- Attending Family Support Team meetings and informing the courts of the accomplishments of the mothers at Hannah's Ranch
- Supervising mother/child visits and watching the parent/child bonds blossom and strengthen

Throughout the Bible, you'll find many people who were faithful to the mission God had given them even when others thought they were crazy. Noah building the ark in the middle of the desert ... Nehemiah rebuilding the walls of Jerusalem section by section ... Joshua's army overtaking Jericho by marching around it and blowing trumpets.

Forty years ago, Rick and Trish began building the Mission Gate reentry aftercare program when nobody was doing anything like that in prison ministry. There were no best practices books, how-to websites, or role models for guidelines. Rick and Trish simply followed the vision God had given them. Today, many studies reveal how the ministry Rick and Trish built really works. The Mission Gate model is being replicated around the world.

Studies show that the first month a person is released from prison is the most critical for establishing stability. This is hard to do with no guidance or support. Facts indicate that people are up to 13 times more likely to die in the first month after their release from prison than at any other time in their lives. Not only that, but these people also need assistance and resources in months 3-9 after their release as they readjust to life. Mission Gate sees people through all these many months and aspects of building recovery.

On May 19, 2022, my life shattered like a vase thrown against a wall. Jesus Christ was the only One who could deliver me from addiction to meth, abusive relationships with women, and all the rest of the destructiveness I had allowed into my life.

God moved in many ways to grab my attention, wake me up, and convince me that full submission was the only way. One day, I got down on my knees and cried out, "I am powerless without you, God. I am nothing, I want you to take control of all my life." At Mission Gate, I am learning ongoing submission, and God is taking control. It's working.
