

"Knowing" is essential. Knowing who we are in Christ brings salvation. Knowing the Bible guides our lives. Knowing God keeps us close to Him. Mission Gate residents have another kind of knowing: They know trauma.

All our incoming residents carry terrifying trauma within themselves. They've carried it for a long time, and they try to forget it. But if they want changed lives, they must look directly at their traumas, name them, tell what happened, and feel the deep feelings of shame, guilt, and anger that have raged within them for so long.



Our residents—like everyone—must know their traumas to heal from them. They have to bring those dark, hidden secrets into the light—the light of Jesus. Then they have to own the traumas, to say, "This really happened. It happened to me. It was terrifying." They have to tell their stories and write them out. As they do this, God heals these sufferers. Mission Gate also helps them learn to cope for future times when the traumas pop up again. Lifelong healing begins, and complete healing happens in heaven.
