Not coming from a drug or alcohol background, it amazes me that the Lord was so gracious to call me into prison ministry. One of my first assignments was to conduct weekly bible studies at Hall Street, the old Workhouse. I walked down the long corridor with men on each side while looking straight ahead to the vaulted door where the women were housed. I didn't know I would need to go to their dorms and prompt them to come join me. I remember a couple of ladies standing at the bars naked. But it did not bother me. I saw women sleeping with women, but it did not bother me. I was there on an assignment from the Lord.



A few came in to join me in the old mop room which smelled like Pine-sol. One week I would have one lady attend and the next week three. It kept going back and forth but I never got discouraged. One day I ran late due to a traffic tie up. I literally ran down the long hallway because I didn't want to miss it. The door was vaulted shut; I was out of breath. But what I heard was the most beautiful thing in the world. I heard 15 women singing to the top of their voices, "Oh, how I love Jesus." What a thrill it was for me to see how the Lord worked.

If you have never been in prison or have never been even addicted to drugs or alcohol, still volunteer. From our Peer Support Specialists that have lived a life of addiction to those of us who haven't, it is the Word of God that binds us.


Trinity Church Kirkwood- Thank you for coming!
