America Grieves Again, Fmr. President Jimmy Carter Tribute

Estados Unidos sufre de nuevo, Fmr. Homenaje al presidente Jimmy Carter

Our nation is saddened by another loss of a former President and world class leader who prided himself as a defender of the common man. Jimmy Carter was born to serve and dedicated his entire life to making a difference for all Americans. It was recently announced that former US President Jimmy Carter began receiving hospice care at home in Georgia, according to a statement from The Carter Center on Saturday February 18, 2023. "After a series of short hospital stays, former US President Jimmy Carter today decided to spend his remaining time at home with his family and receive hospice care instead of additional medical intervention. He has the full support of his family and his medical team," the statement said. Jason Carter, a onetime Democratic state senator in Georgia and the former president's grandson, said he visited Friday with his grandparents and that "They are at peace and – as always-their home is full of love." Jimmy Carter, who turned 98 last year, became the oldest living US president in history after the passing of George H.W. Bush, who died in late 2018 at 94. The nation's 39th president has kept a low public profile in recent years due to the coronavirus pandemic but has continued to speak out about risks to democracy around the world, a longtime cause of his.


Carter has always been a fighter and resilient, he beat brain cancer in 2015 but faced a series of health scares in 2019, and consequently underwent surgery to remove pressure on his brain. His health woes forced him to give up his decade's long tradition of teaching Sunday school at Maranatha Baptist Church in his hometown of Plains, Georgia. He has vowed to make every living moment a opportunity to make a difference for others.

A peanut farmer and US Navy lieutenant before going to politics, Carter, a Democrat, eventually served one term as governor of Georgia and served as president of the United States from 1977 to 1981. The former president is widely revered for his championing of human rights. His brokering of the Camp David Accords in 1978 with Egyptian President Anwar Sadat and Israel Prime Minister Menachem Begin remains central to his legacy.

In his post-presidency years, Carter founded The Carter Center along with his wife, Rosalyn, in hopes of advancing world peace and health. The center has worked to advance democracy by monitoring foreign elections and reducing diseases in developing countries over the years. Carter himself has been a longtime volunteer with Habitat for Humanity. He has personally built homes for the homeless and less fortunate serving as a Christian example of generous and selfless service to others. As a person of faith, I am touched by his sacrifices and believe he deserves much praise for his "leadership by example!" Few leaders can match what Jimmy Carter has achieved in his lifetime! He received the Nobel Peace Prize in 2002 for his efforts to push for peace across the globe.

As Jimmy Carter battled cancer, he continued to draw thousands of people, democrats and republicans, to a small church in Plains, Georgia where he greeted visitors from around the world, sharing his faith in God and his hopes for the future. Our blessings and condolences are expressed to the Carter family!

Jimmy Carter nació para servir y dedicó toda su vida a marcar la diferencia para todos los estadounidenses. Recientemente se anunció que el expresidente de los EE. UU.



Jimmy Carter comenzó a recibir cuidados paliativos en su hogar en Georgia, según un comunicado del Centro Carter el sábado 18 de febrero de 2023. "Después de una serie de breves estadías en el hospital, el expresidente de los EE. UU. Jimmy Carter decidió hoy pasar el tiempo restante en casa con su familia y recibir cuidados paliativos en lugar de una intervención médica adicional. Tiene todo el apoyo de su familia y de su equipo médico", señala el comunicado. Jason Carter, ex-senador estatal demócrata en Georgia y nieto del expresidente, dijo que visitó el viernes a sus abuelos y que "están en paz y, como siempre, su hogar está lleno de amor". Jimmy Carter, quien cumplió 98 años el año pasado, se convirtió en el presidente estadounidense vivo más anciano de la historia tras el fallecimiento de George H.W. Bush, quien murió a fines de 2018 a los 94 años. El presidente número 39 de la nación ha

mantenido un bajo perfil público en los últimos años debido a la pandemia de coronavirus, pero ha seguido hablando sobre los riesgos para la democracia en todo el mundo, una de sus causas desde hace mucho tiempo.

Carter siempre ha sido un luchador y resistente, venció el cáncer cerebral en 2015, pero enfrentó una serie de problemas de salud en 2019 y, en consecuencia, se sometió a una cirugía para eliminar la presión en su cerebro. Sus problemas de salud lo obligaron a renunciar a la larga tradición de su década de enseñar en la escuela dominical en la Iglesia Bautista Maranatha en su ciudad natal de Plains, Georgia. Se ha comprometido a hacer de cada momento de su vida una oportunidad de marcar una diferencia para los demás.

Un agricultor de maní y teniente de la Marina de los EE. UU. antes de pasar a la política, Carter, un demócrata, finalmente sirvió un mandato como gobernador de Georgia y se desempeñó como presidente de los Estados Unidos de 1977 a 1981. El expresidente es ampliamente venerado por su defensa de los derechos humanos. Su intermediación en los Acuerdos de Camp David en 1978 con el presidente egipcio Anwar Sadat y el primer ministro israelí Menachem Begin sigue siendo fundamental para su legado.

En sus años posteriores a la presidencia, Carter fundó The Carter Center junto con su esposa, Rosalyn, con la esperanza de promover la paz y la salud mundiales. El centro ha trabajado para promover la democracia mediante el seguimiento de elecciones en el extranjero y la reducción de enfermedades en los países en desarrollo a lo largo de los años. El propio Carter ha sido voluntario durante mucho tiempo con Habitat for Humanity. Ha construido personalmente hogares para personas sin hogar y menos afortunados, sirviendo como un ejemplo cristiano de servicio generoso y desinteresado a los demás. Como persona de fe, me conmueven sus sacrificios y creo que merece muchos elogios por su "liderazgo con el ejemplo". ¡Pocos líderes pueden igualar lo que Jimmy Carter ha logrado en su vida! Recibió el Premio Nobel de la Paz en 2002 por sus esfuerzos para impulsar la paz en todo el mundo.

Mientras Jimmy Carter luchaba contra el cáncer, siguió atrayendo a miles de personas, demócratas y republicanos, a una pequeña iglesia en Plains, Georgia, donde saludó a visitantes de todo el mundo, compartiendo su fe en Dios y sus esperanzas para el futuro. ¡Nuestras bendiciones y condolencias se expresan a la familia Carter!

Every time you play the lottery, it's a win for Michigan. Each purchase benefits K-12 education, gives a lift to local businesses, and supports companies that employ Michigan residents. For every \$1 spent on Lottery, 61 cents goes to prizes, 28 cents goes to the School Aid Fund, 9 cents goes to retailer and vendor commissions, and 2 cents is used for Lottery operations.

Since it began in 1972, the Lottery has contributed more than \$27 billion to support public education in Michigan, with more than \$6 billion of that coming in the last four years. Fiscal Year 2022 marked the Lottery's fourth straight contribution of more than \$1 billion to support public education.

Almost 11,000 businesses throughout Michigan earn commissions on the sale of Lottery products as licensed retailers. Lottery sales provide a year-round revenue stream for small and large businesses alike. In the last decade, more than \$2.4 billion in sales commissions and bonuses have been paid to these businesses.

In addition to contributing to the School Aid Fund, the Lottery recognizes outstanding educators with the Excellence in Education awards. The Michigan Lottery established the Excellence in Education awards in 2014 to recognize outstanding public-school educators across the state during the school year.

One outstanding educator is selected each week and receives a \$1,500 cash prize plus a \$500 grant to their classroom, school or school district. One of the weekly award winners will be selected to receive the Lottery's Educator of the Year award and will receive a \$10,000 cash prize.

Each winner also will receive a plaque and be featured in a news segment on the Lottery's media partner stations: WXYZ-TV in Detroit, FOX 17 in Grand Rapids, FOX 47 in Lansing, and WNEM-TV, Saginaw.







Crisis de Ambulancias en Puerto Rico



Si usted tiene una emergencia hoy mismo en Puerto Rico y requiere una ambulancia, no va a llegar a tiempo para salvarle la vida. El sistema de ambulancias y emergencia médica está en crisis. Para comenzar, solo hay un hospital de trauma y está en Rio Piedras lo cual es lejos del resto de los residentes que viven en los pueblos de la montaña, el Sur y el oeste.

Recientemente, murió una persona esperando que llegara una ambulancia para poder darle oxígeno debido a una afección pulmonar de la cual padecía. Su hija llamó al teléfono 911 para pedir una ambulancia, pero en lo que se pasaron las llamadas al municipio, al estado y a una ambulancia privada, la persona murió. Entendemos que pasaron más de 30 minutos en la gestión burocrática establecida hoy día.

¿Pero cuál es la crisis? Según los directores a cargo del sistema de emergencia, hay solamente 50 y pico de ambulancias para los 78 pueblos. Las ambulancias que existen se encuentran en muy mal estado. Existe una crisis también porque no hay suficientes paramédicos para cubrir todos los dos turnos requeridos donde se cubre el día y la noche para los 78 pueblos de la isla. Entendemos que esto es debido al salario de hambre que tienen en la actualidad los paramédicos rondando en unos \$2,250.00 mensuales. Alguien que nos salva la vida le estamos pagando un sueldo muy bajo lo cual ha creado una crisis que pone en riesgo de

morir por abandono a todos los habitantes de la isla. El problema es que muchos paramédicos han decidido mudarse a la Florida donde reciben un salario y beneficios más atractivo y realista para el trabajo que ellos hacen a diario. El salario en un estado de la Florida está en unos \$44,488.00 pero puede llegar hasta \$54,529.00 si tienen experiencia. Esto es más del doble de lo que reciben en Puerto Rico por el mismo trabajo.

El problema mayor que existe es la burocracia y la falta de organización y respuesta rápida de parte de las agencias de gobierno. El sistema 911 trabaja rápido, pero una vez que llaman al municipio, todo cae en una arena movediza impredecible del tiempo de respuesta. Si no hay ambulancias en el municipio entonces este tiene que llamar al estado para comenzar a llamar al municipio más cercano para ver quien está disponible. Si no consiguen a nadie, entonces el último recurso es pedir una ambulancia privada para que responda. Mientras tanto el tiempo pasa y se muere el paciente que está esperando por el servicio de ambulancias.

El estado crítico de las ambulancias que hay en estos momentos requiere una acción rápida de parte del gobierno municipal y estatal para que cada municipio tenga este servicio las 24 horas del día. Mas aun cuando la población de

envejecientes es el 60% de los habitantes de la isla y esto va en crecimiento en la próxima década.

Los colegios y universidades deben tener un plan para que se incremente la cantidad de personas que estudien para ser paramédicos. Este plan debe incluir el proporcionar becas de estudios para los que no tengan la beca PELL puedan completar los estudios de paramédico.

Hay que construir un hospital de trauma nuevo en el oeste de la isla para que se pueda atender la población de manera rápida y efectiva. Sabemos que los millones allegadamente malversados por el ex alcalde de Mayagüez estaban dirigidos hacia el desarrollo de un hospital de trauma, pero ahora esta detenido el proceso afectando directamente a la población de el área oeste forzándolos a tomar un helicóptero para salvar sus vidas.

Michigan State University shooting renew focus on Gun Reform

The tragic and senseless killing and wounding of students at Michigan State University in Lansing, Michigan shook the sense of security that students attending a major university should enjoy. The Michigan State University Department of Police and Public Safety identified the three students killed as Arielle Anderson, Alexandria Verner, and Brian Fraser. In addition to the deceased students, five other students were critically injured including Guadalupe (Lupe) Huapilla-Pérez.

Demonstrations calling for immediate action on Gun Reform were organized in Lansing and other cities as vigils stressing the need for our state and nation to address the increased number of senseless mass shootings taking place in America. In the case of the MSU shootings the shooter was black, the victims White, Black and Hispanic. Race appeared not to be a motive. Mental illness has been cited as a root cause of this shooting and gives more credence to the call for Gun Reform Laws. Mass shootings are on the rise nearing 70 or more in the United States so far this year.

Elementary Schools, Middle and High Schools, Concerts, Universities, Grocery Stores and Malls have been targets of some of the most horrific mass shootings in America leaving emotional scars on innocent children and unsuspecting adults who lost their lives or were seriously injured for no rational reason.

CNN reported A civilian used his legally licensed gun to shoot and wound a suspect in a mall shooting in El Paso, Texas, that left one dead and three injured earlier this week, police said.

Emanuel Duran, 32, shot a 16-year-old who is believed to have carried



out the shooting at the Cielo Vista Mall, spurring chaos and sending many patrons running in panic according to El Paso Police.

"As soon as the shooting ended, the 16-year-old suspect began to run and was pointing the gun towards the direction of bystanders," police said. "As the suspect ran towards Duran and bystanders, Duran drew his handgun and shot the suspect."

Gun reformers are calling for expanded restrictions on assault weapons, high-capacity ammunition clips, mental health screening of gun owners, red flag laws targeting felons and persons convicted of domestic abuse, closing loops in the sale of military style weapons and more.

Los puertorriqueños no emigran a Estados Unidos

Los puertorriqueños se trasladan a otro Estado

Siempre me he preguntado porque en los Estados Unidos hasta un letrado me ha preguntado si me case por papeles, cosa que me sorprende de alguien estudiado. Si precisamos visa, aún más si se puede llegar en automóvil. Ese malestar que se siente cuando la gente asume una posición sin antes orientarse. ¿Qué paso en Puerto Rico el 18 de octubre del 1898? El ejército de los Estados Unidos asumió formalmente la administración de Puerto Rico. Dos meses más tarde, el 10 de diciembre, se firmó el Page 6 572 Tratado de París mediante el cual se formalizó la cesión de Puerto Rico a los Estados Unidos a cambio de 20 millones de dólares. El 10 de diciembre de 1898 España firma su renuncia a la soberanía sobre Cuba y la entrega de Puerto Rico, Filipinas y la isla Guam, con ello ponía fin al imperio de ultramar español.

¿Qué pasa si te casas con un puertorriqueño? Las personas nacidas o naturalizadas en Puerto Rico tienen los mismos derechos que otros ciudadanos estadounidenses bajo las leyes de inmigración. Como cónyuge de una ciudadana estadounidense que entró al país como visitante, puede tener su entrevista de residencia permanente aquí en Estados Unidos. Debido a que Puerto Rico es un territorio estadounidense, cualquier persona que nace en la isla obtiene automáticamente la ciudadanía de EE. Por ende, los puertorriqueños no están usurpando nada a los nativos de EE, porque Puerto Rico no solicitó ser parte de EE, Estados Unidos luchó y venció al gobierno español para quedarse con Puerto Rico. Cosa que no lo enseñan en el sistema escolar de EE, ni a nivel universitario. Invito a mis compatriotas a que estén preparados para responder con propiedad ante el hecho de que tildan al puertorriqueño como invasor. Ya que los nativos americanos no aceptan la igualdad de derechos entre los puertorriqueños nacidos en la isla versus toda la gente nacida en suelo americano.

Puerto Ricans do not emigrate, they are Natural Born U.S. Citizens!

I have always wondered why in the United States even a lawyer has asked me if I got married for papers, something that surprises me from someone studied. If we need visa, even more so if you can arrive by car. That discomfort that is felt when people assume a position without first orienting themselves. What happened in Puerto Rico on October 18, 1898? The United States military formally assumed the administration of Puerto Rico. Two

months later, on December 10, the Treaty Of Paris was signed through which the cession of Puerto Rico to the United States was formalized in exchange for 20 million dollars. On December 10, 1898, Spain signed its resignation of sovereignty over Cuba and the delivery of Puerto Rico, the Philippines and the island of Guam, thereby ending the Spanish colonial empire.

So, what happens if you marry a Puerto Rican?
People born or naturalized in Puerto Rico have the same rights as other US citizens under immigration law. As the spouse of a US citizen who entered the country as a visitor, you can have a permanent residence interview here in the United States. Because Puerto Rico is a US territory, anyone born on the island automatically obtains US citizenship at birth. Therefore, Puerto Ricans are not usurping anything from US natives, because Puerto Rico did not apply to be part of the United States. The United States fought and defeated Spanish in 1898 and obtained Puerto Rico. Unfortunately, this history is not taught very well in the U.S. K-12 school system, nor at the university level. I invite my fellow Americans to be prepared to respond appropriately and dispel to the notion that

Puerto Ricans are invaders. We must speak up and correct this stereotype since many Americans on the mainland do not recognize the citizenship rights of Puerto Ricans born on the island versus all people born on America's mainland.

The 2023 Latinx Youth Conference (LYC) will take place on Tuesday, March 7 from 9 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at Grand Rapids Community College (GRCC) and involve 800 eighth grade Latinx students from 26 West Michigan schools. Presented in partnership with Grand Rapids Community College, Trinity Health, Steelcase and supporting sponsors, the Hispanic Center of Western Michigan is proud to take the lead in organizing the first in person LYC since 2019 in support of the next generation of leaders in our community.

For the 2023 LYC, the Hispanic Center formed a conference organizing committee comprised of organizations representing the education, business, and diversity and inclusion sectors. These include Calvin University, Cornerstone University, Davenport University, Grand Rapids Community College, Grand Rapids Public Schools, Grand Valley State University, Kent County, and Mercantile Bank of Michigan. The committee met monthly to define workshops, select scholarship recipients and garner support of the event from the community.

Movement to ban Critical Race Theory (CRT) Grows

South Carolina's bill, H.5183, which bans CRT, is just one more attack on America's true history! The bill will execute The South Carolina Transparency and Integrity In Education Act. It prohibits instruction of discrimination against protected classes, oppression and placing fault on any of the classes simply because they possess those traits. CRT is speaking on how the history of systemic racism has been the deliberate hindrance of black liberation and equality. There is concern that black students and others want to understand the social injustices that have been perpetuated throughout history, but legislators and white parents feel that the teachings of this theory will make their children feel discomfort and shame. The bigger concern should be allowing history to be spoken about lightly to spare the white descendants' feelings. This theory is not about a racial attack; it's about an in-depth outline of systemic racism in America.



South Carolina has officially banned instruction regarding CRT from kindergarten thru 12th grade. They are not alone, as 18 other states have either banned or proposed to ban CRT. So much fear regarding the truth of history has been revealed from the teachers and parents regarding CRT, because it will show how wanting white supremacy has enjoyed years of unfair and cruel advantages over those who are non-white, especially blacks. However, the black community has noticed that there is no outcry from the white community or educational institutions in the prohibited grade category regarding slavery being taught in schools. The black community has also noticed that Hollywood always has budgets to fund slavery movies throughout the years without any outcry. Part of the explanation of the necessity of the CRT ban is so that white children won't feel bad about being white. The question that is naturally asked following such an explanation is, how do white teachers, parents and their community think black students feel when they hear about the cruel slavery and oppression that their people endured for so many years? Furthermore, why does The Ku Klux Klan (KKK) remain a registered Christian organization that inflicts racially motivated acts against select groups while their white supremacy goes against every Christ-like characteristic?

CRT is not the only area of racial history being concealed. Florida's Governor, Ron DeSantis, is rejecting AP African American studies in schools. While colleges are trying to advance the African American study courses, he is denying this advancement by arguing that the courses focus too much on inequities, politics, and sexual orientation. However, his actions illustrate that he is focusing on white washing history and taking great measures to end diversity programs in Florida's colleges. After he was rigorously faced with these accusations, he countered them by saying that schools need African American history taught, but some districts have admitted that they didn't even know that the studies were required beyond Black History Month. U.S. black activists and others have recently demonstrated widely against white washing America's history and CRT bans in many states. How many rallies will it take for blacks to make school districts understand that their history is just as important as others?

Raquel Welch was born Jo Raquel Tejada on September 5, 1940, in Chicago, Illinois. She was the first child of Armando Carlos Tejada Urquiza and Josephine Sarah Hall. Her father, Armando Tejada, was an aeronautical engineer from La Paz, Bolivia, son of Agustin Tejada and Raquel Urquiza. She became an internationally known, world famous actress recognized for her beauty and talent as an actress earning her numerous acting awards and roles. In 2002, Welch co-starred in the PBS series American Family, a story about a Mexican American family in East Los Angeles, with Edward James Olmos. Her role as Aunt Dora, the "drama queen of the family", marked the first time in her 40-year career that Welch had acknowledged her heritage as a Latina. She was proud of her portrayals of a strong woman during her career.

The Internet, "A collateral creation of WWII"




Between 1939 and 1945, world war created confrontation that disrupted the lives and well-being of millions of people across the globe. Approximately 50 - 60 million deaths resulted from WWII. Following the end of the war, the United Nations Organization was created to safeguard democratic nations through an alliance.

The recruitment of thousands of men for military service changed the role of women who had to leave home to work. The destruction of educational institutions in many countries saw an increase in illiteracy. Increased access to universities and mass schooling strategies were initiated to address this issue. Advances in technology targeted the defense of nations. The emergence of the Turing Machine, the first computer created to decipher the codes of enemy forces, is a splendid example of this shift in focus.

The United States quickly realized new technologies and its computers controlled the launch of missiles could be destroyed. Among the solutions to address concerns was a new collaborative project between four universities to create a central intercommunication network. In 1969, the Advanced Research Projects Agency (ARPA), developed the first communication network called ARPANET. This network linked the University of California at Los Angeles, the University of California at Santa Barbara, the University of Utah, and the Stanford Research Institute. The ARPANET's success increased and in 1973 it became international, with the Universities of London and Norway joining.

In 1983 the Department of Defense of the United States, decided to establish a new internal communication network with exclusively military uses called MILNET. This gave way to the interconnected



network that we know today as the Internet to be used solely for civilian purposes. Once this happened, the creativity and ingenuity of the systems specialists had no brake. For example, between 1983 and 1990 researchers like Tim Berners-Lee designed computer programs that combined text, images, and linked to other documents. Another element that facilitated the use of the Internet was the creation of the first information browser called Mosaic in 1993. This was the predecessor of other information browsers such as Internet Explorer that distributed the Internet to the general public which promoted the development of the server, World Wide Web.

Modern Internet enables audio and video calls. It is a distributed data network using millions of computers all over the planet. The Internet brings a new cyber-language. Cybernetic writing is currently the most frequent way of expressing oneself; a writing with the peculiarity of brevity, relaxation and interruption of spelling regulations popular among young persons.

In short, the Internet is a global communication network. Although it had its beginnings were for military use, it currently allows an infinite number of actions for the benefit of the everyday people. It is a doorway for global communication and a resource to generate learning communities without borders. It facilitates the interaction of families and friends through highly developed platforms and frees the content that was previously controlled and filtered to the public. It can be said that, to a certain extent, it is a consequence of war transformed into an opportunity for jobs, educational and cultural growth.

Entre 1939 y 1945, la guerra mundial generó una confrontación que trastornó la vida y el bienestar de millones de personas en todo el mundo. Aproximadamente 50 - 60 millones de muertes resultaron de la Segunda Guerra Mundial. Tras el final de la guerra, se creó la Organización de las Naciones Unidas para salvaguardar las naciones democráticas a través de una alianza.

El reclutamiento de miles de hombres para el servicio militar cambió el rol de las mujeres que debían salir de casa para trabajar. La destrucción de las instituciones educativas en muchos países provocó un aumento del analfabetismo. Se inició un mayor acceso a las universidades y estrategias de escolarización masiva para abordar este problema. Los avances en la tecnología apuntaron a la defensa de las naciones. La aparición de la Máquina de Turing, la primera computadora creada para descifrar los códigos de las fuerzas enemigas, es un espléndido ejemplo de este cambio de enfoque.

Estados Unidos se dio cuenta rápidamente de que las nuevas tecnologías y sus computadoras controlaban el lanzamiento de misiles que podían destruirse. Entre las soluciones para abordar las preocupaciones se encontraba un nuevo proyecto de colaboración entre cuatro universidades para crear una red de intercomunicación central. En 1969, la Agencia de Proyectos de Investigación Avanzada (ARPA), desarrolló la primera red de comunicación denominada ARPANET. Esta red vinculaba a la Universidad de California en Los Ángeles, la Universidad de California en Santa Bárbara, la Universidad de Utah y el Instituto de Investigación de Stanford. El éxito de ARPANET aumentó y en 1973 se hizo internacional, con la incorporación de las Universidades de Londres y Noruega.

Internet moderno permite llamadas de audio y video. Es una red de datos distribuidos que utiliza millones de computadoras en todo el planeta. Internet trae un nuevo lenguaje cibernetico. La escritura cibernetica es actualmente la forma más frecuente de expresión; una escritura con la peculiaridad de la brevedad, relajación e interrupción de las normas ortográficas populares entre los jóvenes.





MARCH IS WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH

1965 was the year when all women could legally vote. While the 19th amendment, which granted women the right to vote, was signed into law on August 26, 1920, it did not extend to all women – at the time, a number of other laws prohibited Native American, Black, Asian American, and Latinx women from voting. It wasn't until President Lyndon B. Johnson signed the Voting Rights Act, outlawing discriminatory tactics such as literacy tests, that all women could vote.

Women make up 27 percent of Congress. One-hundred and forty-five women serve in the United States Congress, out of a total 535 members. Jeannette Rankin of Montana became the first woman to serve in congress in 1917. Since then, a total of 423 women have served in Congress.

Fourteen percent of active duty military members are women. This ranges from about 8 percent in the Marine Corps to 19 percent in the Air Force, with women making up 23 percent of officers in the Coast Guard. In January 2013, the U.S. government lifted its ban on women serving in combat positions.



Every year, March is celebrated as Women's History Month. It's a dedicated time to commemorate and encourage the study, observance, and celebration of the vital role and impact women have had in American history.

The actual celebration grew out of a weeklong celebration of women's contributions to culture, history, and society organized by the Education Task Force of the Sonoma County (California) Commission on the Status of Women, in 1978. It was an effort to draw attention to the fact that women's history was mostly missing in K-12 school curriculums at the time – there was a "Real Woman" essay contest for students, presentations, and even a parade in downtown Santa Rosa.

The organizers selected the week to correspond with International Women's Day, which is celebrated globally on March 8.

While many strides have been made for women since that initial week, and throughout the decades, there is still a long way to go. To recognize the accomplishments and sacrifices of women throughout American history, here are eight facts about women's history, and their contributions.

The president declares every March Women's History Month. In 1980, President Jimmy Carter declared the week of March 8 Women's History week. By 1986, 14 states had declared the entire month of March Women's History Month. In March 1987, Congress officially declared March a month-long celebration. Since 1995, every president has issued an official proclamation for the month.

Every year, the month has a theme. The theme for 2023 is Celebrating Women Who Tell Our Stories, and this year, the National Women's History Alliance "will encourage the recognition of women, past and present, who have been active in all forms of media and storytelling including print, radio, TV, stage, screen, blogs, podcasts, news, and social media"

The first Women's History Day was held in 1909. February 28, 1909 was the first Woman's History day in New York City, commemorating the one-year anniversary of the garment workers' strikes – a 15,000-women march through lower Manhattan that ignited a year-long strike by immigrant women protesting their working conditions.

Los organizadores seleccionaron la semana para corresponder con el Día Internacional de la Mujer, que se celebra a nivel mundial el 8 de marzo.

The gender pay gap still exists. Despite women outnumbering men in earning post-secondary degrees (59 percent compared to 50 percent), the gender gap pay has narrowed by less than half of a cent per year since the 1963 Equal Pay Act. According to a 2020 Pew Research Center analysis of both full- and part-time workers, women earned 84 percent of what men earned. That gap widens even more for women of color, according to 2020 data from the National Women's Law Center.

Title IX was passed on March 1, 1972. Title IX protects people from discrimination based on sex and gender in federally funded education programs. While it was initially drafted to ensure equal opportunities for women in sports, today Title IX applies to all forms of sexual harassment and assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking.

Beyoncé said it best – who rules the world? Girls. So, it only makes sense to dedicate a month to celebrating that.



What to Know About HPV's Link to Cervical Cancer

More than 95% of cervical cancer cases are caused by the human papillomavirus (HPV).

Genital HPV is the most common sexually transmitted infection in the United States. Most sexually active people contract the virus at some point in their lives because it spreads easily through skin-to-skin contact. Of the nearly 80 million Americans living with HPV, many are teenagers or individuals in their early 20s.

Most strains of HPV do not pose serious health threats, but it's still important for women to know the risks of HPV so they can take appropriate preventive measures.

HPV symptoms and complications

HPV doesn't always cause symptoms. Many people who contract the virus don't know they have it. More than 90% of all new HPV infections disappear on their own or become undetectable within two years of contraction, even without treatment.

When HPV does become apparent, the most common complication is genital warts, which may appear as flat lesions, small cauliflower-like bumps, or tiny protrusions on a woman's vulva. Genital warts can also appear near the anus, on the cervix or in the vagina.

Can HPV cause cancer?

The International Agency for Research on Cancer found that 13 of the more than 40 types of HPV can cause cervical, vaginal and vulvar cancers. The types of HPV that normally produce genital warts are not the same types that lead to cancer, so people who are sexually active should practice prevention measures, like using condoms during sex.

Getting screened for cervical cancer – either via Pap smears or HPV tests – is crucial for all women. Cervical cancer screenings recommended every three to five years (depending on the type of screening performed) for women ages 21 to 65 and can detect HPV and pre-cancerous cells before they develop into cancer. It is important to note that these are screening tests, not diagnostic tests, which means they cannot tell for certain if a person has cervical cancer. An abnormal Pap or HPV test result may lead to more testing.

Symptoms and signs of cervical cancer

Women who are sexually active should know that cervical cancer signs are almost nonexistent before the cancer progresses into an advanced stage. Women with early-stage cervical cancer may experience these symptoms:

- Abnormal vaginal bleeding
- An unusual discharge from the vagina, which may contain some blood and may occur between periods or after menopause
- Pain during sex
- Pain in the pelvic region
- Symptoms of late-stage cervical cancer may include:
 - Heavy vaginal bleeding
 - Blood in the urine
 - Swelling of the legs
 - Urination or bowel movement problems

Ethnic disparities in rates of cervical cancer

Women who are Black and Hispanic are more likely to develop cervical cancer than women who are white. Additionally, women who are Black are more likely to be diagnosed with cervical cancer at a later stage than women who are white.

Black women are also more likely to die from cervical cancer than women of other races or ethnicities, possibly because of decreased access to preventive screening tests and follow-up treatment. It is very important for all women to be screened for cervical cancer via a Pap smear or HPV testing.

What to know about HPV vaccination

Experts believe one of the best ways to prevent cervical cancer is through the HPV vaccine.

All adolescents aged 11 to 12 – both girls and boys – should receive two doses of the HPV vaccine. The shot can help boys avoid infection from HPV to decrease the risk for genital warts, certain types of cancers in males and reduce the spread of infection to others. The HPV shot is important because:

- It protects against infections that can lead to certain cancers.
- It protects against abnormal cells that can lead to cancer and the lasting effects of testing and treatment for these precancers.
- It protects children long before they are exposed to cancer-causing infections.
- HPV vaccination is not recommended for everyone over the age of 26. Some adults between the ages of 27 and 45 who are unvaccinated may consider the HPV vaccine after speaking with their doctor and learning if they are at risk for new HPV infections.

The HPV vaccine is a very important way to decrease risk of cervical cancer and other genital cancers in women. Women over 21 should also make sure they receive regular screenings for cervical cancer via a Pap smear or HPV testing.


