¡Mi familia vota! ¡Mis amigos y seguidores también votan!





JUNETEENTH JAM

The 4th Annual Justice 4 All Juneteenth Jam took place at Calder Plaza in downtown Grand Rapids. It was a day to celebrate black art, entertainment, culture, and experience.

What is Juneteenth? On June 19, 1865, Union troops arrived in Galveston Bay, Texas, and announced that the more than 250,000 enslaved black people in the state were free by executive decree. This day came to be known as "Juneteenth" by the newly freed people of Texas.

When the event was first started by Julius Rogers in 2021, it was held at Rosa Parks Circle with about 300 people attending and about 10 food vendors. This was the first year it was held at the Calder Plaza and has grown to about 2,000-3,000 attendees and 50-plus vendors.

People enjoyed food, music, dancers, martial arts exhibitions, speeches by community leaders, games for the kids, and live performances by local artists. There was even a breakdance battle, with the winner taking home a \$1,000.00 prize! It is great to see how this event has grown and is bringing the community closer together.

Betrayal of the Highest Honor;

To the unaware, there are no similarities between German Scientists of WWII and today's Supreme By Jorge Martinez Court Justices. Yet, closer inspection finds troubling similarities. Both were driven by a desire to excel,

economic gain, and univer-

sal recognition in their field. Each swore an oath to work for the greater good, to hold no personal agenda nor malice, and yet the consequences are the same. America competed with Russia and Germany in developing weapon systems. Unbeknownst, German scientists led in what would be called The Nuclear Weapons race. As Russian troops sought revenge over atrocities, German scientists sought refuge and surrendered to the Americans. These men were members of the Nazi party but were saved by Operation Paperclip. [1]Many of these men worked on the V2 Rockets, which were part of the Blitz bombing of London, killing 43000 Civilians in 1940-45. Understandably, the English earnestly sought vengeance but mostly wanted to capture these weapons. America sought to use these weapons against Japan as they refused to surrender. Upon Germany's defeat, over 1600 bona fide Nazi scientists willingly surrendered to Wild Bill Donovan's secret service. English and American intelli-


gence saw tremendous benefits in recruiting German Scientists to the Space Race before the Cold War. Because Nazis massacred millions in over 1000 concentration camps, this was done secretly to avoid public scrutiny. Amongst them was Wernher Von Braun [2], who felt no remorse for killing millions. His infamous quote is, "Science does not have a moral dimension. It is like a knife. If you give it to a surgeon or a murderer, each will use it differently". This can also be said of overturning Roe vs Wade[3], a law that has been in place for over 50 years. Rescuing these men was determined essential to our security but would have been seen as an abomination to the public. While vetting them, the FBI allegedly found they'd

joined the Nazi party only in order to gain universal celebrity as a scientist in their fields. In other words, like Alito, Thomas, Kavanaugh, and others, they were not seen as monsters who hated Jews nor saw themselves as superior. Yet, their work created weapons of

> mass destruction. None of them recognized their role in killing millions, as they had no control over how they were used. This provided a paradox and rationalization to hire former Nazis and offer citizenship, good pay, homes, new names, passports and start a new life in America. Like Alito, Thomas, and Kavanaugh, there were no consequences, as there were no checks and balances. The similarities between the Supreme Court and German Scientists of WWII are alarming. No member of the court sees themselves as ultra-right or anti-American. While they acknowledge violating their code of ethics, they don't consider themselves criminal. And yet, like German Scientist Otto Ambros, [4]developer of Sarin and Tabun gas, they only did so to further their personal goals. Like German Scientists, Supreme Court Justices feel no remorse, guilt, or regret over how their decisions

harm the middle class and support the one percent. Kavanagh, Thomas, and Alito are not America's oligarchy, and yet, like infamous German Scientists, they rub shoulders with billionaires, fly, sail, and enjoy luxuries beyond their means, also without conscience or consequence. They interpret the law as they see fit. Tragically, it's what our founding fathers believed. Only property-owning white men mattered and could vote; enslaved people and Indigenous people were not persons, much less citizens; enslaved people were property and could be bought, sold, and killed. Interestingly, our founding fathers would not have considered Justice Thomas worth indulging. Just as Chief Justice Roger Taney[5] in 1857 did not consider Dred Scott an

African slave, a citizen nor entitled to liberty of speech, or protected by rights and privileges. Like the infamous German scientists, our supreme court does not see themselves as guilty of anything other than representing the rule of law. Yet John Roberts, who earns \$286,700, plus undeclared gifts, acts to promote the desires of the one percent. Justice Thomas [6] earned \$230,000 and allegedly received over \$4 million in gifts. Like the infamous German scientists, none of the justices were motivated by altruism but by universal celebrity and financial gain. Their greatest folly thus far is to actually consider granting convicted felon Trump immunity. Those born without privilege, silver spoons, trust funds, and a place at a prestigious university should recognize these men are part of America's oligarchy that has feigned tolerance towards average citizens whom they view as cannon fodder, consumers, and laborers to be exploited. The GOP voted to defund NATO on the anniversary of D-Day initiated to ensure the world was free of tyrants, fascists, and the cult of strong

Each month we will feature a Latin American athlete representing our community in professional sports.

The National Hockey League continues to increase its presence within the Hispanic community, and while the presence of Hispanic players within the league is relatively small, there are players making their way, including Matt Nieto.

Nieto is a Mexican-American left winger for the Pittsburgh Penguins who grew up in Long Beach, California. He caught the attention of the USA Hockey National Team Development Program during his sophomore year of high school, when he scored eight goals and ten assists in 28 games. He moved to Ann Arbor, Michigan to play in the program.

"I was really into rollerblading, and I used to sleep in my rollerblades and never take them off, so my grandpa got me a mini hockey stick. Then I was playing with that all day as well, so my parents signed me

up for roller hockey. After a couple of years of that, I tried ice hockey, and just fell in love with it and kept going," Nieto said in an interview with the Penguins when speaking on how he came to play hockey.

Nieto attended Boston College, where he scored 10 goals and 13 assists in his first season. He played all four years there, ending his Terriers career with 44 goals and 102 points in 115 games.

He was ranked as the 43rd best prospect and second-best player in the NCAA's Hockey East conference by NHL.com in the 2011 draft class, and was drafted in the second round of the 2011 NHL Entry Draft by the San Jose Sharks as the 47th overall pick. He was the first Californian to be selected by the team.

After spending time with the Sharks' then-American Hockey League affiliate, the Worcester Sharks, Nieto made his NHL debut against the Vancouver Canucks in October 2013. He scored his first Stanley Cup playoff goal in April 2014 in an empty-net goal against the Los Angeles

Kings.

He was claimed off waivers by the Colorado Avalanche in 2017, and set career-highs in the 2018 season with 74 games played and 15 goals scored. He became a free agent for the first time at the conclusion of the 2019-20 season, returning to the San Jose Sharks in 2020. During the 2022-23 season, he scored 8 goals and 15 points through 48 regular season games. With the Sharks out of contention for a playoff berth, he was traded back to the Avalanche.


Nieto completed the season with 12 goals and 24 goals – both the highest totals of his careers. As a free agent in 2023, he signed a two-year, \$1.8 million contract with the Penguins.

"You're seeing a lot more Hispanic players, guys like myself, (Toronto Maple Leafs center) Auston Matthews and (Vegas Golden Knights defenseman) Alec Martinez that are just sort of paving the way," Nieto said in a 2021 interview with NHL.com. "If I could help even just one player, (show) that it's possible from looking at me, where I came from, my ethnicity. I take a lot of pride in that."





Myth #1: Donating blood is painful.

The only pain associated with giving blood is a quick pinch of the needle when it is inserted. Sometimes an ache in a nerve may occur or a small bruise.

Myth #2: If I donate blood, I will not have enough left in my own body.

During a typical blood donation, only one pint of As long as you are healthy, most medication will

blood is collected. The average adult has approximately 10 pints of blood. After donating, your body makes new blood to replenish what was lost. If you drink enough liquids, your body will replace lost fluids within a few hours.

Myth #3: I might contract HIV or other infections if I donate blood.

With each new blood donation, a new sterile needle is used and then immediately discarded. Strict rules, highly trained staff and the use of only sterile equipment make it highly unlikely that you will develop an infection of any

Myth #4: I cannot donate blood, because I have high cholesterol or high blood pres-

Having high cholesterol does not disqualify you from donating blood as long as you are healthy otherwise. As long as your blood pressure is under 180/100 at the time of your donation, you can give blood. The American Red Cross provides a detailed list of to donate blood, including people with tattoos.

Myth #5: I cannot give blood because I take medication.

not disqualify you from donating blood. Before donating blood, you should provide the staff with information about any medication you are taking. Donating blood saves lives and improves the health of many people. One blood donation can save up to three lives. According to the World Health Organization, "blood is the most precious gift that anyone can give to another person – the gift of life." bargo, según la Cruz Roja Estadounidense, el invierno es una de las épocas del año más difíciles para recolectar suficiente sangre para satisfacer las necesidades de los pacientes. En muchos casos, podría deberse a malentendidos sobre el proceso o los requisitos. Acabemos con algunos mitos que podrían tranquilizarte si estás pensando en donar sangre este año.

Mito #1: Donar sangre es doloroso.

El único dolor asociado con la donación de sangre es un rápido pellizco de la aguja cuando se inserta. A veces puede producirse un dolor en un nervio o un pequeño hematoma.

Mito #2: Si dono sangre, no me quedará suficiente en mi cuerpo.

Durante una donación de sangre típica, sólo se recolecta medio litro de sangre. El adulto promedio tiene aproximadamente 10 pintas de sangre. Después de la donación, su cuerpo produce sangre nueva para reponer la perdida. Si bebe suficientes líquidos, su cuerpo repondrá los líquidos perdidos en unas pocas horas. Mito n.º 3: Podría contraer VIH u otras infec-

ciones si dono sangre. Con cada nueva donación de sangre, se utiliza una nueva aguja estéril y luego se desecha inmediatamente. Las reglas estrictas, el personal altamente capacitado y el uso únicamente de equipos esterili-

zados hacen que sea muy poco probable que usted desarrolle una infección de cualquier tipo.

Mito #4: No puedo donar sangre porque tengo el colesterol alto o la presión arterial alta.

Tener el colesterol alto no lo descalifica para donar sangre, siempre y cuando esté sano. Siempre que tu presión arterial sea inferior a 180/100 en el momento de la donación, puedes donar sangre. La Cruz Roja Estadounidense proporciona una lista detallada de personas que pueden donar sangre, incluidas las personas con tatuajes.

Mito #5: No puedo donar sangre porque tomo medicamentos.

Mientras esté sano, la mayoría de los medicamentos no lo descalificarán para donar sangre. Antes de donar sangre, debes proporcionar al personal información sobre cualquier medicamento que estés tomando. Donar sangre salva vidas y mejora la salud de muchas personas. Visite www.redcross.org.


