Once you've made the decision, please inform your solicitor of the suggested wording below for your Will so they can ensure your Will is a valid legal document.

Select the type of gift that you are considering leaving.

Suggested wording

"I give to the trustee of the Sydney Eye Hospital Foundation Trust (ABN 12 454 623 050) ("Foundation") for its general purposes [insert nature of gift – see examples below], and my executor(s) may accept a receipt from the Foundation as sufficient discharge of this bequest."

Nature of gift

The following reflects suggested wording for some of the different types of bequests that may be given:

- the whole of my estate
- (insert number) percent of my estate
- the residue of my estate
- the amount of (insert the value of your gift in cash)
- my real estate situated at (insert address), being the land more particularly described in (insert title details)
- my (insert name of other asset such as shares, artwork, etc.)

If you already have a Will, speak to your solicitor about whether it is possible to simply add a codicil (a short legal amendment) to it to provide the desired bequest.
