James Fields has gone full circle in rebuilding his life. About 13 years ago, James had just finished serving 1 1/2 years at Boonville Correctional Center when he made his way to Mission Gate. Now, 13 years later, James, program director for Fort Good Shepherd, represented Mission Gate at the same facility.

James presented our program to over 300 inmates who visited his table, all looking for opportunities for placement after their release.

Mission Gate visits prisons to host tables at reentry fairs, make reentry presentations, and share the Gospel.
