparan informó que el cuerpo de Villa había sido decapitado y le faltaba la cabeza.

El nombre de Villa era José Doroteo Arango Arámbula. Entre sus crímenes se encuentra el ataque a Columbus, Nuevo México, el 9 de marzo de 1916. Siguió una masacre aleatoria de campesinos mexicanos inocentes a manos de las tropas estadounidenses que los perseguían. Estados Unidos invadió México poco después y se ofreció una recompensa de entre 50,000 y 100,000 dólares. Fue emboscado el 20 de julio de 1923 y su cuerpo fue acribillado con más de 40 balas al igual que sus guardaespaldas. Villa era odiado por muchos a quienes había perjudicado directamente o por su papel en la revolución. A la élite mexicana le molestaba haber perdido millones, mientras que Villa, a quien veían como un bandido, se beneficiaba. Los inversores estadounidenses temían que Villa volviera a tomar las armas y les convenía más que Villa muriera.

El presunto culpable era un sueco-estadounidense llamado Emil Holmdahl que había invadido México con el general Pershing. La investigación se manejó mal y un misterioso avión aterrizó en Parral la noche del incidente, y se cree que fue así como Holmdahl se deshizo de la cabeza antes de ser arrestado y luego liberado. Se dice que Holmdahl admitió que vendió la cabeza a Bonesman Prescott Bush, padre del 41º presidente de la Skull and Bones Society de la Universidad de Yale por 25.000 dólares, en un libro de Ben F. Williams, Let the Tail go with the Hide, 1984. Las leyendas afirman que su cabeza está en posesión de su familia en algún lugar de México. Sin embargo, sabiendo lo que sé sobre la población mayoritaria como Trump, Vanderbilt, Rockefeller, Ford y Hearst, sigo siendo escéptico. La situación de México refleja los tiempos y la violencia de ese período de la historia. Mientras que el nuestro refleja los tiempos difíciles anteriores a la Primera y Segunda Guerra Mundial. Como en ambos tiempos, necesitamos un héroe. ¡Devuélvelle la cabeza a Pancho Villa!


